all parents as they are very worthwhile. The three readings are short - less than 5 minutes for each one:


- Rank Decisions (ATAR and other factors influencing course selections)

Final Reminder - 2021 'Teacher /Librarian' Position Parent/Carer Feedback


Thank you to those 20 or so parents who have provided some input into this position that we will advertise shortly.

College Uniform

Sports uniform is only to be worn to the College if a student has timetabled PDHPE/Sport or is representing the College in a relevant sport/activity otherwise full Summer uniform should be worn.

College tracksuits are only to be worn if a student has timetabled PDHPE/Sport or is representing the College in a relevant sport/activity, otherwise, full Summer uniform should be worn.



Representative garments with Broken Bay/CCC logos are only to be worn if a student is representing the College offsite in a relevant sport/activity otherwise full Summer uniform should be worn.

As stated in the Student Diary, the wearing of the uniform correctly shows pride in one's appearance and enhances the reputation of the College in the wider community.

Students who are not correctly attired and/or groomed should **see their Year Leader before 8.35am** - it is expected that respective students either produce a signed parent/caregiver note or entry in the diary first before a uniform/grooming pass is issued.

Positive Parenting

Despite the best efforts of parents around the world, the reality is, there is no such thing as the 'perfect parent'. However, arming yourself with the right information is a good start!

Research shows that one of the most important protective factors in the lives of young people is a close relationship with a supportive adult. With the **mental health** of today's young people being at an

Sometimes parents today are overprotective, resulting in children being less independent, unable to problem-solve or self-regulate. Parents may not set clear boundaries, which unfortunately may make children feel less secure. There is a great deal of pressure on children in the 21st century.

Year 10 - HSC Minimum Standards Tests

Test results for Minimum Standards Tests completed by students in the last few weeks have been sent to them via their NESA Student Online accounts. Parents and caregivers can ask their young person to share these results with them.

HSC MINIMUM STANDARD

You need reading, writing and maths skills for everyday life after school. This why you are required to demonstrate a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive the Higher School Certificate (HSC) from 2020.



Students who were absent on testing days are asked to see Mrs Cali to complete these tests as soon as possible. This includes students who are leaving the College. The last date set by NESA for Minimum Standards Testing in 2020 is Friday, 4 December.

Test opportunities will recommence in 2021 so there is plenty of time remaining for students who have been unable to attempt these tests or for students who would like to reattempt the tests. Further support will be available for students who have not yet met the Minimum Standards in early 2021.

I am pleased to advise that the vast majority of our St Leo's students have met or exceeded the minimum standards on their first attempt for all three of the testing areas (Reading, Writing and Numeracy). In particular, 98% of students who have attempted the Reading Test this year have already met the Minimum Standard.

I commended Year 10 for the level of maturity they have displayed while completing these tests. I look forward to working with them in 2021 as they commence their senior studies.

Creative and Active Kids Vouchers - Years 7-12

The NSW Government is helping kids get active with the Active Kids program. The Active Kids program provides two \$100 vouchers for parents, guardians and carers of school-enrolled children to use towards sport and active recreation costs each year. Voucher 1 is valid January to December and Voucher 2 is valid July to December.





The vouchers may be used with a registered activity provider for registration, participation and membership costs for sport, fitness and active recreation activities.

This year, the Creative Kids Voucher can also be used to purchase art and craft supply kits online. Try searching for Creative Kids Art Kits to find suppliers that will send kits to you. Unused vouchers expire on December 31, 2020.
