NAPLAN Results

In the past week, families with students in **Years 7 and 9** should have received NAPLAN results. NAPLAN, the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy, is a valuable tool in allowing schools to develop a deeper understanding of the strengths and challenges of their students. It is important to note that NAPLAN results are a snapshot of student achievement at a particular point in time and should be used in conjunction with a range of other learning data to build an understanding of how a student is progressing.

When discussing NAPLAN results with your child, it is important to promote a growth mindset that sees feedback about challenges or areas of difficulty as a way of improving. NAPLAN results are *not* a credential or qualification, they are there to *provide information on areas to focus on for improvement*. At St Leo's we will use NAPLAN data to develop our understanding of where our students are placed in regard to literacy and numeracy, allowing teachers to work on strategies for learning improvement. If you have any concerns, please contact your student's Year Leader.

Vaping - What Parents Should Know!

Vaping is the inhaling of a vapour created by an electronic cigarette (e-cigarette). E-cigarettes (or 'vapes') heat a liquid until it becomes a vapour, which is inhaled. The liquid (called e-liquid or "vape



juice") can contain nicotine or marijuana distillate or oil. E-cigarettes can be refillable or pre-filled with cartridges containing the e-liquid. The pre-filled e-cigarettes (called "Puff Bars") are designed for one-time use. After taking a certain number of "puffs," the user throws the device away.

What are the Health Risks of Vaping?

The health risks of vaping include:

- addiction: E-cigarettes contain nicotine, a drug that's highly addictive. You don't have to vape every day to get addicted.
- anxiety and depression: Nicotine makes anxiety and depression worse. It also affects memory, concentration, self-control, and attention, especially in developing brains.
- becoming a smoker: young people who vape are more likely to start smoking regular (tobacco) cigarettes and may be more likely to develop other addictions in the future.
- sleep problems
- exposure to cancer-causing chemicals
- chronic bronchitis



Precautionary Measures and Consequences for Vape Usage at St Leo's

We are aware of the ongoing issues that vapes are creating in schools. As a result, we wanted to assure you of some of the practices that we have adopted to attempt to manage this growing issue.

- Bathroom sweeps Year Leaders in pairs are regularly doing sweeps of the student bathrooms during class time to reduce the risk to other students in the school.
- Record keeping of bathroom visits during class time staff have been requested to document in Compass, (our student management system), the time the student leaves the room and the time the student returns. This allows us to cross-reference any repeated absences or possible student meetings in the bathrooms during class time.
- Vape detectors the College is currently investigating installation of vape detectors in the bathrooms which alert staff to vape usage. This allows us to be called to the venue to inspect in an efficient manner.
- Video cameras the College has installed cameras outside the toilets (and around the campus) to monitor student access and usage to the toilets. If we detect repeated visits by students, we may ask them to show the contents of their pockets. (Please note that camera usage can only be used to the external part of the buildings.)
- Addressing the health Issue the College regularly addresses the entire student body with regards to the health impacts of vaping and the consequences for vaping on school grounds.
- Requests to empty pockets and bags Year Leaders
 may ask students to display the contents of their bags
 or pockets when concerned that vapes are being
 brought to school, or other students are able to inform
 them that another student is carrying vapes on their
 person. Students may be asked to turn out the contents
 of their pockets or bag to ensure a safe school
 environment.
- Suspension Where we discover students to be vaping on school grounds it is school policy that a suspension be put in place. If students are found to be selling vapes on St Leo's grounds the Hornsby Local Area Police are called to the school to investigate, and the College then completes its own investigation.

Please be assured that we will continue to endeavour to keep our school safe for all students.

PCYC Rise Up Program - Year 10

For the past six months, Year 10 students Lucie, Carmen and Caitlyn have been attending the Rise Up Program provided by Hornsby PCYC. This program is designed to encourage our future leaders to work closely together with peers from different schools promoting inclusivity and unity. The monthly workshops focused on areas such as; Cyber Safety, Personal Development, Diversity and Healthy Relationships. Below is a reflection from one of the students:

'The rise up PCYC program taught us responsible citizenship. On a Monday, once a month for six months, us three girls would head to the Hornsby PCYC police station. This program was brought to our attention through our head of year, and we couldn't be more pleased with everything it taught us.



'We learned things like leadership skills, personal development and even refining how we interact with others in all of our relationships. We learnt how to work on ourselves to become better people, who will eventually graduate and use these skills in the world, whatever it may be that we decide to do.

Compassion, understanding, and trustworthiness are all values that we were able to develop. Most of all, we learned that we are able to make a real difference whether that be to someone else's life or to our own. All you need is to start with an idea to slowly make it happen and we are so grateful for this incredible experience we were able to have.'

Girls Flying High!

To challenge the statistic that only 5% of pilots are

female, the Pathways Team together with Sydney Flight College and The Regional Industry Educational Partnerships (RIEP) co-designed a hands-on pilot immersion day for senior female students from St Leo's and Mercy College students.

Students had the opportunity to fly a Boeing 737 in the flight simulator with an experienced pilot looking on. A key learning was that flying involved the ongoing monitoring of cockpit instrumentation. The girls were tasked with a navigation workshop which contextualised the importance and necessity of working mathematically as well as discovering real world links to the science curriculum through discussion with pilots on wing design and forces.

The girls rated this experience very highly and said it was instrumental in helping them to determine future career pathways.

Robotics & Coding

Our Leo's Robotics & Coding Club is going strong with our members well on the road to learning the Python programming language.

The club is open to all Year Groups and is held each Wednesday after school until 4.40pm in Computer Room BH105.

Apprenticeship and Graduate Careers

Mr Simon Kennedy-Jewell presented to our Year 11 Students on career opportunities within the Energy Sector at **Apprenticeship and Graduate** levels. Simon is head of People and Culture at **Endeavour Energy** and outlined the forecasted growth of jobs within this growing sector.

Sports Career Ideas

We have partnered with two providers so far this Term to engage our Year 9 students studying **Physical Activity and Sports Studies (PASS)** on careers related to sports. We were also lucky to have Lauren Privitera from Royal Life Saving NSW visit the school to speak to Mr Wilson's PASS class. She delivered a highly engaging presentation to those students on pathways into becoming a Pool Lifeguard as well as a typical day in the life of a Pool Lifeguard.

was 'engaging, and highly professional - a natural instructor and educator.'

We are always grateful to our community partners for linking the real world to the teaching and learning that happens in the classroom. This provides relevance and engagement in learning as well as building awareness of the range of careers and career pathways.




