Dear St Leo's Community,


We are excited to welcome students back next week, making this our last *Leo's in Lockdown* newsletter. From next week, we will return to our regular *Lion Roars* publication and confirm calendar dates for the end of 2021 and start of 2022.

Return to Campus - Monday 25 October!

This week we sent out our detailed <u>Return to Campus Safety Plan</u> to all students and parents. It outlines the procedures we have in place for students and staff to safely return to face-to-face learning from next week.

Please take the time to read through the plan and **ensure students are familiar with the procedures**, particularly relating to:

- wearing masks
- arrival and departure, including staggered finish times
- moving between classes, and
- designated zones for each Year Group (see map below)





Also, as part of the return to campus, please not the following important points:

- there will be <u>NO</u> canteen on-site for all of Term 4: please make sure that your son or daughter has enough *food* and *drink/water* with them each day. There is a filtered water station where bottles can be refilled. This is located outside the Mary MacKillop Centre (near the Art Rooms).
- Students will not be able to access lockers during Term 4: but if your young person requires the use of a locker, please direct them to see their Year Leader.
- Students are able to wear their college sports uniform to and from school on their PD/H/PE prac days or when they have sport.

Week 4 Timetable & Bell Times

With the return to campus next week, we will **resume regular timetable**, **periods and <u>bell times</u>**. Please encourage your son or daughter to check their Compass timetable.

Week 4 Reconnection Activities

Although we resume with our regular timetable from Monday, we see it as vital we take the time to focus on student wellbeing upon a return to campus so that they are able to *Rebuild*, *Reconnect* and *Restore*.

Students from Intake 2021 to Year 12 (2022) will participate in a range of '*Reconnection Activities*'. The general schedule for these activities includes:

Due to students returning to campus next week, the Information Evening for Year 12 2022 students and their parents/carers will be rescheduled to **Tuesday 9 November** (via Zoom). More information will be provided next week.



Reminder: School Opal Card Applications for 2022

Students who need a new School Opal card or travel pass for 2022 should apply now.

A new application needs to be submitted if students **change address**, **school**, **have repeated a year**, **received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW** or their situation has changed regarding a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody). They should <u>renew or update</u> details **before the end of Term 4** to ensure applications are endorsed and current entitlements updated in time. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade, the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Reminder: Summer Uniforms & the end of our Transition Period

Students return to campus in **summer uniforms** next week. This is the final Term of our three year transition period into the 'new' uniform, so that **from the start of Term I 2022**, **all year groups will be in the new uniform** - Intake 2022 to Year 9 in junior uniforms and Years 10-12 in senior uniforms.

Due to Covid restrictions, appointments currently need to be made with Cowan & Lewis for new uniform fittings. Please <u>contact them</u> directly.

For second hand uniforms, there are a number of both 'new' and 'old' uniform items for sale online via <u>sustainableschoolshop.com.au.</u> There is no charge to search or purchase items on this site and a small fee to sell. 'Old uniform' items will be removed by the end of the year. The Uniform Exchange no longer sells second hand St Leo's uniforms.

With the end of the transition period in mind and given the current circumstances, we are conscious that some students (mainly Year 9) may no longer have particular items, so will allow these students to return to campus in their sports uniforms if necessary for the remainder of the term.
