Student Successes

Over the last two weeks I have witnessed some excellent cases where students are excelling in various areas of their curriculum:

 Year 11 Hospitality - Work Placement - As part of any VET (Vocational Educational Training) Courses all students experience a workplace setting for two one-week blocks in Years 11 and 12. Many of our students have either secured a part time position from



their work placement either now or in the future (post Covid19). This is a great testament to the students' applications and abilities. - 2. The Aquinas Resource Centre has been opened for extended hours to cater and support our Yr 11 and 12 students as they prepare for their End of Preliminary Course Exams and the Trial HSC Exams; at times there have been up to 30 students in house. Some students work individually, some work in groups. Various staff have been available to assist; particularly in English, Languages, Mathematics, HSIE and Studies of Religion. Thank you to our staff and it's great to see students working sometimes here till 8pm! (I think *UberEats* business has boomed!)
- 3. Adobe 1 Minute Video Challenge a range of students who volunteered from Year 8 to Year 12 were able to participate and learn not only from each other but especially from Dr Tim Kitchen (Snr Educational Specialist-Adobe) and our Mr Tiglao, about digital media. Year 12 PTP - Post Trial Program

Research indicates that students who apply themselves significantly post the trials have the potential to have a sizeable impact on their HSC. The Post Trial Program (PTP) is aimed at maximising the Comparative Learning Gain potential of each student by **providing them with a focused opportunity to apply the**feedback they receive from the HSC Trial Exams. The opportunity to apply such feedback will be through a re-sitting of a section or the entirety of a trial exam for each of their courses, preceded by targeted workshops that focus on specific data informed goals set by the College.

The PTP is designed to be focused on **refining and upskilling students**. Following a deep analysis of HSC trends of the 2019 and the present 2020 cohort, the College and Catholic Schools Office have set specific areas, sections and questions where students need to focus their energies on, in order to achieve higher results when compared with students in statistically similar schools and learning environments.

The PTP workshops are designed to target these areas, sections and questions with an overall goal of achieving an additional 3 marks in each course for each student.

Students will have completed the following by the conclusion of the PTP:

- Have engaged in targeted workshops that address key areas/goals requiring growth(e.g. 3 additional marks)
- Have received targeted upskilling in the breaking down of HSC questions
- Have completed a re-sitting of a section or the entirety of a HSC Trial Exam
- · Receiving the above marked with quality feedback

Cohort Periods have been developed so the cohort as a whole can be presented to by a specialist (internal or external) as well as providing the opportunity for them to be together to re-sit an exam.

The PTP will take place solely within the Mary MacKillop Centre. This will enable any staff member who wishes to work 1:1 with a Y12 student to know where they are and to work with them. It will assist the College to keep a close eye on Y12 in order to monitor and support their wellbeing and to provide pastoral care.

The PTP is compulsory for all students. Please note that each student is required for 5 periods each day of the PTP. Early departure periods have concluded to maximise student preparation for the HSC. Full College Winter Uniform as per the norm is required.

The final Tuesday and Wednesday following the Retreat Day is being tailored according to the needs that arise during the PTP.

Students are required for both Tuesday and Wednesday as part of the PTP. The details for Tuesday 22/9 and Wednesday 23/9 will be distributed in due course.

We hope this program provides your daughter or son with additional support as they prepare for the HSC.



How to Help our St Leo's Teenage Community Stay Safe Online - Part IV: Cybersafety & Digital Citizenship

The internet and online technologies are incredible tools. They provide an opportunity to communicate, learn, play and be entertained by content from around the world. For many young people, the internet and mobile phones are their social lifeline. It's where they engage with friends out-of-school hours and keep up-to-date. For some, time away from that network can threaten their sense of connectedness to their social community. Like communicating in the real world, there are risks in interacting online. Cyberbullying, identity theft, scams and inappropriate content are some of the issues that can pose



challenges for young people – from pre-schoolers who may be starting to use a computer to more experienced teens.

Important tips for parents/caregivers:

- Remember that even when children seem to have good technical knowledge, their online behaviour still requires parental monitoring and guidance
- Spend time with your child using the internet can be a fun family activity
- Try to locate the computer in a shared or visible place at home
- Help your child use the internet as an effective research tool and teach them that **information on** the internet is not always reliable
- Teach your child positive online etiquette encourage them to treat others online in the same way they eould like to be treated
- Set rules make sure your child knows what information they can share by phone or post online and which websites they can visit. Discuss the amount of time they can spend online and ensure the maintain a balance
- Teach your child that there are ways they can deal with disturbing material encourage them not
 to respond to any communication that makes them feel uncomfortable or worried and to report it to
 a trusted adult.
