Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of the College,

Term 2 Opportunities – A Summary

Welcome back for a 10 week Term 2. During this Term, alongside the (approx) **250 lessons** your young person will be experiencing, the **subject selection process** will commence for **Years 8 and 10** for 2022; **Year 12** will undertake

their final full term of lessons before their $Trial\ HSC$ commences in Week 3 (w/c 26 July) of Term III; $Year\ 11$ will cover a great deal of content as they approach the halfway point in their Preliminary Studies in each of

their subjects; and Intake 2021 and Year 9 will be conducting NAPLAN as well as their normal classes.

These academic pursuits are on top of the many other opportunities offered by the College in Term 2. We are straight into action, with **Year 12** departing for their threeday Retreat to Stanwell Tops today (Tuesday), while **Year 11 Visual Arts students** leave for their Artist in Residence Camp tomorrow (Wednesday) to the Arthur Boyd Estate at Bundanon.



TERM

Another major event for the Term will be the 2021 College Musical - *Camp Rock*. Performances will be held on Thursday 10, Friday 11, and Saturday 12 June (Queen's Birthday long weekend), so watch out for ticketing information over the coming weeks.

The only activity that sadly won't be available this Term is our **Kiribati Immersion**; held successfully for six years before Covid. However, we are hoping to recommence this most important social justice opportunity in 2022, of course subject to Government travel advice at the time.

After consultation with parents and carers last Term, we will now formalise the work that has been done in regard to our *Parents in Partnership* Model and have our first meeting on **Wednesday**, **26 May at 7pm**. This will enable you as our 'No.1 Educators' to engage better with your young person's education, regardless of the subjects or levels they are studying.

This Term will also present a formal opportunity for our **parents/carers to speak with your young person's class teachers**. As supported by the parents/carers last year - this will be via Zoom. The dates are:

- Years 12 and 11 Thursday 13 May (Week 4)
- Years 10 & 9 Wednesday 19 May (Week 5)

Please keep in your prayers **Mrs Kimberley Prosser** (HSIE teacher) who lost her mother unexpectedly during the holidays.



Winter Uniforms

Reminder regarding the College Winter Uniform.


BOOKINGS OPEN: this Thursday (22 April) from 3pm via Compass

INSTRUCTIONS TO BOOK:

The booking system for these evenings will be via Compass and **will be open to Parents on Thursday from 3pm**.

- 1. Log into Compass
- 2. Once logged into Compass after bookings open, a notification will appear under 'My News' informing you that the Parent Teacher Interviews are now open to make appointments.
- 3. Select 'Click here for bookings' with this notification, which will take you to the bookings where your son or daughter's teachers' names will appear.
- 4. Select a teacher's name and an available time slot (in white) to book a time. Repeat for each teacher.
- 5. There is also a 'Show me how to book' button which will give you further instructions if needed.

Alternatively, you can access the sessions by going to Community section of the Compass banner and selecting Conferences from the drop-down menu.



ZOOM LINKS FOR EACH INTERVIEW:

- Parents will receive an email from Compass this week that provides access to a PDF containing the Zoom link for each teacher.
- Please click on the link to log into the meeting 2-3 minutes before your designated time (unless
 on another meeting immediately beforehand). You will be sent to a waiting room. Once the teacher
 is finished with the previous meeting, they will allow you into the Zoom meeting for your booked
 Parent Teacher Interview.
- Please note: due to the nature of these meetings, keeping to time is essential to ensure a knock-on
 effect of delays is avoided. If you require further time for discussion, please let the relevant teacher
 know and they will make the necessary arrangement for a second Zoom meeting at a later date.

We look forward to this important step in the learning journey of your daughter or son.

This Term, Intake 2021 through to Year 10 will be sitting exams in some subjects during Weeks 3-6.

A formalised timetable will be issued to both parents and students **early next week (Week 2)**. As always, we will be endeavouring to ensure that the spread of assessments is fair with no student having two assessments on the same day.
