## Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples in our Community

Two events this week provide an opportunity for our community to stop and reflect on the roles Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have played in building our community.

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures are the oldest, continuous cultures in the world, having existed in Australia for at least 50,000 years. The uniqueness of these cultures, the wisdom and knowledge embedded in them are characteristics to be highly valued. The Australian



Curriculum includes the knowledge and skills students are expected to develop about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders histories and cultures, given their particular and enduring importance.

### NAIDOC Week

Celebrations are held across Australia each year to commemorate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples during NAIDOC Week. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians of all backgrounds.

NAIDOC stands for the '**National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee**'. This committee was once responsible for organising national activities during NAIDOC Week and its acronym has since become the name of the week itself.

The 2020, the theme is **Always Was, Always will Be**. It focuses on the length of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander occupation of Australia. The theme seeks to invite us to explore and learn, and appreciate the wealth and breadth of Indigenous Nations, languages and knowledges of this continent, exploring and learning about Indigenous understandings of the environment, plants, animals, greater astronomy, waters, land use and protection, Indigenous sciences and maths.



As we approach the long-awaited end of our building works, our flag poles will be reinstalled and the Australian, Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander and the St Leo's flags will be proudly flying once again in our community.

### Remembrance Day

November 11 is Remembrance Day - a day when we stop at 11am for a minute's silence to commemorate those who never made their journey home from war. In WW1, over 1000 Indigenous Australians answered our country's call.

We at St Leo's will remember all the fallen; all those affected by wars, conflicts and peace time operations. The ceremony will be held in front of our ANZAC Garden on the *Muru Mittigar* (Quadrangle - 'pathway to friends' in the Darug language) with College members of the 226 Regional Cadet Unit leading us in this commemoration.

One of these 1000 indigenous men was a member of the 11th Light horse, Trooper Frank Fisher, a well-known Rugby player and the great-grandfather of Olympic runner, Cathy Freeman. These indigenous personnel received equal rights whilst in the army. However, after the war ended, despite their service, they were not given the benefits that were granted to other ex-servicemen. There were no soldier settlements and usually no medals.



Together, we stand in solidarity with our Indigenous peoples. Please join me in recognising and celebrating the wonderful contributions Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have made and continue to make to our community. On Wednesday we will particularly remember those Indigenous peoples who gave of their lives for our freedom.

## Important Information for Parents of the Graduating Class of 2020

Graduation 2020 is nearly here and all Graduands (Graduating Year 12 students) and parents should have received an email this afternoon (Tuesday) with a link and login for the Graduating Class of 2020 web page with detailed information including:

- the compulsory **Graduation Rehearsal** for all Graduands **this Thursday from 10am-12 noon**
- full event details for this Friday's Graduation and what to expect on the day, in particular relating to Covid-19 requirements
- the **live-streaming link** to share with other family and friends
- how Graduands can obtain their Formal tickets.

A reminder that Graduands are to attend in the **rehearsal from 10am- 12 noon on Thursday in full school uniform**. In preparation for the Graduation Ceremony, **all male students need to be clean shaven**. The normal College uniform and grooming code applies for this most significant occasion.

The following day (Friday, 13 November) **students need to attend the College by 8.00am** and gather at The Light of Christ Centre. During this time, students will receive their graduation gowns, seating allocations and will be taken through the final reminders before the ceremony commences.

Due to Covid restrictions, nominated parents/guests will not be allowed inside the venue until shortly before the 10am start. Everyone will be required to undergo a temperature check, use the sign in app and make a Covid declaration before entering. Seating will also be physically distanced.

**We ask that all attendees be conscious of physical distancing and other Covid-19 precautions as you mingle with others before, during and after the event.**

We look forward to celebrating and marking the culmination of their secondary learning journey.

## Year 10 (Year 11 2021)

Today all students in Year 10 have received their course selections for their Preliminary Studies in 2021. Every effort has been made to ensure that students have been connected with their desired courses.

In addition, the College has prepared a new program to assist Year 10 to prepare for the transition into their Preliminary Courses in Year 11. After the completion of their ROSA grade requirements, students will commence the 'Step Up into Year 11' program in Week 7. Year 10 will receive a new timetable where they will be engaging in classes that are tailored to preliminary work and skills required for a confident start next year. This will provide them with a detailed taste of what to expect while also building capacity in senior course skills in their chosen subjects. Students will receive their confirmed courses of study for Year 11 next Tuesday.

