During unprecedented times such as these, the College is well placed to address a rapidly changing educational landscape by utilising the 'PRIDE' framework. To that end, the College presents in this information package the **Term 2 Remote Learning Policy** for Weeks 1-2. This policy will then change to accommodate the recent direction given by state and federal governments.

This model was designed and data driven using the results of the parent, student and staff survey issued last term. The results of this survey can be found below:

<u>Summary Report Remote Learning Check In April 2020</u>

A working party comprised of parents, students and staff was then formed to provide feedback on the model outlined in this information package. Overall the results were very positive. In the interests of further improving the model, the common themes and requests that arose from the survey and working party were:

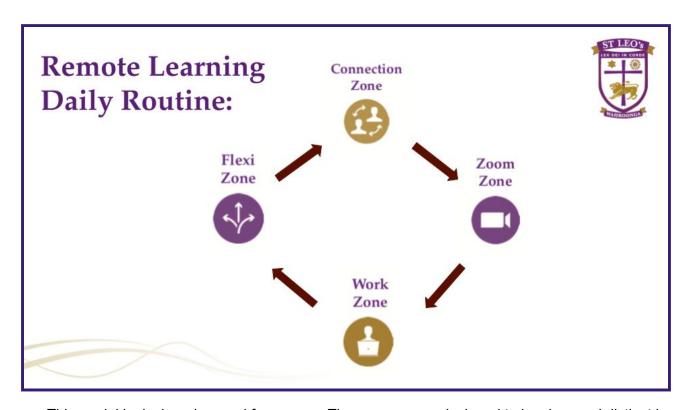
- Students require additional time to complete set work
- Students required flexibility to manage the demands of assessments and co-curricular pursuits
- Students required increased access to Zoom sessions
- Students requested increased teacher feedback

Based on the above, the following model has been produced to address these needs. While no model in a very tight timeframe combined with constant variables from external bodies will perfectly meet the needs of every student, St Leo's is proud to provide a model that keeps at its centre, the holistic development of your children.

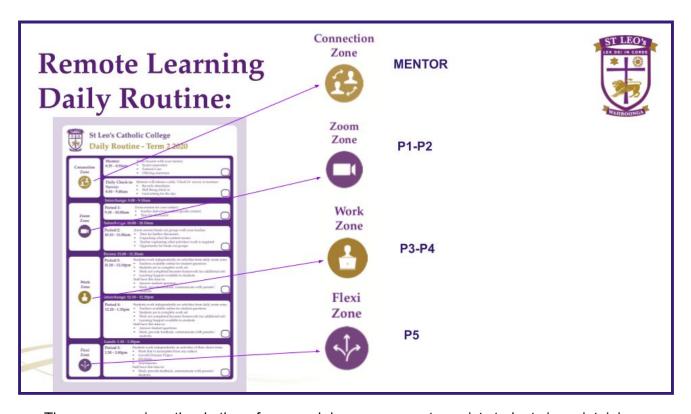

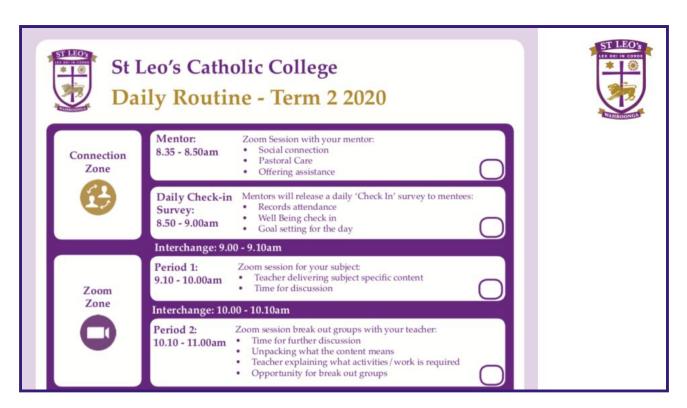

This model is designed around four zones. These zones are designed to be clear and distinct in the activities that are expected.

