College Co-curricular Activities

As always, the College has been very busy with co-curricular activities for the start of term. Well done to our **Student Leaders** and the **Vinnies Conference** team along with **Rev Adrian Gomez** who launched the Vinnies Winter Appeal this week with a mufti day and sold-out BBQ lunch. This leads up to own **Vinnies Winter Sleepout**, which will again raise awareness and funds to end homelessness by students 'sleeping rough'. Last year our sleepout at home during lockdown raised over an astonishing \$22,000, making us the top fundraising school in the state! We hope you will support this initiative again this year. On Wednesday afternoon, the College conducted a **Year 12 Afternoon Study Group** in the Aquinas Resource Centre. It was supported by many teachers who gave of their time to assist the Year 12 students in their final preparation (and to soothe any nerves) for the upcoming Trial HSC Exams. Thank you to the staff who assisted, in particular **Ms Megan De Kantzow** (Leader of Information Resources) and **Ms Megan Tynan** (Leader of Year 12) who initiated and implemented the idea.





This week I also attended **'Transcend'**, our **Senior Dance and Drama Showcase** in the Flora MacKillop Theatre. Participants were supported by many of their peers as well as their families. It was superb to see our students in a space that was built for that exact purpose. The quality of the items was fantastic, and students revelled in being able to display and perform their many talents. Well done to everyone involved and many thanks to **Ms Brittany Skea** for her wonderful organisation. (See p.9)

Ms Skea also coordinated over 70 of our co-curricular Dance students to compete at the **City of Ryde Dance Eisteddfod**. The competitors did themselves, their families,

coaches and the College proud, with two ensembles even coming away with Highly Commended awards. More on p.8.

Three of our vocal ensembles participated in the **City of Ryde Vocal Eisteddfod** yesterday, under the tutelage of **Ms Fiona Milkins** and **Mr Vince Tavernese**. Congratulations to our **Male Vocal Group** (*right*) who won their category, and our **Cubs Singers** (Year 7) and **Lions Singers** - both Highly Commended. Well done to you all!



COVID-Smart Update

The College has received another shipment of '**RAT tests**' which will be distributed to students next week in Mentor classes. With the recent surge in cases across the community, the College is continuing to do all we can to be COVIS-Smart, including increased ventilation, sanitisation stations and continued daily hygienist services throughout the campus. Please remind your young people that **masks on public transport** are still required.

The future is bright – for enrolments!

Enrolment numbers at St Leo's have never looked better. A steady stream of new students in all year groups have starting throughout the year and we are now at capacity!

For Year 7 next year (2023), we reached our cap of just over 200 quite some time ago and now have a waitlist of nearly 70, while 2024 is already 75% full with students from our Priority Feeder Schools, who receive a guaranteed offer within certain enrolment windows. Demand is so high that we have even received several enrolments for 2032!

Our Mobile Phone Policy sets an example

Our revised *Mobile Phone and Device Policy* restricting student use of devices during school time continues to be successful, with students notably spending less time focussed on their screens and more time interacting – particularly at lunchtime and recess.

Parents have generally applauded the changes and we have even been acknowledged for our initiative as part of an <u>article</u> and <u>petition</u> by North Shore Mums calling for the Minister Sarah Mitchell and the Department of Education to create a consistent mobile phone policy for usage at secondary school. This petition has had over 20,000 signatures and hundreds of comments from parents.

And just finally, I have very much appreciated the concern and well wishes you have offered since my return last Monday week - from the written thoughts expressed at the Year 11 Retreat to all the emails and notes throughout Term 2. Simply put, it does mean a great deal to me. I keep you all in my daily (now twice a day) prayers.

Year 7 Bible Presentation

Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On Monday, 15 August, as Catholics we celebrate the Feast Day of the Assumption of Our Lady when the Holy Mother, 'having completed her course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory'.

This is a Holy Day of Obligation and Catholics are expected to attend Mass on this day. In pre-COVID times, St Leo's joined with Cathedral parishioners and Our Lady of the Rosary Primary School to celebrate Mass on this day. This was suspended in 2020 and 2021 due to COVID. It has been decided that, due to the resurgence of the virus, a full school Mass will not be held, and we instead encourage families to attend Mass at their local parish either before school or in the evening. Year 7 Laudato Si Excursion to West Head

A reminder for our Year 7 families, we will be embarking on an excursion to West Head National Park to celebrate and engage in God's Creation next week on Wednesday, 3 August.

