Covid-19 Update

All parents should have received a Covid-19 update sent via Compass last Thursday afternoon. A copy of this letter is <u>provided here</u>.

I am pleased that many of the opportunities the College provides for students have been adjusted rather than cancelled and will continue with regard to the new guidelines. I thank the staff in charge of each of these activities for the extra time and work that has gone into the modification of these activities.

Student Achievement

CSO TARGETS

Last Tuesday morning during Staff Development, Mr Anthony Mahoney (our previous Assistant Principal) from the Catholic Schools Office conducted a workshop with staff on Student Achievement. Student Achievement is one of the two main priorities of the CSO – the first one being Evangelisation and Catechesis. There are four 'workstreams' supporting these two priorities: Governance; Capability and Enablement of our People; Financial Viability; and Infrastructure and Facilities.

The workshop was centred around how the CSO can better support the College in teaching and learning, high expectations, the importance of individual student growth and using data to measure and inform improvement.



NATIONAL TARGETS

At the national level, the <u>Mparntwe (Alice Springs) Education Declaration</u> was signed by all Australian Education Ministers last December.

The two 'Educational Goals for Young Australians' set as part of this declaration are:

Goal 1: The Australian education system promotes excellence and equity, and

Goal 2: All young Australians become confident and creative individuals, successful lifelong learners, and active and informed members of the community

The vision is for a world class education system that encourages and supports every student to be the very best they can be, no matter where they live or what kind of learning challenges they may face.

WHAT WE ARE DOING AT ST LEO'S

Here at St Leo's, we are heading in the right direction with the introduction 18 months ago of our '6Cs' (Christian Citizenship, Creativity, Character, Communication, Collaboration and Critical Thinking) into our curriculum.

Students can demonstrate their

development in each of these areas using our unique St Leo's Learning Den, where they are able to define, track their whole person learnings and achievements across our six Growth Domains (Spiritual, Academic, Cultural, Environmental, Social/Emotional and Physical Growth Domains) throughout their six years at the College.

The development of the whole person is central to our Catholic ethos - where we strive to be the best people we can be in order

to assist those who are less fortunate than ourselves in so many ways.

We are not there yet, but together, we are ahead of our achievement targets and continue to work towards what is best for our students as they take up the mission and various

Year 12 Graduation Update

As discussed and agreed with Year 12 parents and students last night via Zoom, Graduation will be postponed until after the completion of the HSC exams in Term 4. Of course we do not know at this stage whether Covid-19 restrictions will have eased by then, but at the very least, students should be more relaxed post exams and will be more able to enjoy the day.

We will advise Year 12 students and parents as soon as we have a new date – most likely in Week 7 of Term 4.

Year 12 - HSC Major Works Assistance

All teaching staff of courses that involve a HSC Major Works are available to assist Year 12 students before, in between and after their exams each day. Students are highly encouraged to be present in their specialist spaces to continue working on and refining their major works/portfolios. **Significant gains** can be achieved during and post trial examinations.

Year 12 PTP - Post Trial Program

As part of the 'PEP - Passion into Excellence Program', the College has been finalising the details of the Post Trial Program (PTP). The PTP will commence on **Monday of Week 8 and will conclude on Wednesday of Week 10.** The traditional teaching timetable will conclude for Year 12 at 3pm on Friday of Week 7.

The PTP is designed to enable students of each course to gather as a whole with their teachers to strategically address growth areas identified in their trial performance. The structured workshops will upskill students and be followed by **resitting a section of or the entire paper** from the trial exam to implement and improve based on the feedback provided. Statistics show significant improvements can be made when students take the time and effort to revise and apply feedback after their trial exams.

The PTP is compulsory for all Year 12 students and there will be <u>no 'Period 5 early departure</u>' during this program.

The workshops will all be held in the Mary MacKillop Centre, allowing teachers more efficiant access to all students together in one building to offer assistance. It also enables the Pastoral Care Team to keep a close eye on student wellbeing.

All students are expected to be in full College Winter Uniform during this program.

The completed PTP schedule will be available to students and parents in next week's edition of the Parental Lion Roars.

Students from Intake 2020 -Year 10 need to submit their projects on Friday, 4 September.

Students should be working on their projects during Mentor and in their personal time, and

should seek assistance from the Mentors if required.

Year 12 - Trial HSC Examinations Update

Year 12 2020 have demonstrated outstanding behaviour and conduct over the last 10 days whilst they have been undertaking these important exams. Mrs White (Presiding Officer) and Mr Morad (Dean of Curriculum & Professional Development) have been very impressed with all students. The cohort have demonstrated maturity, cooperation, and wonderful support for their peers. The Trial HSC examinations conclude **Tuesday 1st September** (Week 7).

2020-2021 Leadership Induction Program & Leadership Handover Ceremony

The 2020-2021 Leadership Induction Program has now been postponed until Term 4 and will be held in Week 2 (Tuesday & Wednesday 20-21 October). The date was adjusted for a number of reasons including the Year 11 Preliminary HSC exam timing and work placements, along with considerations around revised Year 12 dates.

The leadership handover ceremony has now been tentatively

scheduled for **Wednesday**, **2 September** (Week 7 of this term) during the Extended Mentor period. This ceremony will involve both the incumbent leaders and the new 2020-2021 Leadership Team. At this stage, the venue will be the Tenison Woods Gallery in our Mary MacKillop building. It will be streamed 'live' to respective parents/caregivers as we are restricted with onsite visitors due to Covid-19 regulations.

How to Help Teenagers Stay Safe Online - Part II

In Part II of our series, we look at screen time. An important extract from the eSafety Commissioner:

TIME ONLINE

'There is no magic figure. The right amount of screen time can depend on a range of factors like your child's age and maturity, the kind of content they are consuming, their learning needs and your family routine. It can be easy to focus only on the clock, but the quality and nature of what they are doing online, and your involvement, are just as important. Consider your child's screen use in the context of their overall health and wellbeing. For example, is online time getting in the way of their sleep and exercise? Is it impacting on their face-to-

face connections with family and friends? The answers to these questions will guide you and help strike the right balance of online and offline activities for your child.'

SIGNS that your child's online activity may be having a negative impact on them or on your family include:

- less interest in social activities like meeting friends or playing sport
- not doing so well at school
- tiredness, sleep disturbance, headaches, eye strain
- changes in eating patterns
- reduced personal hygiene
- obsession with particular websites or games
- extreme anger when being asked to take a break from online activity
- appearing anxious or irritable when away from the computer
- becoming withdrawn from friends and family.