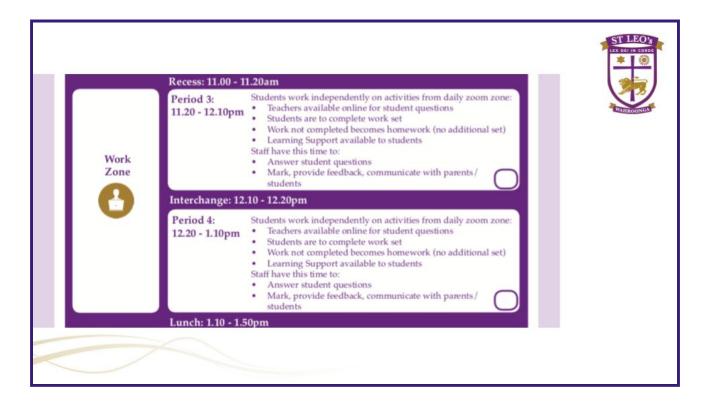


These zones mirror the rhythm of a normal day on campus to assist students in maintaining a sense of normality during their remote learning.



Connection Zone: Students will be requested to participate in a zoom session via their **Mentor Google Classroom Page** each day. This will provide social connection, pastoral care and any assistance required at the beginning of the day.

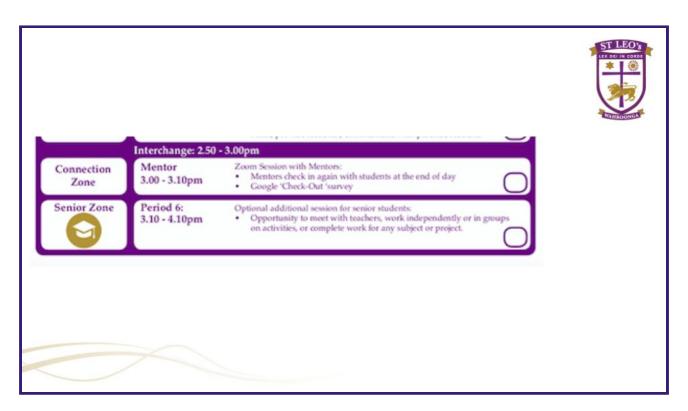
Zoom Zone: This zoom session/s will be either **live or pre-recorded**, and will be the delivery of specific content from the teacher to their class/subject cohort. Question time and discussions will also be offered during this time. The zoom sessions will be made available via their **Subject Google Classroom Page.**



Work Zone: During this time teachers are available online via the Google Classroom Pages to assist students. Students during this time are working independently to complete set work.



Flexi Zone: Students during the Flexi Zone have the opportunity to select the work for this zone. It may be work from the subject of the day, work to catch up on from a previous day or subject or they may select an assessment task to work on. During this period staff are available to provide quality feedback on work already submitted.



Connection Zone: At the conclusion of the day students zoom one final time with their mentors in order to touch base, check on well being and to address any issues encountered during the day.

Senior Zone: Students in Year 11 and Year 12 have a second shorter lesson for a different subject. This ensures students are receiving direct teacher engagement for two subjects each day. A zoom session is provided during this zone.

Google 'Check In' and 'Check Out' Surveys:

During the Connection zones each day, students will be asked to complete an online survey by their mentor that will perform the following roles:

- Mark attendance
- Provides a well being check
- Provides a platform to record any issues with online learning that a mentor needs to address/or have addressed
- Provides a platform to record any pastoral issues that a mentor needs to address/or have addressed

Uniform:

Students are required to wear their College uniform during the Zoom Zone. The College Sport Uniform is also acceptable.

Variables:

Depending on the unique requirements of some courses, a subject teacher may in some cases vary the Remote Learning Daily Routine to meet such needs. If this is the case, the teacher will communicate this directly with their students via the Google Classroom Page.

