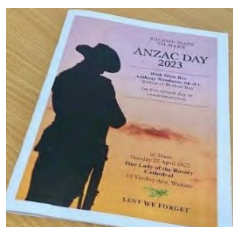
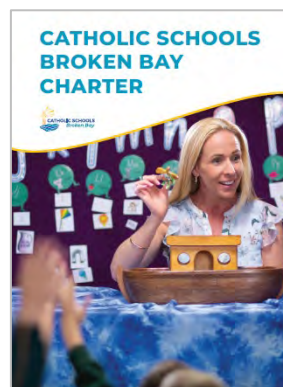
A warm welcome to all our families for our Catholic learning journey for Term Two 2023. It has been a great and busy start to the Term.

### Another Busy Start to the Term

## NCCD for Students with a Disability

The *Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability* (NCCD) takes place every year and is a collection that counts:

- the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'help' due to disability
- the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students.

Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to disability. This 'help' allows them to access education on the same basis as a child without disability. The NCCD uses the definition of disability in the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992*. Schools provide this information to education authorities.

#### About the Immersion:

Students will travel to remote Indigenous homelands in Central Australia. They will have the rare opportunity to make real connections with Indigenous Australians living on their own land who have maintained a deep connection to their culture and history. They will learn from Elders and Traditional Owners, and play with Indigenous children eager for a window to the outside world.

The group will stay in safe areas on privately held Aboriginal land not otherwise accessible. They will learn, make, gather, eat, give, grow and connect with Traditional Owners and Indigenous Australia. Due to the expected high interest, the immersion of open only to students in Year 10 at this stage.

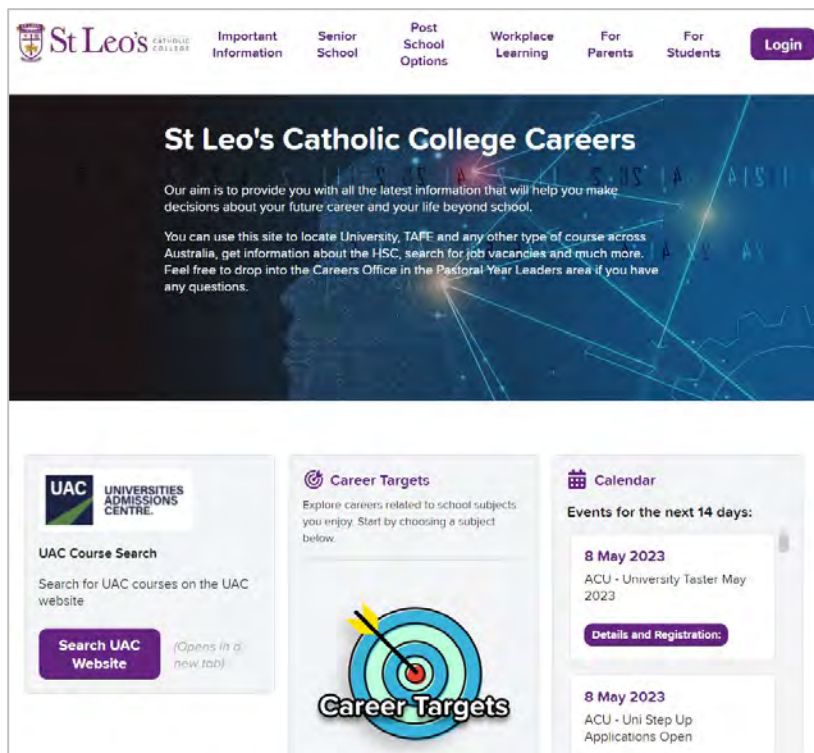

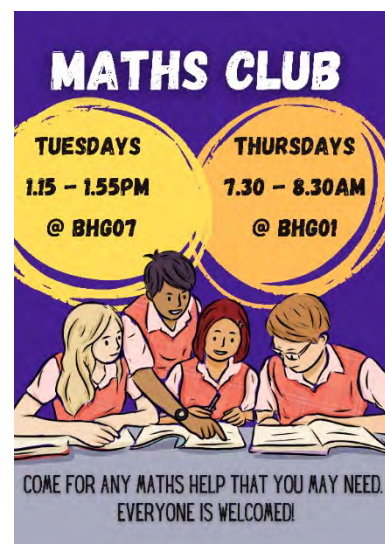
## 'School Sucks' Webinar – School Avoidance and Refusal

## What's Been Happening @ Leo's!

### Year 12 on Retreat

Last week our Year 12 students attended a three-day retreat at the beautiful 'Tops' facility at Stanwell Tops. The retreat's goal was to provide students with an opportunity to disconnect from the pressures of everyday life and connect with their peers and teachers, grow deeper in their faith, reflect on their high school experience and prepare for the transition beyond high school.

The retreat was packed with engaging, reflective and fun sessions that fostered a sense of camaraderie. The first day included ice breaking activities, prayer, self reflection and guest speaker **Mr Sam Clear**, who walked solo around the world in 568 days! Sam travelled 15,600km on foot through South, Central and North America, across Siberia by train, and on foot again from Moscow to the western most point of Spain.

Sam's 'walk for unity', thrust him onto the front page of numerous international news services as he persevered despite exceptional adversity.

Having to find food & water every day was the least of his worries: he was threatened at gun point three times, robbed at knife point, beaten up on the side of the road, came face to face with dangerous animals, was hospitalised many times and endured extreme temperatures.

Sam's faith, perseverance and grit inspired our students.



