## From the Director of Students

#### Week 1

It was wonderful to see our 7-12 students again after the Term 2 holidays. They appeared rejuvenated and ready for another term of opportunity at St Leo's. I spoke to a number of students last week both in and out of the classroom, and it was pleasing that many want to



make a *positive difference* this term both academically and with their chosen co-curricular pursuits.

### Uniform

Students are expected to be attired in full Winter uniform (including blazer) this term. All students are expected to wear the blazer to and from the College every day this term. Year 12 may continue wearing their College jersey. Please see the Student Diary if any uniform/grooming expectations need clarification.

#### Student leave reminder

All student leave requests, in the first instance, should be communicated in writing to the Principal (Mr Gleeson) - an email to the College is acceptable. Students requesting leave should then see Mr Johansen (Director of Students), near the Student Services office, to obtain the appropriate paperwork. There are two forms – *Exemption from Attendance* (under 10 days) and *Application for Extended Leave* (over 10 days). All completed leave forms should be returned to the Director of Students office as soon as possible for processing. It is important to note that leave beyond 10 days must be considered by the Catholic School Office through the College. **The College Skoolbag app should not be used for any student leave requests**.

#### Attendance reminder

For whole day absences, please use the College Skoolbag app - but for partial absences (early departure), a note from the parent/caregiver is required to be presented to your child's Year Leader before school. Following an absence from the College, you must ensure that you provide the College a verbal or written explanation for the absence within 7 days. If students arrive late to the College, parent/caregivers must notify the College as soon as possible via the Skoolbag app, telephone call or signed parent/caregiver entry in their child's diary outlining the reason for the lateness.
