Acting Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Carers,

As many in our school community continue to be affected by COVID and influenza, it is a testament to the commitment of our staff that so many events that enrich students' learning and wellbeing have continued.



Subject Selections and Future Careers



On Tuesday evening we hosted an online **Information Evening for Year 10** parents about the process of selecting courses for senior study. This is an exciting time for students and their families as they start to dream about what their futures beyond the gates of St Leo's might look like. This excitement is amplified in 2022 when there are an ever- increasing array of pathways that can enable students to reach their potential. Education and career paths are no longer linear, and it is likely that this generation of young people will engage in several different careers growing their skills and expertise as they progress.

This can also be a daunting time; many students have not even begun to think about what career area might interest them. To support students, we have provided each of our Year 10s with the opportunity to engage with the **Morrisby career tool**. This tool involves an extensive online assessment of aptitudes and interests resulting in a Morrisby profile that provides students with a range of career fields and education pathways that match their responses. Morrisby is not meant to tell students what careers they should pursue, but more to provide them with the opportunity to reflect upon how they might allow their own skills and interests to guide them into fulfilling and challenging work.

Another event that will further support students in deciding their subject preferences for senior study is the **Careers Expo** this Tuesday, June 14 here at St Leo's. This event will provide students and their families with the opportunity to engage with a range of post-school options including **universities**, **private colleges**, **TAFE**, **trade and apprenticeship providers and employers**. An expo like this can provide opportunities for lifechanging conversations and we encourage students and their families to attend, particularly if they are in Years 9-12.

It does seem particularly appropriate that this process is occurring the week after Pentecost when, as Catholics, we reflected on the power of the Holy Spirit to guide us to do God's work. As a Catholic school, we are always looking for opportunities to further engage our students with the practical application of their faith and this is as relevant when choosing a career pathway as it is in the playground. It is incumbent on all of us to consider how we can use our God-given gifts to contribute to our communities and make a better world for all.

Many of these ideas were also addressed this week for all students during our extended mentor period when students participated in a period of reflection about their character strengths (using the via character survey) allowing them to consider what they need to further develop to become more successful learners. Reflection and self-evaluation are important tools for all students to develop an understanding of their own strengths and challenges. Once we know ourselves as learners, the next step is then to take risks and attempt to solve problems or accomplish tasks that we find difficult rather than developing a closed mindset about things we might not be 'good' at. We look forward to continued work with students allowing them to consider how they can become more purpose-filled, reflective, and responsible learners so that they can grow and improve as learners.

On another note, after a week away from my desk with COVID I am looking forward to being back on site with our wonderful school community. I will also take this opportunity to wish all students and parents and carers a fun and restful long weekend.


Student Wellbeing


What's been Happening?

Using Models in Science – An Important Scientific Skill

Over the past few weeks, Year 7 and Year 9 students have been making models to help them understand more about the topics they are investigating. Constructing a model is a great scientific skill – in fact, scientists constantly make and use models to help them understand the world around them.

Last week, Year 7 were busy making model plant and animal cells. This required the students to examine diagrams of these building blocks of life very closely. Some of the models were outstanding – they were so good they could easily be used as learning aides.

This fantastic plant cell model was constructed by Charlotte K, Isobel O'H, Lucy W and Zoe M.




Rebecca C, Tobias J and Nina S took their mode the next dimension by making this 3-D animal cell.




Recently, Year 9 have been learning about the nervous system and its importance in controlling and coordinating the body. In particular, they examined two types of neurons (nerve cells): motor neurons and sensory neurons. Again, the students were put to work modelling these cells. The students then had to assess their models, pointing out the strengths and weakness in their designs.

Why the focus on modelling? As you may be aware, the HSC Science syllabi underwent an upgrade a few years ago to make them more skills based. One of the key inclusions in this rewrite included the importance of

modelling in science. The Science Faculty is therefore massaging the junior topics to include more skills to help our students better prepare for their senior years.

Mathematics Help Desk – Thursday mornings

As we head towards Term 2 assessments for Year 7- 12, a reminder that our Maths Help Desk is held each Thursday morning before school from 7.30m, in room **BHG01**. It would be great to see as many students as possible attending these additional maths help sessions.

Padlocks for Lockers

We continue to experience many locks needing to be cut off lockers!

We remind you that we **recommend students use KEYED padlocks** for their lockers and **give** the spare key to their Year Coordinator or Mentor Teacher. Placing locker keys on a large or highly visible keyring or lanyard also increases the chances of lost keys being easily and quickly found and handed in before locks need to be cut off.



Combination locks are NOT recommended as students regularly change and forget their codes, meaning the padlock must then be cut off and replaced.



A medium-sized keyed padlock (20-40mm, minimum 10mm) is recommended with the **tagged and labelled spare** key for their Year Leader or Mentor Teacher.



Lost Property – Please label EVERYTHING!

A large amount of student property is also currently being lost. Most are found, but unfortunately, the majority are not labelled and cannot be returned to their owners!

Please ensure all student property – from jumpers to Air Pods - is **clearly labelled with their name** so we can return the item.

Our Reception and Student Services staff do their absolute best to contact students when labelled items are found. Unlabelled items are placed in the **lost property boxes in Xavier Court**, outside the ARC.
































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
