There are paintings, sculptures, multimedia, photography, animated art and drawing. These works will be marked tomorrow (Wednesday) by the HSC Markers.

Well done to all these students and their teachers, **Ms Stevenson** and **Ms Schneider**, for all their superb efforts in what has been a very disrupted year.

Opportunities for All Students

Besides our success in both Debating (Intake 2020 to Year 11) and CAPA, **Mrs Josephine Cali** is overseeing opportunities in the STE(A)M area. (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics).

The College is committed to improving the STEM skills of young people, to ensure that they have the skills they need to live and work in a globalised world. In support of this, our Director of Learning and Teaching, **Mrs Cali** is providing a significant number of workshops/opportunities to improve the outcomes of our students in this very important area. Current opportunities include:

• **Minecraft Mondays** – Minecraft is a game-based learning platform that promotes creativity, collaboration, and problem-solving in an immersive digital environment. Our students are currently creating a scaled version of Bakhita House building - with a great deal of detail.





- **Code Camp World** coding everything from drag and drop to JavaScript. Students can build websites in HTML and CSS and stunning games as well.
- Yamaha DRONES these workshops will be held on the last two days of this Term here at the College and on the Oval. Students will have the opportunity to continue their training towards CASA Certification for remotely piloted aircraft operator's certificate.
- **VEX Robotics** VEX Robotics Competitions ignite the competitive spirit! This year's VCR game is called CHANGE UP. In preparation, teams machine a robot that can excel within the game's rules and regulations to score as many points as possible. Competitions are held across the country.

Ms Cali has invited all students to be involved, via code, and students had to reply back in code to register their interest.

Other courses in the planning stages are:

- *Merge Cube* | *AR/VR Learning* & *Creation,* further coding courses with Code Camp World Continuers YouTube Creation, and
- Microsoft Student Training Credential Program.

Growth Domain Projects (Intake 2020 - Year 10)

The marking and grading of these projects are now being finalised by the respective mentor Teachers. The marking criteria for these projects contains these categories:

Research, Challenge/Focus, Technical Skill, Creativity, Essential Question, Innovation and Real Life Application.

From what I have seen there is wide variety of projects - but this one (excerpt below) caught my attention from the reflection of what the Intake 2020 student has learned: (This student has developed an Automatic Watering System using Python Script Coding - Water Conservation).

Reflection on My Project Summary

- Did your project work out well? What worked well
- My project worked extremely well. It was quite a challenging project.
- O Did you run into any obstacles/difficulties?
- Yes, to many to mention but with persistence I managed to get everything working.
- Summarize your achievements (how does your project help our environment?)
- I achieved exactly what I set out to achieve with a goal to saving water to help the environment. I also learnt a lot and added in some extra like the camera recognition to water a plant if it looks dry. (Haven't added it yet, but will using the same system as detecting your hand however with dry plants in the greenhouse)

I am looking forward to seeing (listening and observing) many of these projects over the next couple of weeks - the best ones will be showcased at a later date in Term 4.
