College Swimming Carnival

As all parents and caregivers were notified last Friday, our Annual College Swimming Carnival this Friday has had to be greatly modified due to Covid-19. We were hoping the Carnival may have been able to operate in a similar format to previous years, but we cannot ignore the health and safety of our community.



There is no right answer to this issue, only the best solution. In a nutshell, this is what our College Swimming Carnival will look like for 2020:

- **The Carnival will only be for those students who registered for the Championship events** (approx. 75 students across Intake 2020 to Year 11)
- **Our invited Year 6 (Intake 2021) students will still participate** (15 in total)
- **No parents are permitted at the St Leo's hired section of the venue**
- **There will to be 45 events for the Championship students**
- **Normal school day (Day 5 of the timetable) will apply for all other students**
- **The amended Carnival will take place from 9am - 12pm, with participating students to arrive by 8.30am. They will then be dismissed from the venue - they will NOT be required to attend classes for the remainder of the day.**



I am very conscious that 'College spirit' and cross-year group activities have been limited this year due to Covid-19. Our whole College events have been completely restricted since mid-March. I know many students (and staff) were looking forward to this event so we could celebrate as a whole College community. In 2021 - high on our College Improvement Plan – we will be ensuring that these activities and relationships are developed so that all students not only feel at ease and comfortable within the College but also that they have the opportunity to mix with older and younger students - and of course our staff! It is so important.

We recommend students start looking at the resources available to them to complement their study program as they have already started their official HSC year.

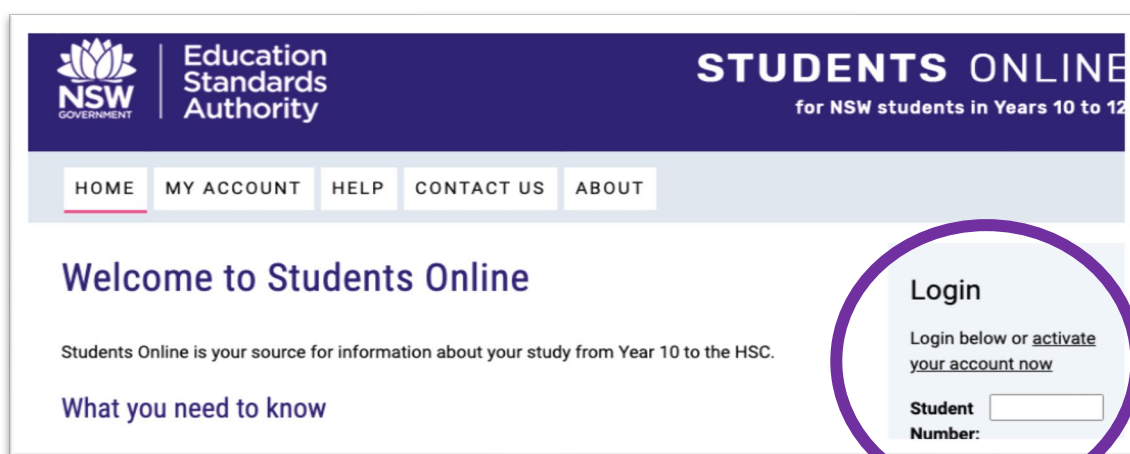
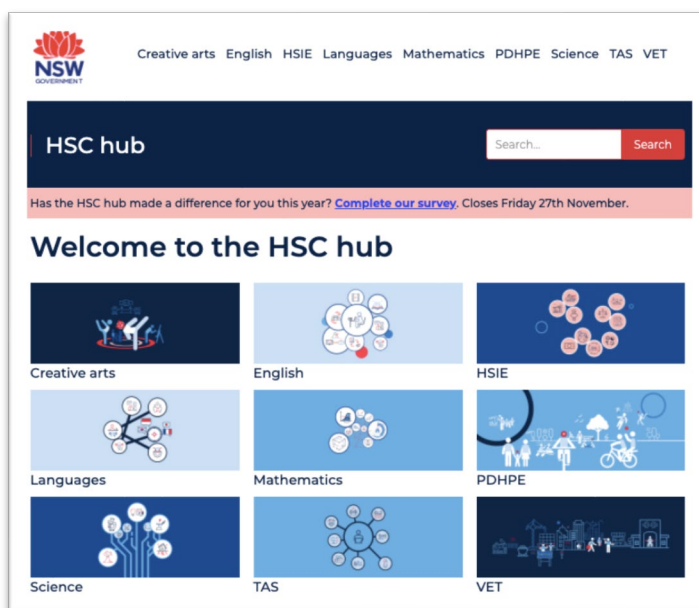
Students who have a good balance between their studies, work commitments, and family/friends should be able to achieve their personal best in the year ahead. Students will be working with their Year Leader to plan and prepare for their upcoming assessment tasks this term.

Students ONLINE - Years 10, 11, 12

All students in Years 10, 11 and 12 have the opportunity to complete the Minimum Standards Tests so that these credentials appear on their ROSA.

Once students have met these standards, they are recommended to log in to their

[Students Online Account](#) to access and save an electronic copy of their HSC Minimum Standards Certificates. Students in Year 10 can set up their account by clicking the 'activate your account now' button.



