# **RU OK? Day**

# 'Return to Campus' Update

Over the past few days, the various authorities have given some details about the planned return to school dates. The College Leadership Team (Senior and Middle Leaders) are currently working through what the *Return to School* will look, feel and sound like for our students. Most will be coming back into what is normally a highly regulated environment (uniforms, longer learning periods, less movement (as



in a "classroom seated" environment) and not just getting up to go to the fridge, play with the dog etc. Our overarching principles are:

- 1) Students reconnecting with their peers
- 2) Students and their teachers reconnecting
- 3) Students reconnecting with the College (other students and the school environment)
- 4) Ensuring <u>essential outcomes</u> are taught with as much as activity as possible (as opposed to theory that has been covered in HBL)

Reconnecting activities is a primary focus of this group, balanced with a good understanding that students still need to achieve their academics in school. We will be consulting with the Student Leaders and SRC as well.

Currently the students will be returning to the College *FROM* the following dates:

Intake 2021 (Year 7) - Monday 8 November

Year 8 - Monday 8 November

Year 9 - Monday 8 November

Year 10 - Monday 8 November

Year 11 - Monday 1 November

Year 12 - Monday 25 October

When we return to school currently we will be operating under <u>Level 3 plus conditions</u>. This will mean a staggered return from Intake 2021 to Year 10. However this may change depending on NSW Health Advice as we move closer to these dates.

# **Diocesan Meeting - Year 12 Student Leaders**

Yesterday I had the pleasure of attending a Zoom meeting with representatives from the secondary student leaders across the eight CSBB secondary schools along with **Bishop Anthony Randazzo** and the Director of Schools, **Mr Danny Casey**. The students gave honest and heartfelt comments about how they are feeling and the support they have received from each other and the schools. The eight schools have been a great source of comfort and support for the Year 12 students across the Diocese. The Bishop said he keeps the students in his daily prayers as well as the high level meetings both he and Danny Casey participate in regularly with statutory educational bodies.

Congratulations to our Year 12s for successfully completing their online Alternative Trial Assessments. They have shown amazing resilience in adapting to these challenging times and maintaining their composure with so many outside pressures on their shoulders.



As we approach the holiday break, they may like to:

- 1) search for an apprenticeship
- 2) take another look at university early entry opportunities or
- 3) consider available further training could prove beneficial.

For example, Macquarie University have reopened their early entry offer program and are offering five COVID-19 Impact Points to boost selection ranks, or ACU Guarantee program offers students a maximum of five adjustment points for students who attend schools that are in their Schools Relationship program, of which St Leo's is. Or they might consider working up in the Pilbara a good option at the moment.

Please encourage them to take some time to relook at where their next step could be via the APPRENTICESHIP AND UNIVERSITIES INFORMATION DOCUMENT, or call Ms Tynan to discuss for further advice. One of these steps could take away a fair amount of stress.
