Assessments & Reporting

Our **Year 12** students commence their Home Based Alternative Assessment Tasks on Wednesday. These Alternative Tasks go for a two week period.

Express Post parcels with papers and a care pack were sent to all Year 12 students on Wednesday, so most should have received them by today. If you have not, please advise Mrs Todd asap.

The **Year 11** students will follow a similar style of alternative tasks for their End of Preliminary assessments at the end of Week 9 and Week 10.

Years 10 to Intake 2021 (Year 7) continue with their Home Based Learning and are undergoing modified assessment tasks that will align with their Term IV Assessment Tasks to ensure that continuity and learning continues whether the delivery of the curriculum is home based or face to face.

We are also modifying our **Term III Interim Reports**. These "snapshot" style reports **currently** gauge learning, in regards to



- Commitment to achieving personal best
- Conduct behaviour
- Constructive involvement in classwork
- Level of organisation

It makes little sense to continue with this current report in its present format. *Instead*, students will be assessed on criteria based on our Home Based Learning model. All parents/carers will receive Interim Reports for students in Years 11 - Intake 2021 (Year 7) in **Week 10** of this Term.

I would particularly like to thank the staff for all the preparation work they completed last Wednesday (Student Free Day) in order to maximise the learning of our young people.

Year 12 Update

In addition to the guidelines around these upcoming Alternative Assessments (sent home in the past few days in your *Information & Care*

Packs) and NESA pushing back the start of the HSC Exams, NESA is now permitting teachers to submit marks for the following HSC Performances and Language oral exams: *Dance Core Performance; Dance Core Composition; Dance Major Study Performance; Dance Major Study Composition; Dance*





Major Study Dance and Technology; Drama Group Performance; Drama Individual Project: performance; Music Performance (all courses); Music Viva Voce (Music 1); Sight singing (Music 2) and Languages Speaking Skills (all courses).

To ensure equity, teachers' marks will be moderated by NESA against the externally marked components of the course.

After speaking with some of the students, some are naturally disappointed that they are unable to perform their various pieces (Music, Drama and Dance) but equally so some students are very satisfied with this decision and course of action.

A reminder that Year 12 have the opportunity to attend group study sessions viaZoom from 2.40- 3.30pm each Monday and Wednesday. Staff from a variety of faculty areas have offered to be available to help students if they have any questions.
