



Letter No 4 - Covid-19 Update

15 July 2021

Dear St Leo's community,

Many thanks for your cooperation, patience (when there are those glitches) but most of all, *getting on with the job* attitude. **This applies to students, parents and staff.**

An example of this - was this morning - in my Intake 2021 Mathematics class - where last night we received new protocols for the operation of Zoom. The new protocols were not quite there yet, and that did not perturb the students. They tried other ways of entering the zoom, *collaborated* (through *Google Classroom*) and I even received a few emails! It was great to see them persist (controlled) and *problem solve* as much as they could (me included).

After 4 or 5 minutes we worked around the new protocols (turned them off) and all was good. It was pleasing to see these young students take it in their stride! Skills very much necessary for the world they are part of.

The most recent news since Tuesday, that you would all be aware of, is that the lockdown was extended two weeks until Friday 30 July. As a result, Remote Learning would continue until then.



Weeks 2 & 3 Learning/Teaching Timetable

In response to that announcement, the College has developed a timetable to continue to deliver the curriculum (in consultation with students, parents and staff) that will be better suited and meet the needs of members of our community over these next two weeks.

There is no perfect model/timetable - but I believe this one will best suit our community. This model will:

- Provide our Year 12 and Year 11 students time for a **full delivery** of the curriculum in preparation for the upcoming Trial HSC Exams (Year 12) and End of Preliminary Course Exams for Year 11.
- All subjects are covered for equity
- Provide flexibility for students and staff to transition from class to class, with suitable breaks, to avoid the constant online time
- A period (2.30pm 3pm) for those student(s) that need or wish to have additional assistance or time
 with individual teachers (or vice versa). This can be done by contacting the teacher directly via email or
 Google Classroom.

Social Justice - Vinnies Winter Sleepout - Get involved!

Over \$2,000 raised for Vinnies Winter Sleepout - Join us on Friday 30 July!

The Vinnies Winter Sleepout will go ahead - but differently! Despite the lockdown, over the holidays students have continued fundraising for the Winter Sleepout. Our St Leo's Team has raised \$2234.90 so far. The Lockdown now means we will have a home-based Sleepout.

Families might like to get involved - and pitch a tent in the backyard for a night out in solidarity with those on the margins in our society. Or students might get their parent's permission to sleep out - on their verandah, in the family car or even on the floor in the living room.

Rough sleeping on the streets is the most visible form of homelessness, but homelessness also includes people who couch surf from place to place, those in shelters and those sleeping in cars.

On the night there will be games, hear a speaker on homelessness and have small group discussions via Zoom, joining with students from St Peter's Catholic College Tuggerah, Mercy Catholic College Chatswood, and St Brigit's Catholic College Lake Munmorah who are also doing home based sleepouts that night. Well done to the students from the Leo's Social Justice League and our Vinnies School Conference for the effort they have put into the Winter Sleepout already.

The College will recognise and acknowledge the students involved in a small way (a limited-edition Leo's in Lockdown Beanie!) as this can be an event in which students can make a positive difference to the lives of others in our current lockdown time.