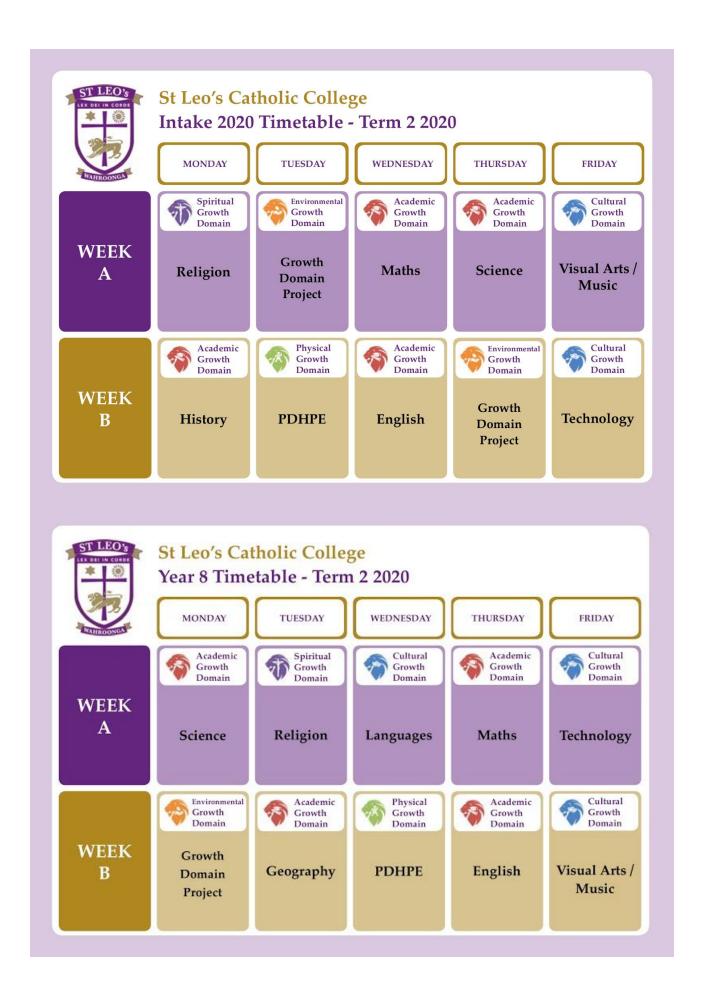
Environmental Growth Domain Project Days:

Students in Years 7-10 have either one or two Environmental Growth Domain Project Days allocated to their timetable. This project is not aligned to a specific subject, but is designed to be multidisciplinary and to enable students to pursue a particular talent to produce a project that is aimed at greater ecological sustainability. These projects will be part of a major learning exhibition at the end of Semester One. The details of the project will be distributed and launched with students on Monday of Week One.

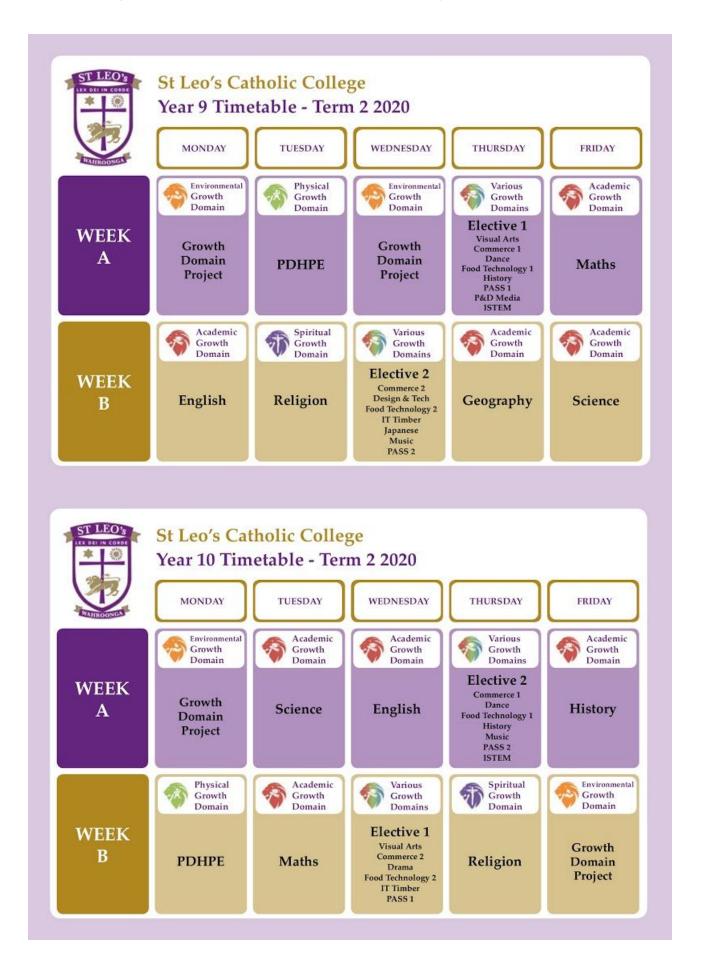
Wellbeing and Flexibility Days for Senior Students:

Students in Years 11 and 12 have two Wellbeing and Flexibility days where they have the time to work on their various assessment tasks, revision schedules and major works. The Pastoral and Wellbeing Teams will be available for pastoral zoom sessions to touch base and offer support. These zoom sessions will be made available via the Year Group Pastoral Google Classroom Page.
