Acting Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Carers,

Laudato Si

This week has been named *Laudato Si* week in recognition of **Pope Francis'** significant papal encyclical calling for action to protect our natural environment. Laudato Si is a call for action on climate change and for an end to the ruthless exploitation of our planet's resources. Pope Francis is asking for global action but his call is also one that should resonate with us as individuals – asking us how we can be better stewards of our environment.



This is the message that students in the **Environment Group** presented to our community during our whole school assembly on Wednesday, calling on their fellow students to make better choices about what they do with their rubbish. The Environment Group made a short film highlighting the threats that plastic wrapping and items pose to native wildlife as colourful shiny items can be attractive to birdlife and cause significant harm when ingested. This message is an important one, calling on our community to use waste bins provided and aim for rubbish-free lunches that use reusable containers.

St Leo's Pride Medallions

Our Whole College Assembly was also an opportunity to celebrate the achievements of students who have consistently made positive contributions to our school community and achieved personal development in a range of our St Leo's Growth Domains. Especially significant was the presentation of **St** Leo's Pride Medallions



that recognise students who have attained over 90 merits. The recipients have demonstrated behaviours and attitudes that not only bring them personal reward but also help form a positive learning culture at St Leo's.

Industry Partnerships and Pathways

Another element of fostering a positive learning culture is providing students with opportunities to consider how their learning at school will allow them to achieve their dreams and aspirations after they graduate from St Leo's. Considering the rapidly changing world of work and the ever-growing array of post-school options for students, during our staff professional development time on Tuesday, we took time to consider how students develop a greater understanding of





how their learning at school will prepare them for the world of study and work beyond the school gates.

Our leader of Pathways and Partnerships, **Justin Slowey**, **Phil Cox** from Catholic Schools Broken Bay (CSBB) and **Stephen Ryan** from the Department of Education's Regional Industry Education Partnerships (RIEP) discussed a range of ways that they could work with our teachers to provide students with opportunities to learn more about the career pathways and broaden students' understanding of what a 21st century career looks like. The energy in the room was palpable as

teachers shared ideas of the partnerships that could be built with industry and other organisations to enrich student learning experiences in all the Key Learning Areas.

Community and Connection

As we listened to students discuss their commitment to care for our natural environment, publicly recognised the achievements of students through the Growth Domain awards, and connected with each other as educators sharing ideas to improve student learning and engagement, it provided a moment to reflect on the importance of gathering together as a community. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, we often took this time for granted. One positive side-effect of the pandemic is that it has enabled us to value the moments of human connection that we were not able to access because of lockdowns and public health orders. Whether it be a whole school assembly or Friday lunch time Mass, schools are made of these moments of shared experiences, moments where we recognise that we are part of something much bigger than ourselves. These moments are mirrored in classrooms all around St Leo's, where students and teachers are developing the relationships that will allow for support,

challenge and inspiration. In a busy week it was definitely worth reflecting on the rich and varied nature of our St Leo's community and how grateful and privileged we are to be a part of it.

Reconciliation Week Activities

On Monday morning on Muru Mittigar, we will hold a short ceremony marking Reconciliation Week (27 May - 3 June). At this ceremony, we will officially open our **Reconciliation Art Garden** by unveiling a plaque acknowledging the local Darug and Guringai people as the traditional custodians of our lands.

At this time we will also recognise the work of local Darug artist, **Leanne** '**Mulgo' Watson**, whose artwork is featured on our new shade sails. The theme for Reconciliation Week this year is '**Be brave. Make change'**, which of course closely aligns to our theme '**Have courage. Do not be afraid'**, calling on us all to be active participants in the reconciliation process with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. We will also launch an art competition for the garden that all students will be invited to participate in along with a range of other activities during the week.

Bread Tags for Wheelchairs

The Social Justice League is inviting our St Leo's Community to support the **Bread Tags** for Wheelchairs charity.



Year 11 Food Technology

Assessment Task 2: Lemon Meringue Pie. This task examined the characteristics of food properties.





They collect the plastic bread tags you find on loaves or buns from Woolies or Coles and send them to a recycling centre, that pays them per kilo, turning the bread tags into craft and practical products like bowls, doorknobs, etc.

The money collected from the recycling is then used to purchase wheelchairs and other assistance equipment for predominantly people in South Africa who have less access and general accessibility to support services for the physically disabled.



Please save plastic bread tags (no cardboard ones) and any other plastic tags you have at home, e.g. from potato bags, carrot bags etc.

These will be collected in Mentor or can be left in a jar at Reception.

This is a simple but effective way that we can help others.

Padlocks for Lockers

We are again experiencing a run of locks needing to be cut off lockers!

We remind you that we **recommend students use KEYED padlocks** for their lockers and **give the spare key to their Year Coordinator or Mentor Teacher**. Placing locker keys on a **large or highly visible keyring or lanyard** also increases the chances of lost keys being easily and quickly found and handed in before locks need to be cut off.



Combination locks are NOT recommended as students regularly change and forget their codes, meaning the padlock must then be cut off and replaced.

A medium-sized keyed padlock (20-40mm, minimum 10mm) is recommended with the **tagged and labelled spare** key for their Year Leader or Mentor Teacher.



Lost Property – Please label EVERYTHING!

A large amount of student property is also currently being lost. Most are found, but unfortunately, the majority are not labelled and cannot be returned to their owners!

Please ensure all student property – from jumpers to Air Pods - is **clearly labelled with their name** so we can return the item.

Our Reception and Student Services staff do their absolute best to contact students when labelled items are found. Unlabelled items are placed in the **lost property boxes in Xavier Court**, outside the ARC.
