Congratulations to our Year 12 Class of 2022 on their solid HSC results, which were released last week.

College Dux was **Rivan Roy**, with a mark of **96.1** who was awarded Distinguished Achiever for both **Mathematics Ext 1 and 2** subjects. An outstanding effort also by **Ali Bonagdaran** who achieved **2**<sup>nd</sup> in the **State for Information Processes and Technology (IPT)**. This in
