

Year 12 Graduation Mass and Year 11 Compulsory Attendance:



Extract from the Gospel for the 22 Sunday Luke 14:1, 7-14:



Year 12 Trial Examinations:

Students completed their Trial HSC
Examinations last week. Students have since received feedback on their performance and marks from their teachers. Students are encouraged to use past HSC Questions as well as the Sample HSC Questions provided by NESA for courses with new syllabuses. These can be accessed from NESA Course List. Then select the required course. Scroll down to Assessment and Examination Materials where you will find sample HSC questions for each



course with a new syllabus. As an example, English Advanced course has a new syllabus in 2019. NESA has provided Sample Questions on their website.

Students in Years 11 will be completing their Preliminary Exams during Weeks 9 and 10. We wish all students well for upcoming exams. All students are required to do their best for the exams and ensure that they thoroughly revise course content and skills. Students will be permitted to study at home when they are not doing exams at school. Please continue to encourage students to use their time between exams for study purposes. It is sometimes tempting for students to accept extra work shifts during examination periods when their time should be utilised for study purposes. To support and encourage student learning, the College Aquinas Resource Centre is available for student study throughout the examination period.

Year 11 Minimum Standards Tests:

Students in Year 11 who have not yet met the minimum standards are invited to see Mrs Cali (in the Aquinas Resource Centre) during Week 7 to complete these tests. Students who are involved in this have already received a personalised notification with further details via the Year 11 Google Classroom page. While these tests are not compulsory, students who complete these tests will be eligible to have these credentialed for when they leave school. Parents are asked to encourage their sons/daughters to complete these tests before the Year 11 Exams in Weeks 9 and 10, if possible. Any student who is concerned about these doing tests can do Trial Tests before completing the actual tests.

Year 8 Subject Selection Talks and Year 7 and 8 Student Led Conferences:

These will take place on Tuesday 10 September at the College. Year 8 Students will not have Sport on this day. Please wear full winter school uniform.

The NSW Government is helping kids get active with the Active Kids program. The Active Kids program provides two \$100 vouchers for parents, guardians and carers of school-enrolled children to use towards sport and active recreation costs each year. From 1 July 2019, parents, guardians and carers can apply for the second \$100 Active Kids voucher.

Voucher 1 is valid January to December and Voucher 2 is valid July to December. Public transport & behavioural expectations:

A reminder that serious consequences will apply to any student who breaches the College code of conduct while travelling on public transport. It is also expected that students will vacate their seat, if required, to full-paying adults. We would like to acknowledge the many students who are consistently demonstrating positive behaviour when they travel on public transport to/from the College. The College would also appreciate if these expectations can be discussed and reiterated at home.

Positive Parenting:

Despite the best efforts of parents around the world, the reality is, there is no such thing as the 'perfect parent'. However, resourcing yourself with the right information is a good start!

Research shows that one of the most important protective factors in the lives of young people, is a close relationship with a supportive adult. With the **mental health** of today's young people being at an all-time low, it is simply not enough to parent effectively. Parents now need to familiarise themselves with practical skills, knowledge, and strategies when it comes to raising children.

Parenting is a very difficult task and can easily slide into a model that is overprotective, resulting in children being less independent, unable to problem-solve or self-regulate. Parents may not set clear boundaries, which unfortunately may make children feel less secure. There is a great deal of pressure on children in the 21st century.
