While our academic results are consistently strong, our broad curriculum provides balance and diversity across a range of academic, cultural, physical and vocational fields.

We take a future view of education at St Leo's, focusing on transferrable deep learning skills that will equip our students for the future, creating lifelong learners able to adapt in our ever-changing world and challenge the traditional status quo.

We embrace and support diverse student capabilities and provide academic challenges and support for different learning styles, rates and abilities. We ensure all students have the opportunity to achieve their best. Along with Vocational Education and Training (VET) subjects, we offer Gifted and Talented Programs, Learning Support and a unique Community Tutoring Program.

Pastoral Care and Wellbeing



Catholic Life and Mission

St Leo's is first and foremost a Catholic school, with the religious dimension of the College being a shared partnership between families, parish communities and the College.

Religion is an essential and comprehensive area of study for all students, prayer an important part of daily life, regular religious gatherings and celebrations enthusiastically not only embraced, but led by students, and Christian leadership fostered through our Youth Ministry Program.

Students in Years 7-10 attend a Spirituality Day each year to help them develop their spiritual lives amidst their busy academic schedules, while the College provides a three-day retreat for both Year 11 and Year 12. A real sense of community exists at St Leo's and our newly refurbished Chapel is the spiritual heart, where a weekly Mass is also held which students have the option to attend.



Our Faith in Action – Social Justice

There is a significant focus at St Leo's on putting our faith into action and giving students agency and confidence to build a world that is positive, just and inclusive.

Our Youth Ministry staff oversee our renowned Social Justice Program, where we offer many opportunities for students to learn about social justice and structural inequalities that create barriers in our society through range of activities.

The College also offers regular local initiatives through to unique, life-changing immersion experiences that broaden students' education and strengthen their faith, including our ongoing annual Pacific Partnership Program with the islands of Kiribati.



Our College Facilities – Prepared for the Future

St Leo's is located on six hectares in the leafy Upper North Shore suburb of Wahroonga and has just completed an extensive \$25M campus and technology upgrade.

Our facilities include:

- the new state-of-the-art Mary MacKillop Centre for Creative and Performing Arts, Design, Technology and Hospitality, which includes:
 - drama and dance theatre with retractable seating
 - art gallery and visual art studios
 - specialty music, rehearsal rooms and individual instrumental tuition rooms
 - two commercial-grade kitchens
 - two TAS workshops for woodwork
 - several large meeting and gallery spaces
 - numerous purposeful and flexible learning spaces
- the Light of Christ Centre - a multipurpose complex for over 1500 people used for indoor sports, assemblies, and a range of College functions and events
- a newly refurbished Chapel
- two full-sized sports ovals
- two large, shaded outdoor recreational areas
- a well-equipped Aquinas Resource Centre including library and cafe
- canteen.








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Beyond the Classroom – Sport for Life



St Leo's has a strong sporting culture and enjoys huge success in various representative sports.

Students participate in a range of organised sporting events throughout the year including our regular Sport for Life program, offering a high-quality tiered sporting program covering a wide selection of team and individual sports.

Our Accelerated and High-Performance Sports Programs allow talented sports students to progress to higher levels including regional, state and national representation and international tours.



Beyond the Classroom – Creative and Performing Arts

Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) are an integral part of the curriculum at St Leo's.

Music, drama and visual arts have long been a focus, while Dance and Entertainment (VET) have recently been added to our range of CAPA subjects. Our \$14M state-of-the-art Mary MacKillop Centre highlights our commitment to the arts and includes a drama and dance theatre with fully retractable seating, art gallery and studios, along with dedicated orchestra, band and music rooms.

Our exceptional music program includes various band, ensemble and choir programs, and an annual musical

or drama production, in addition to an impressive 14 co-curricular CAPA ensembles and individual music tuition.

Our annual Showcase is an impressive community event featuring outstanding student works across the spectrum of creative and performing arts. St Leo's students regularly win awards and Eisteddfods, and have been invited to exhibit at ARTEXPRESS and ENCORE. We are very proud to have had three students offered places at NIDA for 2019.

Preparing Students for the Future – Technology and much more

We equip our students with the skills and attitudes to be future leaders in their fields.

Technology is an integral part of daily learning, with individual student iPads or MacBooks and other learning technologies serving as important tools in developing critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and communication skills. Our experience has found that technology-enabled teaching and learning allows for more active engagement, it allows teaching to meet the student at their particular point of learning, and students are encouraged to advance their skills in a safe environment.

Our Learning Den is a custom-built online learning platform on which students can record and track their progress in a range of areas, giving them learning ownership and a digital portfolio to take with them when they leave. We have an interdisciplinary approach to Science, Technology, Engineering and

Mathematics (STEM), which students apply to make connections between school, community, work and the global enterprise. Students also have the opportunity to participate in competitive programs such as VEX Robotics.

Our innovative Pathways Program works with students and their families to navigate life beyond school, developing industry and higher education partnerships, and shaping new offerings and approaches to learning at St Leo's.

Overall, St Leo's is focused on developing transferrable deep learning skills that will equip all our students for the future by creating lifelong learners able to adapt to and challenge a world being constantly reshaped through advancing technology.
