

### Technology Requirements Update for 2021 (Intake 2021 – Year 12)

#### Bring Your Own Designated Device (BYODD) iPad Program

St Leo's Catholic College supports a Bring Your Own Designated Device (BYODD) Program. Technology-enabled teaching allows for more active engagement in learning. Activities and styles of engagement previously impossible or difficult to achieve are now readily attainable. It is a requirement that all students in all years have their own Apple device that meets the following minimum specifications. The device is a learning tool, and as such, it is to be utilised for learning purposes. Families are encouraged to review the Apps on student learning devices and are asked to remove those that are unnecessary for learning before the new year. This will also optimise the function of the iPad if the storage is near to its storage capacity.

#### MacBook / MacBook Air / MacBook Pro Minimum requirements:

- MacOS Operating System High Sierra or higher (i.e. High Sierra, Mojave or Catalina)
- 13" screen size minimum for laptops
- 8 hr + advertised battery life minimum
- Intel iSeries processor i5 or higher, or equivalent AMD processor
- Memory 8GB RAM (minimum)
- Storage 128GB (minimum) (Solid State Drive (SSD) recommended)
- Wireless support for 802.11 AC minimum
- Sturdy case (e.g. EVA) to protect the device
- Three-year pick-up and return warranty from Apple

#### iPad

Minimum requirements:

- 7th Generation
- 10.2-inch screen
- 32GB Apple iPad. (We strongly recommend 128GB or above)
- Three-year pick-up and return warranty from Apple

Apple pencils and keyboards are optional.

NOTE: iPad Minis are NOT SUPPORTED. Wi-Fi only is advised for iPads as students have access to College Wi-Fi.


All students have been extremely dedicated to all rehearsals and filming of classwork such as the launch of the CAPA Cubs promotional video this Term, demonstrating great professionalism.