The final day for Year 10 2020 will be Wednesday, 16 December.

### Year 10 Youth Ministry Class 2021

For the past week, I have been visiting Year 9 RE classes promoting the opportunity for them to be a part of the Youth Ministry RE class next year in Year 10. This is an elective course that has already been running for several years in other schools in the Diocese and around Australia. It will be the third year we run it at St Leo's in 2021.

It aims to **develop students as Christian leaders**, giving them opportunities to develop skills in planning and conducting Youth ministry initiatives. It takes the place of the normal Religious Education classes.

Students in this class will be granted extra opportunities to put their faith into action outside the classroom. They will also be encouraged to get involved and develop leadership through a range of co-curricular activities. There will be some differences in the topics covered by this class compared to other RE classes as they will do topics on Youth Ministry and Leadership. For one of their assessment tasks, they will plan and run the Year 7 Reflection Day - with students doing all the talks, running games, activities, the liturgy as well as running small discussion groups.

## Vinnies St Leo's Conference - First Meeting

Volunteers for our new Vinnies School Conference met for the first time in the Youth Ministry Room on Monday after school. We were joined by Christina and Chantelle from the Vinnies Schools Engagement Team and via Zoom by Michelle Chahine, the NSW Vinnies Vice President for Youth. The students learnt about the history and good works of the St Vincent de Paul Society, reaching out to people in need in a range of ways from homeless shelters, food vans, drop-in centres for youth as well as the charity stores. Thanks to Madam Noel who attended to support the students as well.



The Youth Ministry syllabus we follow has been approved by the Board of Studies (now called NESAs). According to the syllabus: *Students examine various models and methods of youth ministry as responses to the Church's mission to young people. Students develop youth ministry skills as they contribute to the planning and implementation of a youth ministry experience for younger students.*

## Compulsory School Attendance – Important Information for Parents

During 2020, we introduced the COMPASS parent portal, and the College would like to thank you sincerely for integrating this system into your family/carer communication.

Attendance records are a vital and legal requirement of Education in NSW. Following an absence from school you must ensure that **within 7 days** you provide the College with an electronic (via the Compass Parent Portal) or written detailed explanation for the absence(s), otherwise, it will be noted as unjustified.

When using the **Add Attendance Note** feature on the Compass Parent Portal please ensure that the correct reason is entered for any absence(s) and that specific information is also noted in the Details/Comment field so that the College has accurate records for your son/daughter.

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. Catholic Schools Broken Bay work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

### What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. *The Education Act 1990* requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the New South Wales Educational Standards Authority (NESA) for home schooling. Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

**What if my child has to be away from school?** On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease;
- having an unavoidable medical appointment;
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday; or
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

## Early Departure Arrangements: Revised System – effective from Wednesday, 11 November

Effective tomorrow ALL students who have an early departure arrangement must also have a signed parent/caregiver note or signed Student Diary entry. This note or diary entry must also be presented and signed by your Year Leader before 8:35am. Before departing the College, the signed note must first be presented to Mrs Raso (Student Services) before using the Compass student kiosk. Students will **not** be allowed to leave the College unless a hard-copy note has also been received by the College. Students who are late to the College each morning should also provide Mrs Raso a signed hard copy signed note or signed diary entry first before using the Compass student kiosk.

Year 12 students who have a Period 5 Study arrangement should continue to use the Compass student kiosk, if required, to sign-out from the College.

### Send the Wattle to Space Program @ St Leo's

[One Giant Leap Australia Foundation](#) is sending native golden wattle seeds to the International Space Station in early December, 2020. In collaboration with the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA) the seeds will live in space for six months, returning to Australia in time for Science Week 2021.

Supported by the Australian Space Agency, the "What'll happen with the wattle??" program is being offered to a selective number of schools around Australia, **St Leo's is one of these schools.**

St Leo's will receive wattle seeds that have flown to space, plus seeds that have not. The seeds are from the same seed lot. Students are asked to germinate and grow their seeds, recording data about the germination and seed growth. Data will be uploaded to the 'What'll happen to the wattle???' app.



Throughout the program, One Giant Leap Australia Foundation will run teleconferences and provide educational support to students at St Leo's. The 12-month to 2-year project will result in the creation of a nationwide map identifying the location of Australia's 'space wattle' trees.

The project is an historic opportunity for Australian schools and students.
