Parent Teacher Interviews for Years 11 - 12

Parent Teacher Interview bookings are **open until 2.30pm today**, and will **re-open at 8am tomorrow**, Thursday 30 July, to contine taking bookings for 5 August. As per Mr Gleeson's correspondence on Friday evening, Parent Teacher Interviews for Stage 6 (Year 11-12) will take place over two Wednesday evenings via Zoom:

• <u>TONIGHT</u> - Wednesday, Week 2 – July 29, 4:45 - 8:30pm – Years 11 & 12



• Wednesday, Week 3 - August 5, 4:45 - 8:30pm - Year 11 & 12

How to book your Parent Teacher Interviews:

- 1. Log into Compass (if you need help with this, check the Parent's Guide to Accessing the Compass Parent Portal)
- 2. Once logged into Compass, a notification will appear under 'My News' informing you that the Parent teacher interviews are now open to make appointments.
- 3. Select 'Click here for bookings' with this notification, which will take you to the bookings where your son or daughter's teachers' names will appear.
- 4. Select a teacher's name and an available time slot (in white) to book a time. Repeat for each teacher.
- 5. There is also a button 'Show me how to book' which will give you further instructions if needed.

Zoom links for each interview:

Parents have been sent an email from Compass containing the Zoom link for each subject that your daughter/son undertakes. Please click on the link to log into the meeting 2-3 minutes before your designated time. You will be sent to a 'waiting room'. Once the teacher is finished with the previous meeting, they will allow you into the Zoom meeting for your booked Parent Teacher Interview.

Please note: Due to the nature of Zoom interviews, keeping to time will be most important to ensure delays are avoided where possible. If you require further time for discussion, please let the relevant teacher know and they will make the necessary arrangement for a second Zoom meeting at a later date.


The College looks forward to this important step in the learning journey of your daughter or son.

Year 8 Subject Selection Process

Later today (Wednesday 29 July), Year 8 and their families will **digitally receive the Subject Selection Handbook** for Year 9 2021. Parents are asked to peruse this document with their children.

Students will then participate in a **Subject Selection Presentation Assembly tomorrow (Thursday 30 July)** where representatives from the courses on offer in 2021 will provide students with an insight into what each course involves. Following this assembly, students will **receive via email a confidential webcode** that they will require to complete their subject selections at a later stage of the process.

The College will then be hosting a **Parent Information Evening for Year 9 2021 Subject Selections** from **7pm on Monday Week 3**,



August 3. Due to present Covid-19 restrictions, the College will be hosting this evening as a Zoom meeting. You can access the Zoom session via the following: Join from PC, Mac, Linux, iOS or Android <u>HERE</u>

Parents will have the opportunity to access the FAQs link within the handbook to list any questions prior to the information evening they wish answered during the Zoom session.

We expect the presentations to be approx. 30mins, followed by Q&As. Members of the College Leadership team and the College Pathways Coordinator will also be present for this important transition in the learning journey of your daughter or son.

By Wednesday 5 August, students are required to have entered their subject selections on EDVAL CHOICE using the webcode that they received via their College email. The printed summary form/verification sheet, that requires a signature by the student as well as parents, is due to reception by Thursday 6 August. We look forward to the journey ahead as they pave their way towards their Stage 5 studies.

Senior Study Afternoons

The Aquinas Resource Centre is open from 3.00-5.00pm every Wednesday afternoon. There are a variety of tutorials and mini-workshops that are run. Students form study groups and bounce rich ideas off each other.

Cyberbullying

Online bullying can have a devastating impact on young people, whose online life is a key part of their identity and how they interact socially. Cyberbullying behaviour takes many forms, such as sending abusive messages, hurtful images or videos, nasty online gossip, excluding or humiliating others, or creating fake accounts in someone's name to trick or humiliate them. Targeted advice is also available for children, young people or adults who may be experiencing online abuse.

WARNING SIGNS - your child may not tell you if they are

experiencing bullying behaviour online because of a fear it might make things worse for them or they may lose access to their devices and the internet. Possible signs that all parents/caregivers should be aware of include:

- being upset after using the internet or their mobile phone
- changes in personality, such as becoming more withdrawn, anxious, sad or angry
- appearing more lonely or distressed
- unexpected changes in friendship groups
- a decline in their school work
- changes in their sleep patterns
- avoidance of school or clubs
- a decline in their physical health
- becoming secretive about their online activities and mobile phone use.

Year 10 Vaccinations


