Debating:



Laurie Till – Maintenance Contractor:



Stage 4-5 Parent - Student - Teacher Interviews:

Stage 4-5 Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews will be held for parents and students on Wednesday 3rd July from 3:30pm until 8:30pm and Thursday 4th July from 8:30am - 3.30pm.

Each interview will be of five minutes duration. Student reports will be available for collection from reception. We encourage parents to arrive 20 minutes before their first interview to collect and look through your child's report before the interviews commence. It is important that students are present at these interviews so that we can continue the partnership of learning between students, parents and the College.

For these interviews the College is using the internet-based booking system called *Parent Teacher Organiser (PTO).* Using this system you will be able to book the interview times that suit you best from any internet-connected computer. A computer is available in the College office during school hours if you do not have Internet access at home or elsewhere.

Please access the system as follows:

- Go to the school's home page: <u>www.stleos.nsw.edu.au</u>
- Click on the 'current student' link followed by clicking on the 'PTO link' in the drop down menu.
- Click "Obtain PIN/Password" and enter your email address. Your PIN will be emailed to you. The email you receive will include a link that can be clicked on to log straight into PTO, bypassing the login screen.

Please note the system will be **open to parents to make bookings from 9am on Wednesday 26th June**.

Subject Selections for Year 11 2020:

The subject selection process for Year 11 2020 commenced last Friday 21st June. A suite of videos was made accessible via the College website for students to explore with their parents that illustrate:

This Tuesday 25th June, a Year 11 2020 Subject Selection Q&A evening will be held in Bakhita House from 6-8pm. During this meeting parents will be provided the opportunity to speak with the Leader of Learning in each faculty area as well as members of the College Leadership team to further clarify which courses will be most suitable for the needs of their child and their future aspirations. Parents are invited to attend the evening at any point between the above times and refreshments will be provided.

Pathways Workshops (From Mr Smith):

As part of the new Pathways Program at St Leo's we are introducing a number of workshops for students aimed at developing their personal skill-set. The topics for these workshops vary but include the development of a range of elements from our *Deep Learning Skills* framework, as well as other skills that will assist students whilst at school (and in their daily life outside of school). Workshop topics are:

- Developing Critical Thinking
- Personal Branding

The majority of these workshops are open to students of all years, however, a few have been targeted to specific year groups.


Year 10 - Parents and Students

From the Acting Director of Teaching and Learning: Year 10 into 11 Subject Selection for 2020/2021 HSC

Last Friday, Year 10 students met in the Light of Christ Centre to view the videos that KLA coordinators, in conjunction with Mr Tiglao, created to showcase their subject areas and the benefits for undertaking those subjects. The questions that Year 10 had for all of the KLA coordinators after the videos were impressive and well-informed.

Today Year 10 will receive their subject selection handbook (which is available online at <u>https://stleos.nsw.edu.au/wp-content/uploads/2019/06/Yr11-2020-prel-HSC-subject-info.pdf</u>). On Tuesday night (between 6.00pm and 8.00pm), you will have the opportunity to come to the Xavier Courtyard classrooms and speak to KLA coordinators about any specific aspects of subject content and HSC related information.

Students will receive a personalised subject selection code on Tuesday that will allow them to select their subjects online via Edval. This will remain open until Tuesday Week 10 (July 2nd). From Thursday 25th - Friday 26th Week 1 Term 3, students and parents will have the opportunity to discuss their subject choices in an interview with members of the college.

Please don't hesitate in asking any questions on Tuesday evening. Feel free to email myself or any of the KLA coordinators if you have a specific subject related question. I will be available Tuesday evening to answer any questions regarding the Year 11 ROSA course as well as the HSC course and any ATAR related question.

Year 11 English - Standard, Advanced and Extension 1:

What is the major difference between **English Studies**, **English Advanced** and **Standard English?**

All of the courses provide students with the opportunity to study a diversity of texts. One module of the HSC English content is common to all three of these courses, however, students will study different texts in the different courses. **English Advanced** and **English Standard** have a focus on literary analysis and require students to consider conventional forms such as drama and poetry as well as contemporary forms such as multimodal texts.



The **English Advanced** course deals with much more sophisticated texts and concepts. English Advanced students typically enjoy reading, are willing to engage with lengthy classical texts and enjoy reading Shakespeare's plays. **English Advanced** is a prerequisite for **English Extension 1**.

English Standard is still a suitable pathway to further study but the texts are typically more contemporary and are not as lengthy.

Although **English Studies** now has an optional ATAR examination, it is designed for students who do not wish to pursue university studies. It focusses on effective, accurate and appropriate general literacy, workplace texts and enjoyment of books and films.

Purple Day - Thursday:



Purple Day is a grassroots effort dedicated to increasing awareness about epilepsy worldwide. **On Thursday**, students are asked to spread the word about epilepsy by wearing **purple** and/or mufti. Founded in 2008 by then nine-year-old Cassidy Megan of Nova Scotia (Canada), Cassidy started Purple Day in an effort to get people talking about the disorder and inform those with seizures that they are not alone. Cassidy named the day 'Purple Day' after the internationally recognised colour for epilepsy – lavender. Stage 6 students will lead the initiative on Thursday with Year 11 preparing cupcakes for sale at recess/lunch (main yard) and the Year 12 Leaders cooking a barbeque lunch (main yard). The leaders and the SRC will be collecting a gold coin during Mentor period (Tuesday-Thursday) and a short video will be provided to Mentors to play on Thursday. It should be a wonderful day in increasing epilepsy awareness.

Student Leadership 2019/2020:

The student leadership process has now begun for our new 2019/2020 leaders. Interested candidates have submitted their applications and both student and staff voting will be occurring this week. Short-listed candidates will be interviewed next week once applications are viewed by the selection panel and voting tallies are collated. Student leadership positions available include College Captain, College Vice-Captain, Student Representative Council, Growth Domain ambassadors (Spiritual, Physical, Academic, Cultural, Environmental & Social Emotional) and House Ambassadors.