Year 7 students are to wear their sports uniform and carry a satchel for the day. It is recommended that students bring their recess, water, and something to sit on, such as a small towel or picnic blanket for the day. We will depart from The LOCC at 8:30am. Details of the excursion are outlined on the <u>permission slip</u> which must be signed and returned for students to attend the excursion.

Religious Creative Arts Competition for Art, Music, Dance, Drama or Film!

The **Bishop's Art Prize** competition is a well-established event at Catholic Schools Broken Bay that has been running for the past nine years. In 2022, the art prize competition has been re-imagined. Open to all CSBB school students from Kindergarten **to Year 10**, it is now called the '**Religious Creative Arts Competition**', and includes five categories: **Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music,** or **Short Film.**

One of the key elements of the competition is how students demonstrate their understanding of and connection to the theme. In 2022 the theme is one of CSBB's core values, **COURAGE** - 'Be strong and courageous..., for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go' (Joshua 1:9) – which of course is also our St Leo's theme this year.

Students are required to link their creative piece directly to the religious theme of **courage** by answering the question: 'How is this theme lived out or demonstrated today?' Thus, as well as creating an artwork, short film, dance, drama or music piece, students need to write a short explanation of their work *(maximum word count 150 words)* to outline how it connects to the theme of courage.

Artworks are to be handed in to schools by Week 5 of Term 3 - Monday, August 15.

Local judging will take place followed by a selection of finalists. These finalists will then be featured at the **CSBB Showcase Night** to be held at the Light of Christ Centre on 18 October.

During the **Year 12 Study Afternoon Tea** this week, over thirty students worked with senior teaching staff to prepare for their HSC Trials using a variety of past papers. Students appreciated the time looking at whole papers, timing, and drawing together their skills and knowledge.

This Term, **Year 7 and 8 English** have a focus on 'wide reading' for enjoyment and developing skills in sustained, deep reading. Each class will be visiting the library once a fortnight and students keep a reading journal as they progress. The library reading will complement their classwork on novels, with Year 7 focussing on reading more widely, and Year 8 looking at historical fiction.

Don't forget, all students have access to our extensive **online library of eBooks and audiobooks** through <u>Wheelers.co</u>. Students simply use their St Leo's single sign-on for access.

The **Premier's Reading Challenge 2022** finishes on **August 19**. All books read must be logged so Mrs de Kantzow can validate the reading record. Well done to our keen readers. Most students who entered have now completed their challenge for this year!

Our **Chess Club** will shortly be starting up a new **Wednesday lunchtime competition** in the ARC - details in the library soon. New books (e.g., How to beat your dad at chess!) are available to hone students' strategies.

Vinnies Winter Sleepout

The St Leo's **Vinnies Winter Sleepout** for students will be held from **6pm Friday 12 August to 7am Saturday morning**, raising awareness and money to support the work of the St Vincent de Paul Society in the area of homelessness.

Last year, during lockdown, this was an incredibly successful event, with students sleeping out in their backyards raising over \$22,000 - making us the



top fundraising school in NSW. This year we will be gathering at the College for a more traditional school Winter Sleepout. Students from all year groups are invited to participate.

The School Sleepout allows students to connect with the issue of homelessness on a personal level by experiencing, in a small way, what it means not to have a comfortable bed at night, while fundraising for Vinnies through the <u>St Leo's sponsorship page</u>.

The evening will include activities designed to break open the issue of homelessness, a Vinnies presentation about homelessness, and simulated homeless experience by 'sleeping rough' in a controlled environment. Participants will be monitored by both male and female staff, and a security guard will also be hired overnight as an extra precaution.

Dinner and breakfast will be provided, and they will be required to bring a pillow, sleeping bag, warm clothing, and toiletries. We hope the School Sleepout initiative will give our students a tangible experience of what it would be like to be homeless, bring awareness about the realities faced by people considered to be homeless, and encourage students to do something about it.