We finished the evening with a guided meditation and prayer session led by **Mrs Colleen Kofron**.

The second day was dedicated to workshops, a further session by Sam and a vision board activity with our College Counsellor, **Ms Jaya Khan**. The evening involved a number of faith-based activities including candle painting, mandala decorating, Jesus bead making, affirmation and intercession writing, and labyrinth walking. We were lucky to have **Mr Gleeson** visit during this popular session.



A highlight was students receiving a letter written to them by their parents, making for a very emotional evening.

The final day was spent reflecting on their high school journey and celebrating Mass together. This exercise allowed students to think deeply about what they wanted to achieve and how they could grow their relationships with God in keeping with our 2023 theme, 'Do not be afraid to dream of big things'.

Overall, the retreat was a fantastic experience coupled with amazing weather. It provided an opportunity to build stronger bonds among the students, further enhance their faith formation and relationship with Jesus, learn from experts, and reflect on their high school journey.

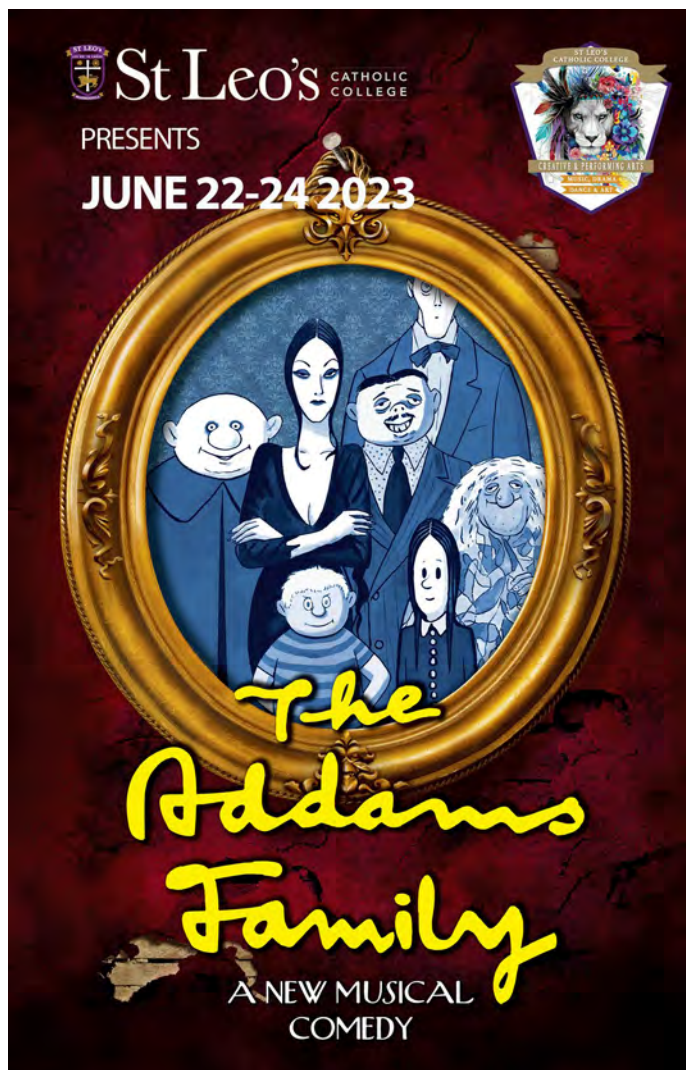

## Parking Rules


Please park safely and legally on the streets around your school. Park legally so you do not incur parking fines and demerit points. Council's Traffic Compliance Officers enforce parking around schools. If you park contrary to the road rules you will be fined!

### You cannot stop or park your vehicle:



Within 10m of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights (20m with traffic lights), unless a sign states you can park there (see image at left).

**PENALTIES FROM: \$352\***  
Demerit Points apply




Within 20m before and 10m after a bus stop (see image)

**PENALTIES FROM: \$275\***  
Demerit Points apply in School Zone


### Parallel parking

This is the usual way to park unless signs tell you otherwise. You must park in the same direction of travel and parallel and as close to the kerb as possible.



You can NOT park across driveways or pedestrian kerb ramps. A vehicle can be parked up to the wings on the driveways or ramp (see image)

**PENALTIES FROM: \$275\***  
Demerit Points apply in School Zone



You should park at least one metre from any other parked vehicle and entirely within any marked parking lines where provided (see image)

**PENALTIES FROM: \$117**

## Parking Rules

### No Parking Zone

- Drivers may stop in this zone to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- The driver **MUST** remain in or within 3 metres of the vehicle at all times.
- The vehicle must not be left unattended.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.
- No Parking zones can also be used to drop off and pick up children.



Penalty: \$117 or  
\$196 in School Zone  
+ 2 Demerit Points

### Bus Zones

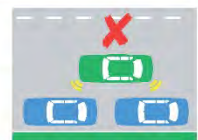
- Drivers are not permitted to stop within a bus zone at any time.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.



Penalty: \$275 or \$352 in School Zone + 2 Demerit Points

### Double Parking

- Drivers are not permitted to stop or park between the centre of the road and another vehicle that is parked at the side of the road.
- Double parking decreases visibility for motorists and pedestrians, and significantly reduces road safety around schools.



Penalty: \$272 or  
\$349 in School Zone + 2  
Demerit Points

### No Stopping Zone

- Stopping is not permitted at any time.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.



Penalty: \$275 or \$352 in School Zone + 2 Demerit Points
