# Parent Involvement Evening – Morrisby Career Profiling

Last night, our College Pathways Leader, **Mr Nathan Smith** hosted the last Parent Involvement Evening for 2019, focusing on Morrisby Career Profiling as the College is adding this important information and planning tool to its Careers Education Program. Nathan updated attendees on what has been happening with the

College Pathways Program and why the College has made the decision to implement Morrisby Career Profiling. We also were fortunate to have Consultant Educational Psychologist **Emma Goodsir**, Administrator of Morrisby in NSW, attend the evening to explain how it works and what the benefits are, and there was some excellent discussion as a result.

As part of a Morrisby Career Profiling trial, our current Year 10 students will be undertaking the profiling assessment on Thursday 28 November as part of their *Pathways and Careers Workshop Day*. Following this, our intention is that in 2020, Year 10 and Year 12 cohorts will undertake the profiling assessment in early Term 2, and from 2021, Year 10 cohorts that will complete Morrisby prior to their Stage 6 subject selections.

#### **Diocesan Student Voice Forum - 2020**

Following a number of recent Secondary Wellbeing Leaders' meetings at the Catholic Schools Office, a Student Voice Forum has now been confirmed and will be held at the end of Term 1 2020 in The Light of Christ Centre. Students from a number of secondary schools in the Diocese will be participating in this inaugural forum and planning will shortly commence with student leaders.

The purpose of the forum will be for students to collaborate and take action to empower students to strengthen student voice, agency and leadership in their school communities. Students will *DESIGN IT, LEAD IT and GROW IT* back in their school context.

There is strong evidence that students become more engaged in learning when they have opportunities to:

- exercise agency in their own learning
- contribute to the communities in which they learn
- improve learning programs for themselves and their peers.



Research findings indicate that student voice, agency and leadership have a positive impact on self-worth, engagement, purpose and academic motivation which contribute to improved student learning outcomes.
