



## Letter No 10 - Covid-19 Update

9 August 2021

## Dear St Leo's Community,

Please keep in your prayers and thoughts, **Mr Daniel Lane and his family**. Mr Lane's wife (who is expecting their second child in October) was admitted to ICU last week with a severe illness. Mr Lane is now on Leave and I assured him of the College community's prayers and support.

On the weekend as the Men's and Women's Olympic Marathon competitors crossed the line, the expressions on their faces showed much relief and satisfaction. I saw similar expressions on our Year 12 students' faces at the Premier's announcement on Friday when we had our Year 12 Zoom Meeting - from both students and parents!

The announcement also provided greater direction for our staff in terms of upcoming work, duration and expectations for our students from Intake 2021 to Year 11.

There are still many unanswered questions but together, with a positive growth mindset and some prayers we will get through this as we have done in the past.

I have linked the <u>statement from Catholic Schools NSW</u>, that was released last Friday welcoming the Premier's announcement.

In response to the Premier's announcement - our Director of Schools, Mr Danny Casey has stated that this **Wednesday 11 August** has been approved as a **Staff Development Day for all CSBB Secondary Schools**. This will allow teachers to plan for assessments and future Home-Based Learning. It will also provide students with a well-being day away from screens. This time will ensure that teachers are able to continue to provide high quality learning experiences for all of our students.

St Leo's staff will be collaborating online with secondary teachers across the Diocese:

- designing, writing and preparing the notifications for the Year 12 alternative assessments, commencing the following Wednesday
- organising the arrangements around the format and content of the Year 11 End of Preliminary Course Assessments
- drafting and preparing the content and lessons for Intake 2021 to Yr 10 for the remainder of this term Wednesday will be a chance for our students:
  - ★ for some down time from screens
  - ★ to consolidate on what has been taught over the past 4 and a half weeks
  - ★ to catch up if there is any glaringly obvious missed work
  - ★ to relax and ensure some exercise

From this week onwards (Week 5), we will move to surveying students **weekly** on Tuesday mornings during their regular Zoom mentor classes. This is so we can continue to monitor and support students who need assistance. The link that students need to access to complete the wellbeing check-in is on their respective year group pastoral pages.

Of course if a student is in need of pastoral help and support, they can reach out at any time to their **Mentor Teacher**, **Learning Support Case Manager**, **Year Leader**, **College Counsellor <u>Mrs Anne-Marie Newham</u>**, or **Director of Pastoral Care and Wellbeing <u>Mr Nathan Smith</u> at any time. Our <u>Wellbeing Resource Pack</u> (2nd <b>Ed**) has also been updated and has a large range of resources and tools that can be useful in helping maintain positive mental health.
