Bereavements

It is with great sadness that I convey the news that one of our past students, **Kate Glendenning**, Phil Glendenning's daughter, passed away late last week. Her family was with her at the time (**Rachel Glendenning** and **Maddie Huxley**, Year 12, cousins).



As we advised here recently, Kate was facing a serious health crisis two months ago and was hospitalised with complications in her second pregnancy. She was found to have liver cancer. Kate was induced six weeks prematurely and gave birth to a baby boy. She and her husband James have another son who has just turned three. The new baby, Ted, is well.



We hold Phil (College Captain 1975, pictured above) and his entire family in our thoughts and prayers as they support each other through this incredibly difficult time.

The Glendenning family have a long association with the College, the Christian Brothers and Edmund Rice Australia. Phil's father Laurie - Kate, Rachel and Maddie's grandfather (pictured left), was the architect of our earlier buildings and was one of the main players responsible for building the current Pope St Leo the Great College Chapel. Laurie was a guest of ours at the recent

Rededication and Blessing last term. He and his wife are residents of McQuoin Park. Phil is the Director of Edmund Rice Centre for Justice and Community Education, Homebush.

The College (and many other communities across NSW) were asked to be part of a Novena to Blessed Edmund Rice for Kate. Many of our students, particularly those in Year 12 joined us in prayer over nine lunchtimes. It was God's will that Kate passed away last Friday. This is difficult to understand - one of the challenges of our faith.

We also remember **Mr Gabriel Christian Michel** (father of Sam, Year 8; Xavier, Year 12 2019; cousin of staff member, Ms Claire Stephenson) who passed away from cancer last Monday week evening. The funeral will be this Friday, 1pm at St Agatha's, Pennant Hills.

Thank you to those staff and students who contributed to our fund raising of the Mothers' Day muffins last Friday. That money will be sent to *Cancer Australia*, in the memory of Mr Michel.

May both Christian and Kate rest in peace.

Personally, I am incredibly indebted to Jayne, not only for her professionalism as my Assistant, keeping me on track day to day, but also for the always caring and generous way she went about everything.

To her credit, Jayne has been successful in her application to the position of *Leader of Pathways* to both St Paul's Manly and Mater Maria College, Warriewood. So even though Jayne will remain with us here in CSBB - we will miss her ever generous personality, sense of humour, caring nature and her attitude of getting the job done in a very timely and professional manner.



NAPLAN - Intake 2021 and Year 9

Good luck to our Intake 2021 and Year 9 students who are undertaking the National Assessment Plan-Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) this Wednesday and Thursday (and if needed, a makeup assessment on Friday).

All assessment will be online across all schools by 2022. This is our third year of an online environment. Parents/Carers can view a short clip of <u>NAPLAN Online here</u>. I would like to thank our Director of Learning & Teaching, **Ms Josephine Cali** who has



been working behind the scenes in preparing and ensuring our online environment is on track, but more importantly has coordinated the preparation, briefing and practice tests for our students in both cohorts.

Student Reports

The Year 12 Mid-Year Reports were made available to all parents/carers last Friday. I addressed our Year 12 cohort yesterday morning (Monday) and asked them to reflect on these reports for their own improvement and growth. I have written to all Year 12 parents/carers about my presentation to students, including important HSC and ATAR information. Please check your Compass emails.

Thank you to all staff who have compiled this detailed information, particularly to our Acting Dean of Curriculum and Professional Development, **Mr Daniel Lane**, who has coordinated the reformatting and design of a new style of report. The reports now have the following categories:

- Semester One Cumulative Assessment Total (percentage, rank and average)
- Graphical representation of Overall Achievement, showing Student's result, Average result and Range of results.

NAPLAN Reminders - Intake 2021 and Year 9

Please note the following regarding NAPLAN Tests which will take place on **tomorrow 12 May** and **Thursday 13 May**. These reminders have been sent regularly within the Student Daily Notices to students:

Students are to:

- Ensure that their device is connected to the College Wi-Fi, logged into CEnet, and has the NAPLAN Lockdown Browser installed
- Ensure that they bring earphones
- Work through the St Leo's NAPLAN 2021 Reminders and use of the online tools Google Presentation. The dates and times for each NAPLAN test are in the Google Presentation, which everyone can view
- On both days of the tests, they are to bring their device, a pen/pencil and a water bottle. They should leave their school bag in their locker
- NAPLAN is one assessment tool to measure their learning progress. We ask that they do their best work for the NAPLAN Tests. There is no need to be anxious about the tests. However, if they wish to look at the test format again, please have them go to the NAPLAN Public demonstration site.
- If they are ill or unable to attend the NAPLAN tests, please inform the College and follow the usual procedures for attendance on COMPASS. They will complete 'Catch Up' NAPLAN tests on their return to school.

