Subject Selections for Year 11 2020:

This year the College has changed the process for subject selection in response to time constraints on parents and the need to provide students with greater agency in how and when they explore their subject choices and passion.

The subject selection process for Year 11 2020 will commence on Friday 21st June. A suite of videos will be accessible from the College website for students to explore with their parents that illustrate:

- the structure of the course
- course content / course requirements
- assessment
- key aspects of interest during their study
- key skill sets needed for the course
- benefits of the course for future pathways/careers/study

During Periods 5 and 6 on Friday 21 June, students will be taken through the videos on campus with staff assistance to answer questions pertaining to their preferences.

Parents and guardians are requested to sit with their children post viewing the videos and discuss their preferences. An informative video explaining the components and requirements of the HSC and the ATAR will be included. All videos will be made available to parents and student on the College Website on Friday 21st June. College uniform & grooming standards - raising our profile!

Now that we are in Winter, a number of students are beginning to wear casual garments that do not align with our Uniform and Grooming guidelines including *hoodies*. Garments that do

not align with our guidelines (pp. 19-21 – Student Diary) will be confiscated and held by Student Services until the end of the day. Students will be issued a **Uniform Demerit** (count towards Friday detention) if they are not meeting expectations. However, if for any reason a student is not in correct uniform they must present a parent-written note to their Year Leader before 8:30am and obtain a Uniform Pass. The following is also important:

- *College tracksuits are only to be worn if a student has timetabled PDHPE/Sport or is representing the College in a relevant sport/activity otherwise full Winter uniform should be worn.
- *Representative garments with Broken Bay/Combined Catholic Colleges (CCC) logos are only to be worn if a student is representing the College offsite in a relevant sport/activity otherwise full Winter uniform should be worn.
- *Students are permitted to wear their own **spray jacket** if it is raining during the day; however, they must be removed in class. If it is not raining, the spray jacket should be kept in their locker/bag. We are presently awaiting the arrival of a branded St Leo's College spray jacket which will be transitioned across the College from Term 3. The spray jacket will shortly be available from our uniform supplier (Cowan & Lewis Turramurra) and students/parents will be informed of this arrangement when the order arrives.

As stated in the Student Diary, the wearing of the uniform correctly shows pride in one's appearance and enhances the reputation of the College in the wider community.

Attendance

For whole day absences please use the College Skoolbag app but for partial absences (early departure) a note from the parent/caregiver is required to be presented to your child's Year Leader before school. Following an absence from the College you must ensure that within seven (7) days you provide the College a verbal or written explanation for the absence. If students arrive late to the College parent/caregivers must notify the College as soon as possible via the Skoolbag app, telephone call or signed parent/caregiver entry in their child's diary outlining the reason for the lateness.
