**Acting Assistant Principal: Week 1 Term 2** 


Dear Parents and caregivers,

# **Xavier Court Landscaping works:**

As part of the ongoing work commissioned last year to create tangible spaces on campus to link with our Christ centred charism, work commenced in the holidays to redevelop Xavier Court in order to provide additional seating as well as to hold the new statue of St Francis Xavier.





Octagon or 'Bagua' in Taoist philosophy is a sacred symbol and shape across Asia particularly in China. In reference to the region that he evangelised, this has been used as the shape of the centre court.





As St Francis took the four Gospels to Asia and planted the seeds of Christianity there, the exterior corners of the Octagon shaped court has been marked by four 'Gospel book' shaped garden beds. ## Welcome back & Term 2 opportunities

I trust all St Leo's families enjoyed both a restful and relaxing holiday with their son/daughter after a busy Term 1. There are many classroom and co-curricular opportunities available again this term and I encourage every student to be consistent with their efforts across ALL areas so as to maximise their learning opportunities at the College. If required, teaching staff are only too happy to assist with your child's development and St Leo's journey both in and out of the classroom.

## **Day-to-day expectations**

All students of St Leo's Catholic College are expected to behave in a positive and appropriate manner at all times. This includes being polite, respectful and courteous to all members of our College community whether in class, on the playground or when travelling to and from school.

### **Uniform & grooming**

Students are expected to wear their School uniform in accordance with the rules in the College diary (this includes personal grooming and hair requirements). If students have an appropriate reason for not being in correct school uniform, they must obtain a **Uniform Pass** from their Year Leader before 8:30am. Wearing the uniform correctly shows pride in one's appearance and enhances the reputation of the College in the wider community.

**Students should commence Term 2 in full Winter uniform** (including blazer); however, adjustments will be communicated if there is hot weather over the next few weeks. All students are expected to wear the blazer to and from the College every day during Terms 2 and 3. Year 12 may continue wearing their College jersey.

## **Student locker expectations**

Please note that ALL 7-11 students are expected to utilise their assigned lockers during each day to securely store their personal belongings. Whilst Year 12 have classes/study periods in the Light of Christ Centre, they are permitted to take their bags to this venue. Mr Tiglao (Year 12 Leader) will coordinate a secure space for their belongings. Students are encouraged to provide a spare key (if needed) to the Year Leader.

#### **Student Leave**

All student leave requests, in the first instance, should be communicated in writing to the Principal (Mr Gleeson). Students requesting leave should then see Mr Johansen (Director of Students) near the Student Services office to obtain the appropriate paperwork. There are two forms — Exemption from Attendance (under 10 days) and Application for Extended Leave (over 10 days). All completed leave forms should be returned to the Director of Students office as soon as possible for processing. It is important to note that leave beyond 10 days must be considered by the Catholic School Office (through the College) before final approval. The College Skoolbag app should not be used for any student leave requests.

### **Attendance**

For whole day absences please use the College Skoolbag app but for partial absences (early departure) a note from the parent/caregiver is required to be presented to your child's Year Leader before school. At the time of departure, the signed note should always be presented by your child at Student Services so that our records are accurately maintained. Following an absence from the College you must ensure that within 7 days you provide the College a verbal or written explanation for the absence. If students arrive late to the College parent/caregivers must notify the College as soon as possible via the Skoolbag app, telephone call or signed parent/caregiver entry in their child's diary outlining the reason for the lateness. All late students must still sign-in at Student Services upon arrival at the College. Follow-up will occur for those students that frequently arrive late without a valid reason.
