Covid-19 Update

Late last week, the NSW Government requested NSW Health and the Chief Health Officer, Dr Kerry Chant review the current advice to schools, with the aim of minimising the risk of Covid-19 transmission in school communities in Term 3. In the last 48 hours you will have seen discussed in the media continuing updates by NSW Health and the NSW State Government in relation to school community management.



In light of these daily updates, we will release another separate St Leo's Catholic College Covid-19 update on Thursday, 20 August.