This week we continue with the Intake 2021 - Year 10 examination window. Please find below the link to the Examination Schedule for your convenience:

Half Yearly Examination Timetable

Important reminders for students:

- It is the responsibility of the student to read the timetable very carefully to ensure they know the dates, times and rooms of each examination
- Students are required to bring all necessary equipment with them to the examination
- Extra writing paper will be provided if required, however, no other equipment will be loaned to the students
- Students with exams in the Rome Gallery are to meet on Loyola Green to have rolls marked and be moved into the examination room
- If a student is absent on the day of an examination they must see the Leader of the respective KLA on the day they return to the school. A suitable time will be arranged for the student to sit for the missed examination
- No mobile phones or other electronic devices are allowed into the examination. If a student has a mobile phone or other electronic device during the examination they may receive a mark of zero for that paper
- Any student who is caught cheating or deemed to have gained an unfair advantage to their peers may be awarded a mark of zero for the examination

Year 12 Formative Examination Block

Please find below a reminder regarding the **Year 12 Formative Examination Block -** The schedule for this block can be found here: <u>Year 12 Formative Examination Block</u>

From Monday 10 May - Friday 21 May, students in Year 12 will be engaging in a Formative Examination Block. This is a **practice examination block** that will involve a two-hour examination for 2 Unit Courses and a one-hour examination for 1 Unit Courses. These will take place during their normal class time. Two-hour examinations will take place during their double period.

This examination block is **vital preparation** for their trial HSC Examinations that will take place from Monday 26 July through to Monday 9 August. The papers will be marked by staff at the College and external markers depending on the course. Students will receive professional feedback. **This feedback is crucial for students to know how to improve while also providing a clear indication of their academic progress.** The exams will be tailored to where the students are presently up to in the course. The format of the exams will mirror in style HSC layout (with the exception that 2 Unit Courses are three-hour examinations etc).

Please encourage your daughter/son to adequately prepare for this important part of their learning journey.

Year 10 and Selection of Year 11 Preliminary Courses Term 2

The subject selection process for Year 11 2022 (current Year 10s) will commence soon.

A set of videos will be accessible on the College website for students to explore with their parents outlining:

- structure of the course
- course content / course requirements

- assessments
- key aspects of interest during their study
- key skill sets needed for the course
- benefits of the course for future pathways/careers/study.

On Friday 28 May, students will be taken through the videos on campus with staff available to answer questions regarding their preferences. Parents and carers are requested to discuss preferences with their daughter or son after viewing the videos. A video explaining the components and requirements of the HSC and the ATAR will be included. All videos will be made available to parents and students on the College Website by Thursday 27 May.

To access the videos, please click on the 'Current Students' tab and then select the 'Year 11 2022 Subject Selection' link in the drop-down menu. Students and parents will also be able to access the 2022 Course Handbook from this page on Thursday 27 May.

Also on 28 May, parents and students will receive an email from Edval Choice outlining the instructions on how to make their subject preferences online. This email will include the web access code that is personalized. Students must complete these preferences online, print the summary form (inclusive of parent and student signatures) and return to **College Reception by Friday 4 June**.

The fortnight following the video launch will involve Leaders of Learning for each of the courses, reviewing student preferences and making recommendations in preparation for the Subject Selection Interviews that will take place as the final step in the process.

200th Anniversary of Catholic Education Mass


On Monday, 24 May we will be celebrating Mass at the same time as Dioceses' across the country to mark the 200th Anniversary of Catholic Education in Australia.

Reflective Growth Interventions (RGI) Update

Please note that a number of students have recently received a Wednesday Reflective Growth Intervention or RGI (formerly known as Detention) when they have not accrued three demerits for the Term. Parents/carers have also been electronically notified.

The demerit count starts at zero at the beginning of each Term and does not carry over from the previous Term. This is currently being addressed by our Compass support team and, hopefully, will be rectified shortly. In the interim, RGIs will be cancelled for students who have been impacted by this and respective parents/carers contacted about the adjustment. This amendment, if required, will be reflected Compass.

Compass Student ID cards

This College ID card should be carried by students at all times and used for late arrivals and early departures to/from the College as required using the Student Kiosk now located outside the Student Services Office.

All late arrivals and early departures for students will be recorded as Partially Unexplained except when a hard-copy note is provided by the student and/or parent/carer **using the** *Add Attendance Note* **feature on the Compass Parent Portal**. The College will also communicate partial absences daily to parents/carers.

Keeping Teens Safe Online

There are a lot of great ways that our children can use connected technological devices to learn and play, but there are also risks that you can help them avoid. eSafety has a wide range of advice for parents and carers covering common online safety issues like managing screen time, cyberbullying, inappropriate content, sending nudes and contact from strangers. We also have basic online safety advice for parents in languages other than English. Here is **one step** to help protect young people.

Start the chat: It's not possible to be at your child's side every second of the day, so it's important to talk with them about online safety issues to help develop their critical thinking and ability to make good choices. It's also good to let them know they can come to you for help if they have any concerns. You may feel they know more about the latest technology than you do, but you have more life experience to guide them.

- Take the opportunity to set some boundaries around when and where they can use devices like tablets, smart TVs and gaming consoles, to help limit potential tech tantrums
- While you are all at home more, it's a great time to co-view and co-play with your kids, so you can understand what they are doing and experiencing online.
- Learn about the games, apps, social media and platforms they are using at The eSafety Guide, including how to protect their information and report inappropriate content or conduct. See https://www.esafety.gov.au/key-issues/esafety-guide
- Encourage them to explore eSafety's targeted advice for kids (primary school) and young people (secondary school)
- Check eSafety's tips for talking with your child about tricky personal subjects like online pornography.
