


Return to School Update (Survey Feedback)

Thank you to those **415** *people* who kindly responded to the survey I distributed last Friday evening. We wanted to ensure that you had an opportunity to let us know your intentions and concerns around the return to school. For transparency and interest, here is the feedback from the survey:

Q1) When the College returns to face-to-face delivery of the curriculum, my child/ren:


415 responses



Q2 - Which of the following best describes your level of concern regarding return to school?

- **53%** of respondents were concerned about the return to school, however believed that the College will do all it can to keep their child/children safe.
- 40% of respondents were not worried about the return to school and believed the College would be as safe as possible for their children.
- **3%** were concerned about the return to school and that the College would not be able to keep their child/children safe.
- A further **4%** gave a variety of answers with concerns around public transport, level of vaccinations, whole community responsibilities etc.


Q2) Which of the following best describes your level of concern regarding return to school? 415 responses

As I have already alluded to, the theme of our plan is *Safety, Wellbeing and Learning*. It will incorporate details of what students will be required to do prior to coming to school, once here on site and arrangements for pick up/transport at the end of the day.

Year 12 (2021) & HSC Update

As our Year 12 (2021) students move into Zone Three of their 5-stage journey to their HSC, we keep them in our prayers and thoughts. We will be welcoming them back to the College on Monday week - 18 October. There will be opportunities for them to reconnect with their peers, the staff and the College. There will also be an



opportunity for students to practice past papers in preparation for the HSC on Friday 15th October and Friday 22nd October - there will be both AM and PM sessions. A letter will be sent next week outlining *Zone Three Return* for Year 12 students.

One of our College Leadership Team will check in with each individual student via Zoom or phone call to connect, mentor and discuss how we can best support each student for the remainder of their St Leo's journey. No classes will be scheduled for Year 12 on this day.

Years 10 and Yr 12 (2022) Retreats

As per the CSNSW (Catholic School NSW) Roadmap - the **Years 10 and Yr 12 (2022) Retreats** that were listed at *The Tops Conference Centre* later this term have had to be cancelled and will not be able to be held. Any monies paid for these activities will be adjusted on your next school fee statement. It is envisaged that our regular Retreat and Camp program can resume in 2022.

Summer Uniforms & the end of our Transition Period

As we prepare to return to campus, parents are no doubt checking uniforms. A reminder that students will be in **summer uniforms** but also that this is the final Term of our three year transition period into the 'new' uniform. This means that **from the start of Term I 2022**, **all year groups should be in the new uniform** - Intake 2022 to Year 9 in junior uniforms and Years 10-12 in senior uniforms.

Second hand 'old uniform' items will shortly be removed from <u>sustainableschoolshop.com.au</u>, although second hand 'new uniform' items will continue to be available. The Uniform Exchange no longer sells second hand St Leo's uniforms.

With the end of the transition period in mind as well as the current circumstances, we are conscious that some students (mainly Year 9) may no longer have particular items, so will allow these students to return to campus in their sports uniforms if necessary for the remainder of the Term.
