## Thank you - Mr Luke Trotz

Mr Trotz first joined us here in August 2008 as the Sports Coordinator, looking after sport throughout Years 7-12. His expertise in all sports, but particularly Rugby League meant that our students received first class training and tactics to use in their games. Besides sport and his specialisation in PDHPE subjects, Mr Trotz also has been a valued member of our College Pastoral Team - being a Pastoral Year Leader. "Trotzy" will always be remembered for challenging our students whether it be on the sporting field or in the formal classroom - as he always contained in his speeches and presentations quotes from many worthwhile role models over the years.

## **NESA - Workshop with Prof Geoff Masters**

Last Monday week I attended a workshop that Professor Geoff Masters conducted at **NESA** (*NSW Education Standards Authority*). It was a very robust and lively discussion about the possible implementations of the recommendations from the recent Curriculum review.

Geoff was addressing 22 people in the room - representatives from the NESA Board, and staff and parent representatives from different sectors across NSW.

He started off showing us a nine minute clip from Sal Khan (Khan Academy) YouTube clip - <u>Sal Khan: Let's</u> teach for mastery -- not test scores

On a personal basis - it was very satisfying that here at Leo's - we are definitely on the right track in terms of our direction in development of the whole person - in our 6 Growth Domain areas. Also his discussion was

centered around meeting each student at their own point in their learning journey. This is our main factor in our Intake 2020 initiative - particularly in our **ILiM** (Individual Learning in Mathematics) Program this year (and in Year 8 2020).

We also have a unique tool to support this direction - the **St Leo's Learning Den** - which is continually being updated by the College - to make it a worthwhile and relevant tool for our students and staff.

He spoke and presented in three areas:

1. We have serious problems - the numbers of students getting through the system - but not attaining minimum results (in literacy and numeracy). From PISA we know



that 22% of our 15 year olds do not have have the literacy skills to function well in society. In numeracy PISA results - 24% of our 15 year olds do not have the skills. **We as a community need to do something** - with both structure and curriculum content. Much of the problem is based around a *Fixed Time Period* issue - (as per the video) - we currently "batch up" the students by age - and pushing them through a system.

- 2. **Too much content** in our current curriculum. Professor Masters best described as "you only skate over the surface".
- 3. **Knowledge/skills dichotomy** the skills are definite but not "tacked on" (similar to the Australian General Capabilities) but rather imbedded into each subject then use that skill to be able to work across other subject areas. These skills should be integral to that subject not sit outside.

He suggested a series of modules that students work through. **EVERY** student is given stretch material in terms of content. This obviously has many implications - to the role of the teacher - and to the current thinking.

I thought of the analogy - of a child riding a bike - something that I have used before:

*Kids of all shapes and sizes all on the same size bike. Some can reach the pedals some cannot - some can balance - some cannot; difficulty reaching the handle bars etc.* 

Next to it - another image - these same students on all different sizes of bikes - so the bike is the right size for each one.

All bike riders can then learn (at their own pace) and then cover the same distance as they progress through the different sized bikes.

I actually want to get these two images going - with some of our students!!! But from what I see in the bike racks - they are all of similar size!

Last Wednesday night, I spent the evening with the staff and students at the Intake 2020 Camp. The students were engaged most definitely and were getting comfortable with the students that they will be with for at least 6 years - even life long friends!

## St Leo's Learning Den

Students in Years 7-10 should be presently selecting samples of work to be uploaded to their Electronic Learning Portfolio within the Learning Den. These work samples should be uploaded for the six growth domains, the six deep learning skills and as evidence for their personal and academic goals within their Personalised Learning Plans (PLP's). Such evidence should then be accompanied by a student reflection on the extent to which they have achieved growth in this area and an evaluation as to the extent of their success or the reasons as to why they may have fallen short. Such evidence will then be used during their Student Led Conference. In addition to working on their Electronic Learning Portfolio during mentor, students should be utilizing personal time.

## Y12 Mid Year Examinations

The Year 12 Mid Year Examination Period commences on Monday 30th March. Students are encouraged to engage in a rigorous revision schedule that makes use of practice responses. Students are encouraged to provide their practice responses to their teachers early to provide sufficient time for marking and feedback. A reminder that the Aquinas Resource Centre is open until 5.00pm each afternoon for study and homework.

## Student Led Conferences for Years 9-10 – Wed 8 April

What they are and how to lead one

Just a reminder that a Student Led Conference is where:

- Parent-teacher-student conferences are where the teacher is not the focus, the student "runs the show."
- The student must be present and in charge of explaining his or her progress, reflecting on areas of success as well as areas requiring growth.
- The student presents short and long term goals linked to specific aspects of their learning.
- This conference model effectively positions students as experts in their own learning, and highlights their voices and insights to drive a rich discussion.

A good example of an SLC can be seen in the video clip below (*click the image below to view*):



It is from the Chicago School System but it is the type of model we have aimed for at St Leo's as it allows students to set learning goals for their teachers to be able to track.

# Pastoral Care & Wellbeing Program this week

**Year 7:** Students will be guided through an introduction to the *Learning Den* growth domains in preparation for developing their own *Personalised Learning Plans*. *The Yard* performance based incursion will also take place this Wednesday addressing the issues of bullying, social exclusion, peer pressure and resilience.

**Year 8:** During the extended Mentor time students will be involved in anti-bullying activities in preparation for the National Day of Action Against Bullying and Domestic Violence next week. Students will also participate in *The Yard* performance based incursion addressing the issues of bullying, social exclusion, peer pressure and resilience.

**Year 9 & 10:** Both year groups will be guided through how they as students are experts and have a voice in their own learning during extended Mentor time. The focus is on empowering and enabling students in the critique and reflection of their own school work and their own learning within each of their Stage 5 subjects. They will be reminded of how the *St Leo's Learning Den* is paramount as a showcase of their *Deep Learning* Achievements. This preparation will take place over the next few weeks as they get ready for the Student Led Conferences with their parents/caregivers and teachers in Week 11.

Students will be able to showcase their learning improvements, extra curricular involvement, achievements and goals.

**Year 11:** The focus this week is on personal health and wellbeing. Students will meet with local GP's and discuss areas of health and wellbeing in small groups on Wednesday. Topics discussed include: Medicare, the difference between bulk billing and private practice, confidentiality, physical health, mental health, drugs and alcohol, sexual health, stress management and anything else they want to talk about!

**Year 12:** As student leaders of the College, extended Mentor time this week will be devoted to planning whole school activities for the National Day of Action Against Bullying and Domestic Violence next Friday 20 March. The aim is to highlight the various forms bullying and domestic violence can take, the impacts for young people on their mental health and wellbeing and strategies that can be used to stand up to bullying.
