A Holistic Education – Camps and Retreats

St Leo's works to provide a holistic education that allows students to grow and flourish, using their God-given gifts to grow and learn so that they can make meaningful and positive contributions to the community. These past two weeks we have truly seen this in action with students and teachers involved in a range of learning experiences here at the College and at camps and retreats. These experiences provide an opportunity for our students to embrace challenge, whether it be camping at Colo River sleeping in tents or taking on the spiritual challenge of Year 11 retreat, where our students are challenged to engage with Christ's message as they move into adulthood.

The experiences of camps and retreats provide significant learning opportunities. This kind of learning cannot be documented in a report or be given a grade, but it is the kind of learning that can make a real difference as our students navigate the waters of adolescence. Learning to be adaptable, to deal with unfamiliar environments and cope with possible homesickness are all lessons that provide the building blocks to take on the world beyond the school gates.

This learning is not without its difficulties, particularly for current students who have been at the forefront of the COVID-19 experience, dealing with lockdowns and home-based learning over the last few years. These students have missed out on so many experiences as a result of COVID and this has undoubtedly had an impact upon them. For this reason, these camps and retreats have been a particular focus this year, giving students the opportunity to share time with their peers in new and sometimes challenging environments and providing them with time to grow in their relationships away from the distractions of technology and the online world.

NAPLAN

This week also saw Years 7 and 9 take on the challenge of the NAPLAN tests. NAPLAN testing was cancelled in 2020 so these groups have not engaged with the tests for four years. NAPLAN is a valuable opportunity for

schools to gain learning data about their students. It is above all a diagnostic test that looks to provide teachers with information about how to support students in engaging with their learning and achieving growth.

It is **not** a test that is passed or failed, and it also **not** one that should drive teaching and learning. NAPLAN gives teachers data about how students are developing key skills, It does **not** measure how students are applying themselves in class, how they are developing skills of creativity and critical thinking, or if they are passionately committed to excellence in a particular field like music, drama or art. NAPLAN should therefore really be seen as an opportunity to deal with a more formal examination experience and develop the resilience and the capacity to cope with more stressful situations.

NAPLAN results are usually received late in Term 3 or early Term 4, and comprehensive NAPLAN reports are provided to parents by ACARA, the body with responsibility for delivering and marking the tests. We will provide parents with more information about NAPLAN results later in the year.

Student Policies

Revised Mobile Phone and Device Policy - Update

As you would be aware, the College recently introduced a revised Mobile Phone and Device Policy to address the ongoing concern around inappropriate phone/device usage during the school day, as well as to better assist with developing positive, interpersonal relationships between students.



Since implementation, we have seen a significant decline in the number of phones and devices that have been confiscated due to unnecessary access. We are very pleased to report that 7-12 students are more actively talking with each other and establishing more productive one-on-one connections.

The wellbeing of our students is a priority at St Leo's and this adjustment to students' mobile phone-device usage is proving to be an effective measure in responding to developing peer/staff relations and improving overall student wellbeing. The revised policy can be viewed here.

Uniform & Grooming Expectations - Reminder

A reminder that all students are expected to be dressed in full Winter uniform for Terms 2-3, including wearing their blazer to and from the College. Students who have scheduled PDHPE/Sport (Stages 4-5) or PASS (Stage 6) may wear their sports uniform/tracksuit.

Year 12 may wear their Year 12 jersey and/or blazer to and from the College. However, for official ceremonies such as College Masses and whole school assemblies, all students are expected to wear their blazer. If students have a uniform/grooming issue, they should see their Year Leader in the Pastoral Office (Xavier Court) to obtain a uniform pass. It is expected that relevant students have a signed parent/carer note to present to their Year Leader for consideration.

Amendment Regarding Earrings - Effective Monday, 16 May (Week 4)

After recent discussions and feedback with students and staff, the uniform/grooming requirement around earrings will be standardised for both boys and girls, allowing 'one small stud or sleeper, at most, may be worn in each ear lobe.' This adjustment will be in effect from next Monday, 16 May (Week 4).

Student Procedures

Late to School Procedures - Revised Adjustment

In response to improving student attendance in line with the Catholic Schools Broken Bay <u>Learning Everyday Counts</u> initiative, students are expected to arrive at the College no later than 8:30am so that they are ready to start the day with Mentor period.

A number of Year 7-12 students have been arriving late with no valid reason. This late arrival is classified as 'Unexplained' unless a signed,



hard copy parent/carer note is produced and/or a Compass entry is noted the Parent Portal. Students who arrive late without a valid reason will now a **receive a demerit** and, if three demerits are accrued over the Term, it will equate to a Reflective Growth Intervention (RGI) being generated and electronically communicated to respective parents/carers.

However, if late students produce a hard copy note the next day to **Mrs Raso** (Student Services), the demerit will be removed. We would appreciate it if parents/carers remind their young person(s) of their responsibility to be punctual every day so that they are maximising their learning opportunities.

Compass Merit Awards - Update

It is wonderful to see so many students who have achieved a Purple (10 merits), Gold (30 Merits) and/or St Leo's Medallion (90 merits) this year based on the College's six Growth Domains (see *list in the Acting Principal's Report p.2*)

Purple Merits are awarded each week to students by Mentors and Year Leaders, and Gold/St Leo's Medallion recipients will receive their certificate/medal at official College assemblies.

Parents/carers can view awards and other important information including attendance on the Compass Portal.


