Sound Scout – A Free New Test for Hearing Loss in Children

Adults and children can now benefit from a free Australian developed app that delivers a user-friendly hearing test. These free tests can be conducted online using Sound Scouts, a fun, tablet-based game that detects hearing issues. The program started in 2019 and will run for up to five years, ensuring that up to 600,000 Australian children age 4-17 have their hearing checked using the Sound Scout test. Australian Hearing has been provided a grant of \$4 million through the Department of Health to deliver these online hearing tests through the Sound Scouts app. Sound Scouts is currently the only tool of its kind available in Australia validated by the National Acoustic Laboratories (NAL), the research arm of Australian Hearing. Student Leave Forms

Where necessary circumstances require student leave from the College, parent/caregivers are required in the first instance to make a formal written application to the Principal for exemption from attendance. If the student leave is approved, which is not automatic, respective students have permission to negotiate the completion of any applicable assessment task(s) with both their subject teacher and respective KLA Leader, should the task(s) fall due within the leave period. Depending on their submitted leave request, students are required to make contact with ALL teachers via the relevant College application form and ensure that the classwork and assessment sections are fully completed. It is important to note that the College does not support families taking extended holidays during term time and/or during College examination periods.

Attendance

For whole day absences please use the College Skoolbag app but for partial absences (early departure) a note from the parent/caregiver is required to be presented to your child's Year Leader before school. Following an absence from the College you must ensure that within seven (7) days you provide the College a verbal or written explanation for the absence. If students arrive late to the College parent/caregivers must notify the College as soon as possible via the Skoolbag app, telephone call or signed parent/caregiver entry in their child's diary outlining the reason for the lateness.
