Earth Care Summit

This week, 11 students from the Year 8 Social Justice League participated in the 2021 Earthcare Youth Summit that was run by Catholic Earthcare Australia and students from Mount St Benedict's College. They joined virtually with over 200 other students from Catholic, independent and public schools to hear from speakers about environmental issues as well as to share ideas about what they as school students can do to make a difference.

"From Little Things Big Things Grow was the topic of this year's summit. It not only allowed us to share but to learn and take influence about what things other schools do to help the environment. We gained insight from activists from Kiribati. The main thing I took away from this summit was the people who contribute least to global warming are the same people that are affected most."

Cyber-bullying - Staying Safe Online

Despite our young people having settled back to on-campus learning very well, the identity and connections they have formed online remain incredibly important to them. Nationally, research and expert opinion suggest there has been a spike in online bullying (and other social media related problems) since school-aged students have returned to the classroom. The reason for this is being put down to young people trying to assert and re-establish themselves in social groups and *pecking orders*. It is often easier for them to do this either behind a keyboard or on a social media platform (such as Tik Tok). As such, the ramifications are significant and both families and schools are having to manage the fallout.

Every bullying incident is different as there are a range of factors that influence them. At St Leo's, we aim to provide an environment that is free from bullying where all students are respectful and tolerant of others. We, at times, do not always get it right but have a number of different management processes and intervention strategies that we use when managing a reported matter.

We often hear, however, that parents are at a loss as to how they can best help their child when it comes to staying safe online. There are a wide range of resources and tools for parents to read and access that can be of benefit.