NESA Schools Online Accounts (<https://studentonline.nesa.nsw.edu.au/>) will terminate shortly after the each year group completes their HSC Examinations or when they leave the College. Access to any records available from a Student's Online account is free for as long as the account is open. However, if students do not download these before their account is closed NESA will charge a fee for retrieval of any documents. Year 10 HSC NESAs Minimum Standards

Students have been completing their HSC Minimum Standards Tests. Students who were absent on testing days are asked to see Mrs Cali to complete these tests as soon as possible. Test results for the Minimum Standards Tests will be sent to students via their Students Online accounts up to 20 days after they complete the tests.

Students will need to bring a **fully charged iPad and a pen** for the tests. Students do not need to study or prepare for the tests.

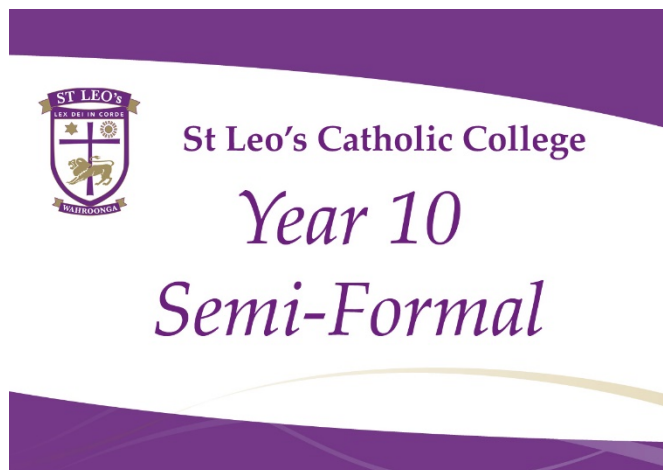

Summer Skills for School Leavers

Have you heard about Summer Skills for School Leavers Program?

It is an initiative of NSW JobTrainer. It offers 2020 Year 12 school leavers the opportunity to upskill, prepare and get ahead through fee-free training courses in construction, coding, business, horticulture, social media, mental health and more. Find out more [here!](#)

What's coming up this week and next:

1. **CodeCamp** (every Wednesday, after school)
2. **Tradiebot AR/ VR – 26 October to 14 December**
 - Five Intake 2020 and Year 8 students have been selected for a special and exclusive pilot program with Tradiebot. These students will have access to the special course materials of Tradiebot and learn all the ins and outs around AR and VR programming and modelling. This program will run for the remainder of the term and will continue in 2021.
3. **Girls in Engineering Excursion – 1 December**
 - Systems Connect is delivering metro rail track, power, communications, signalling systems and infrastructure to turn the excavated tunnels into a working railway between Chatswood and Sydenham. Systems Connect have developed the FEED (Female Engineers Early Development) initiative to provide students with an opportunity to gain a greater understanding and exposure to careers in engineering and provide insight on HSC subject selection for entry to STEM degrees.
 - In addition to learning sessions on the wide range of components to an engineering project, such as drafting, construction, safety and environment, students will visit a nominated Construction & Engineering site and get up and personal with some Systems Connect leading female engineers
 - Registrations for this workshop is no longer possible for this year.
4. **Prince Trust Australia: Data Decisions 2020 Workshop – 3 December**
 - Data Decisions 2020 is a scenario-based workshop delivered online and led by young people that will activate decision-making skills and support students to: design ethical decisions, responses and strategies based on data provided throughout the day. Using big data insights, statistical analysis, and best practice program design, Prince's Trust Australia and Resilient Youth have paired up to bring you Data Decisions, a ground-breaking initiative that positions young people as experts to create solutions to the most pressing challenges that they are facing.

5. **Careers in Sport Workshop – 4 December**
 - Cricket NSW and Australian Institute for Sports (AIS) are keen to visit St Leo's and deliver a dynamic presentation around Careers in Sports.

English: Wednesday December 9, 4.30pm-5.30pm

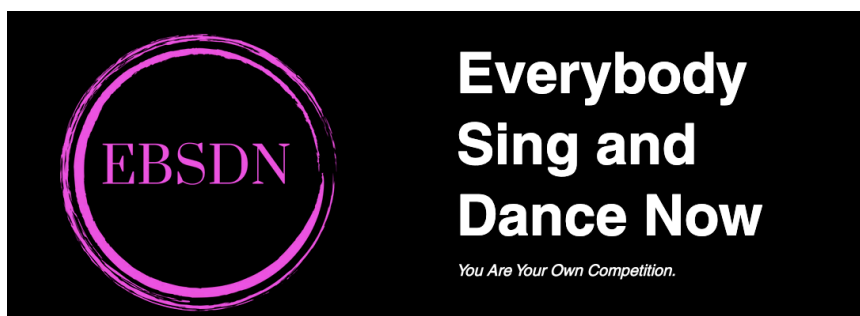

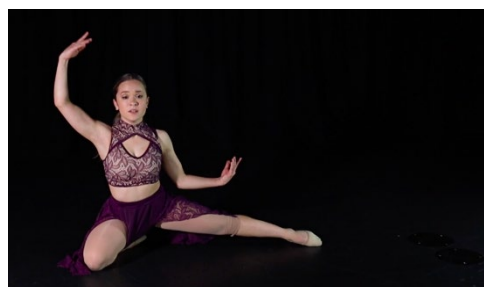
