Uniform and Grooming

Now that the students have successfully returned from Home Based Learning, we would like to remind you that all students are expected to be dressed in full Summer uniform and appropriately groomed for the remainder of the Term.

This will allow disadvantaged people on the Central Coast to access free meals and hot drinks every night. The **Jesuit Refugee Service, or JRS**, accompanies, serves, and advocates for the rights of refugees and other forcibly displaced persons. Their work is extremely valuable and relevant to our world today. During lockdown, JRS was feeding a thousand people each week from their foodbank which has been sorely depleted.



This year, St Leo's is organising **shopping bag hampers for the Christmas appeal**. Anything and everything you can give is greatly appreciated by both the school and those who will receive your donations. Sometimes, little things like knowing there is food in the cupboard on Christmas morning can make a big difference to a person's wellbeing.
