
Staff Update

Praisefest

Last Friday, 34 students attended the Catholic Youth Broken Bay event, Praisefest at the Entrance on the Central Coast.

After singing most of

the way up on the one-hour bus ride, the students were greeted by the Youth For Christ band (with **Brendan** from Year 10 on drums), Vinnies and Vocation stalls, a BBQ and games. We entered the hall to a praise and worship session led by the Glorious band, with **Hamish** from Year 9 drumming, and **Bryndis** from Year 11 singing the song '*Easy*' solo.





Leo's students assisted playing African drums for 'Sing and Shout'. The theme of the night was 'Mercy', and so Rev Gomez led the 'Rambling with the Rev' panel discussion with guests from Vinnies, CatholicCare and students (including our own new College Captain Tony), discussing how we can put our faith into action through helping those in need. This was followed by a time of prayer in the Church during which the sacrament of Reconciliation was offered, and the night ended with a praise party back in the hall.







World Youth Day Pilgrimage - Italy & Portugal 2023

There has been huge interest shown by Year 9 and 10 students in attending World Youth Day in Portugal from July 21 to August 11 next year!

Many students and parents attended the Information Evening at the Light of Christ Centre on Tuesday, with others watching online. We are now at the stage for students to officially **register their interest** in participating via the **Broken Bay World Youth Day page**.

The cost of the trip will be about \$8,000, but students may apply to the Catholic Schools Office for a subsidy of \$4,000. Once registered, an application form will be sent which needs completed in handwriting by the student. Over 50 St Leo's students have expressed interest at this early stage - this may make the applications for places and subsidies more competitive. As mentioned, World Day is for pilgrims 16 years and over. For students aged 15 years on 21 July, they may make an application to Mr Gleeson who will consult with staff about whether their maturity to attend. (At the last WYD, only two 15-year-olds attended).

Since 1921, it has highlighted figures from all walks of life, from famous faces to local heroes, reflecting back to us the stories of our times. This year saw the highest known number of entries in the Archibald from Aboriginal artists (20).



Our centre was set-up by CatholicCare in Waitara, to assist people who may be noticing changes in their memory, have been diagnosed with Dementia, want to be proactive with their brain health, or just stay connected with others in the community.
