Australian STEM Video Competition

Students interested in creating online video games are welcome to come to BH105 on Wednesday afternoons from 3.15-4.15 pm from Wednesday, 3 March to work on creating a game to enter in the 2021 Australian Video Games Competition. Bring Your Own Designated Device (BYODD) iPad/MacBook Program

St Leo's supports a Bring Your Own Designated Device (BYODD) Program. Technology-enabled teaching allows for more active engagement in learning. Activities and styles of engagement previously impossible or difficult to achieve are now readily attainable.

It is a requirement that all students from Intake 2021 to Year 12 have their own Apple MacBook or iPad that meets the minimum specifications and required Apps. The device is a learning tool, and as such, it is to be used for learning purposes.

Families are encouraged to review the Apps on student learning devices and are asked to remove those that are unnecessary for learning. This will also optimise the function of the device if the storage is near to capacity.



Reminder: NAPLAN Online 2021 – Intake 2021 and Year 9

NAPLAN 2020 Online testing at St Leo's will take place between <u>Tuesday</u>, 11 May 2021 and Friday, 14 May 2021.

Students with additional needs may access special provisions for the NAPLAN Tests. Parents/caregivers of students who require any form of special provision for NAPLAN Tests are asked to contact Mrs Tamara
Bowman (Leader of Learning Support) before March 15 to arrange the provisions.

Reminder: Education Perfect (EP) Spelling Competitions – Intake 2021 - Year 9

Students in Intake 2021, Year 8 and 9 have been learning and competing in Spelling Competitions via the EP Platform. The first Spelling Test Competition

will close on 6 March. Many students have already achieved Bronze, Silver and Gold Certificates and there are still 4 days remaining for this competition. Gold, Silver and Bronze EP Certificates will be issued to each student who achieves 500, 1000 or 1500 points in each competition.





So far, Intake 2021 is in the lead with 39 students achieving awards but more importantly, each student taking part in the competition is improving their literacy skills.

The Spelling Competitions use spelling lists that incorporate words used in NAPLAN Tests. In this way, students can use these competitions as a way to prepare for NAPLAN.

Students are also encouraged to enter their achievements in their Learning Portfolio via the St Leo's Learning Den.

Reminder: Creative and Active Kids Vouchers – Intake 2021 - Year 12

The NSW Government is helping kids get active with the Active Kids program. The program provides two \$100 vouchers for parents, guardians and carers of school-enrolled children to use towards sport and active recreation costs each year.



Voucher 1 is valid January to December and Voucher 2 is valid July to December.

The vouchers may be used with a registered activity provider for registration, participation and membership costs for sport, fitness and active recreation activities.



Reminder: Code Camp World – Intake 2021 - Year 11

Code Camp World takes place on Wednesdays as a co-curricular after school program from 3.15pm to 4.15pm commencing on Wednesday, 3 March, for students in Intake 2021 to Year 11. This course will continue into Term 2 and runs for 10 school weeks. The cost of the course is \$100 per term or FREE for students in exchange for their Creative Kids Voucher. Students can complete the online course at school or they can complete it at home.

Upcoming Pathways Activities this Term

1. Diversity in Surveying Conference - March 8

Six Year 12 students will take part in the Diversity in Surveying Conference, hosted by the NSW Surveying Association at Doltone House (Darling Harbour) on Monday, March 8. The morning will be filled with hands-on activities for students and the opportunity to network with major Construction and Surveying companies over lunch.

2. Song & Dance Production Workshop (JMC Academy) - March 18

JMC Academy will be visiting St Leo's again this year after a very successful and creative Music Workshop last year. Our Music and Dance students will work together to produce a new song and accompanying dance during this hands-on workshop, while also learning more about different study and career options in the creative industries.



3. Hands-On Career in Sports Workshop - March 31

David Gowen and Luke Williamson, both NRL players, will be visiting St Leo's on March 31 to talk about Careers and Pathways in Sport and the importance of having a back-up plan for sporting careers. Most of the workshop will take place outside on the oval in an interactive and hands-on way. Students can still register for this workshop. Only school email addresses will be accepted for registering.

4. Academy of Interactive Entertainment (AIE) Industry Experience Day - several dates

AlE's Industry Experience Days are a great opportunity for students in Years 10, 11 and 12 to learn about the local and international game development, 3D animation and visual effects industries. Students will get the opportunity to learn about the different pathways to get into the industry, what should be in a portfolio and will be able to get creative in practical workshops using industry-standard 3D animation and game development tools.



The sessions are run by industry professionals who have worked on some blockbuster games and films. Everything is provided for you to participate in the hands-on workshops and you will be using the same software that is used in the industry.


5. Interior Design Workshop by Whitehouse Institute of Design - Term 1
