### Launch of our Pathways Program:

Last Tuesday evening we hosted and introduced Mr Nathan Smith as the newly appointed College Pathways Leader. He was joined on the evening by Mr Tristan Tulloch, (Macquarie University Future Students Office); Ms Marie Florian-Kellett (Business/industry Speaker) and past graduates of St Leo's Ms Rachel Geha and Mr Max Hall.

Earlier that evening I was invited by the Australian Catholic University, to the Inaugural Educational Leaders Evening. The Guest speaker was Ms Jan Owen AM, CEO of <u>Foundation for Young Australians.</u>

Jan emphasised the following points:

- The importance of our students having a positive growth mindset
- We must build enterprise skills (the 6Cs) into our curriculum as it assists young people get a job 17 months earlier
- New skills needed by our students for the jobs of the future:
  - There has been an increase of 212% in Digital Literacy skills
  - 158% increase in critical thinking skills
  - And a 65% increase in creativity skills
- The previous week Jan was at a forum with the 10 top industries in Australia. The companies stated"...We are recruiting for mindset; we will train and provide the skills for the various positions..."

I spoke to Jan at the end of her presentation to let her know of the direction in which we are heading. Jan would very much like to speak to both parents and students in the near future to reinforce the work we are currently undertaking with our students.





This presentation connected very well with the launch of our Pathways Program. The College is certainly on the right track with the introduction of the Pathways program, the Leo's Learning Den, and our Deep Learning based on the work of Dr Michael Fullan (New Pedagogies for Deep Learning - the 6 Cs - *Christian Citizenship, Collaboration, Creativity, Communication, Character and Critical Thinking*). These strategies coupled with the opening of our new learning spaces all point towards a new look College which is preparing our students for the world in which they will enter! Thank you to the 55 parents and students (Yrs 7-12) who attended the evening.

### Hot Off the Press:

The Opens Rugby drew 26-26 with Moriah College this week. Thank you Mr Johansen. Last Friday evening our debaters travelled to Redfield College at Dural. # From the Acting Assistant Principal:

### Year 11 2020 Subject selections:

This year the College has changed the process for subject selection in response to time constraints on parents and the need to provide students with greater agency in how and when they explore their subject choices and passion.

The subject selection process for Year 11 2020 will commence on Friday 21st June. A suite of videos will be accessible from the College website for students to explore with their parents that illustrate:

- the structure of the course
- course content / Course requirements
- assessment
- key aspects of interest during their study
- key skill sets needed for the course
- benefits of the course for future pathways/careers/study

During Periods 5 and 6 on Friday 21st, students will be taken through the videos on campus with staff assistance to answer questions pertaining to their preferences.

Parents and guardians are requested to sit with their children post viewing the videos and discuss their preferences. A informative video explaining the components and requirements of the HSC and the ATAR will be included. All videos will be made available to parents and student on the College Website on Friday 21st June. To access the videos, please click the 'current students' tab and then the select the 'Stage 6 2020 Subject Selection' link in the drop down menu.

Following the above a Q&A evening regarding the subject selections will be **held in Xavier Court from 6:00pm - 8:00pm on Tuesday 25th June**. Parents will be provided the opportunity to speak with the Leader of Learning in each faculty area as well as members of the College Leadership team to further clarify which courses will be most suitable for the needs of their child and their future aspirations. Parents are invited to attend the evening at any point between the above times and refreshments will be provided.

### Stage 6 Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews 2018:

The Year 11 and 12 Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews will be held for parents and students on Tuesday 11th June from 3:30pm until 8:30pm.



Each interview will be of five minutes duration. Year 12 Reports will be available for collection on the night. We encourage parents to arrive 20 minutes before their first interview to collect and look through your child's report before the interviews commence. It is important that students are present at these interviews so that we can continue the partnership of learning between students, parents and the College.

For these interviews the College is using the internet-based booking system called Parent Teacher Organiser (PTO). It will save time for parents, staff and students.

Using this system you will be able to book the interview times that suit you best from any internet-connected computer. A computer is available in the College office during school hours if you do not have Internet access at home or elsewhere.

Please access the system as follows:

- · Go to the school's home page: <u>www.stleos.nsw.edu.au</u>
- Click on the 'current student' link followed by clicking on the 'PTO link' in the drop down menu.
- Click "Obtain PIN/Password" and enter your email address. Your PIN will be emailed to you. The email you receive will include a link that can be clicked on to log straight into PTO, bypassing the login screen.

Please note the system is now open to parents to make bookings.

### **Interesting Reading:**

### Growing Up in Australia Report: The Longitudinal Study of Australian Children

The eighth volume of the Annual Statistical Report series for *Growing Up in Australia: The Longitudinal Study of Australian Children (LSAC)* is available.

This report, produced by the Australian Institute of Family Studies, aims to provide valuable insights into family functioning and child development for researchers, policy makers and those who provide services and support, as well as the community at large. Insights include children's housing experiences. These are examined over a 10 year time period, providing new insights about how housing conditions change when parents separate.

The chapter on children's use of health care services highlights the differences in the numbers of teenage boys and girls who required medical attention for an injury, with more boys than girls requiring medical attention for breaks, fractures and concussions. Young people's relationships with their family and friends are a big part of this report, with chapters exploring time adolescents spent with parents and friends as they grow up; their help-seeking behaviours when they face emotional problems; and the quality of attachment and characteristics of their friends. This report also provides a snapshot of how teenagers are faring in relation to eating problems, the types of actions they take to control their weight and the association between dieting and physical and mental health outcomes. ### **College Athletics Carnival - Thursday 6th June**

As communicated last week this important co-curricular event is **compulsory for ALL 7-12 students** to attend and promises to be wonderful day as students represent their House in different events. The eight Houses have special historical significance through their linked Patron Saints and are Xavier, MacKillop, Loyola, Bakhita, Aquinas, McAuley, Chanel and Teresa.

Carnival days are significant events in the life of our community and provide opportunities for students to experience competition expressed in House spirit. **Students who are absent due to illness on the day will require a Medical Certificate** or equivalent to be given to their Year Leader upon their return to school. If your child is absent on Thursday please contact the College between 8:15-9:00am. If students do not arrive at the venue, the College will contact parents throughout the morning. If your child is unable to participate in events, s/he is expected to attend and we would ask that you provide a note explaining the condition that prevents their participation.



**The College Carnival will officially start at 8.30am** and will finish at approximately 2:30pm. Students will be required to assemble at Foxglove Oval (Mount Colah) in Mentor Group lines no later then 8.15am for roll call. Another roll will be taken at the conclusion of the event. Students who are intending to compete in the 800m event will need to be at Foxglove Oval by 8:00am. As so many students live close to the Foxglove Oval venue they are required to make their own their own way to and from the Oval. Please note that for safety reasons students are **not able to drive to or from the venue**.

This is a fantastic event on the College calendar and we ask ALL students to get actively involved in the events or by supporting their House and friends.
