



Letter No 5 - Covid-19 Update

20 July 2021

Dear St Leo's community,

I trust this letter finds you well and our young people are engaged in their learning, following the new timetable. Since my last communication the NSW Government has placed further Covid19 restrictions upon Greater Sydney. These increased restrictions do not really affect our day to day operations here at the College, except the number of staff on site has been greatly reduced and they are working from home. *Of course, the College is open and students are still welcome to attend and we will continue with the supervision.* We are averaging about 2-3% of students that require supervision per day. That figure is very similar across the CSBB Secondary schools.

Over the past two evenings I have phoned selected parents (parents/carers of students with birthdays) and the new timetable seems to be working well. If you have any feedback - please don't hesitate to contact me or any other staff member, or leave a message at College Reception on 9487 3555.



Intake 2021 to Year 11 Assessment Task Schedule

Over the next few days some College Staff will be working on a revised Assessment Task (AT) Schedule for students in Intake 2021 to Year 11.

We want to ensure that the revised AT schedule will:

- 1. Best support our students in their learning and ensure a fair workload
- 2. Best support our staff with respect to workload and due dates for reporting etc
- 3. Best support for our parents/carers (to ensure the health and well-being of all)
- 4. Avoid an unrealistic accumulation of ATs (eg in the last two weeks of Term III)
- 5. Adhere to protocols/guidelines from NESA
- 6. Ensure the learning/teaching cycle continues rather than a heavy weighting to the conduct and occurrence of ATs

This will be achieved by:

- 1. Possible rescheduling of listed ATs
- 2. Possible cancellation of some listed ATs
- 3. Possible reweighting of listed ATs
- 4. Creative thinking about the listed ATs

Part of the process will involve consultation with a selection of parents/carers and students.



The aim is to have a published revised schedule of Assessment Tasks by the end Friday 6 August (end of Week 4).



Student Daily Wellbeing Check-ins

Throughout the first week of home-based learning, students were invited to complete a daily wellbeing survey during Mentor classes. This has enabled the College to gain a good baseline on the mental health and overall wellbeing of our students.

In addition, it has also provided students with an opportunity to flag any major concerns with us, as well as give them an avenue to request a staff member to make contact with them (such as the College Counsellor or Year Leader). Overall, this has been well-received and completed by the vast majority of students.

As we progress through Week 2 of Home-Based Learning, we have moved to surveying students twice a week - on Tuesday and Thursday mornings during Mentor. Please flag this with your young person so they are aware that this support mechanism is still available. However, should a student need help or support outside of those days, they can still reach out to their Mentor, Year Leader, Case Manager or Classroom Teacher, via email or through Google Classroom. College Counsellor, Anne-Marie Newham, and Acting Director of Pastoral Care and Wellbeing, Nathan Smith are also available to assist students and parents/carers if required. So please do not hesitate to reach out for help if needed.

Finally, a reminder of the <u>Wellbeing Resource Pack</u> that we have put together which contains a range of resources to support young people (and their parents/carers) during this challenging time.



Year 12

Yesterday I sent a video from our CSBB Director, Mr Danny Casey to our Year 12 students and their parents/carers.

NESA has not released any further information than what I have previously updated to you. The *HSC Trials* are scheduled to commence here at the College (*The Light of Christ Centre*) on Monday 9th August. I would expect Year 12 students back here onsite on Monday 2nd August - Day 6, pending of course, NSW Government regulations.

We are mindful that the current COVID-19 lockdown may be impacting your ability to afford school fees

Catholic Schools Broken Bay would like to do what we can to assist any of our families in need during this time. In response to this current lockdown, we have **expanded our current COVID-19 Fee Support Program** to include additional support for parents/carers impacted financially due to the lockdown.

Under this program, where the income of one or both parents/carers has been reduced by at **least 20%** and current year fees were up to date prior to the lockdown (paid up until the end of May 2021), parents/carers will be eligible for a reduction on school fees due and payable in July and August.

Payments on the balance of fees will commence from Term 4, 2021.
