


#### World Youth Day

## **NAPLAN Results**



Individual student results for NAPLAN have been received by the College and are being mailed out to families.

This year saw a change to the way that NAPLAN is being reported. As most of you will have experienced, students in the past were placed into numbered bands. This year NAPLAN results are being reported in 4 proficiency levels,

Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs additional support.

Students will have an opportunity in class to hear about the various subjects and to ask questions of their teachers.

On Wednesday of Week 4, parents and students will be invited to a Zoom session covering a range of important information about Years 9 and 10 and the subject selection process. We encourage all families to attend this online session, however, if you cannot attend the session will be recorded. The meeting link will be emailed to Year 8 parents and carers at the start of Week 4.

#### **HSC Trials Preparation**

HSC subject study guides and NESA workbooks with Band 6 examples have seen a lot of use lately! Students are also able to access Trial and HSC past papers via **Mrs de Kantzow**, including papers not online, such as CSSA Trial papers.



#### **Book Tasting**

#### **Premier's Reading Challenge**

The Premier's Reading Challenge finishes on 18 August. If students need any help finding books to finish the challenge, or logging their reading, they should see **Mrs de Kantzow** in the library.

#### Did you know...?

Did you know that 15 minutes of reading a day is the 'magic number' at which students start to see substantial positive gains in reading achievement? An extract from 'Education Leader's Guide to Reading Growth' (Renaissance Learning 2022) highlights this:

'An analysis comparing the engaged reading time and reading scores of more than 2.2 million students found that ... only students who read 15 minutes or more a day saw

accelerated reading gains - that is, gains higher than the national average and students who read just over a half-hour to an hour per day saw the greatest gains of all.

An analysis of more than 174,000 students' Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) scores revealed [the] connection between reading engagement and reading performance... On average, students who spent more time reading, read more diverse texts, and saw reading as a valuable activity scored higher on the PISA's combined reading literacy scale... a student's level of reading engagement was more highly correlated with their reading achievement than their socioeconomic status, gender, family structure, or time spent on homework.'

## **Mobile Phone Update**



Staff have noticed an increase in student mobile phone usage on campus. Please be aware that Government schools in NSW are banning mobile phones from 2024.

At St Leo's, we wish to give students a greater level of responsibility. With this responsibility however, we do expect that mobile phones are **not accessed during the school day as they are a distraction to student learning**. Please be aware that staff will be taking mobile devices they see being used by students and a consequence put in place.

## Year 10 Vaccinations (and Year 7 & 11 Catch-ups) – Wednesday 2 August

NSW Health will be at St Leo's next Wednesday, 2 August to offer the following vaccinations to students:

- Year 10 Meningococcal ACWY
- Year 11 Meningococcal ACWY (catch-up if not already vaccinated)
- Year 7 HPV (catch-up if not already vaccinated)

In 2023 the following free vaccines will be offered:

- Year 10/11, Meningococcal ACWY vaccine
- Year 7, Human Papillomavirus (HPV), (single dose only) and Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (dTpa).

If your child is in Year 7 or Year 10 this year, you can provide online consent for their routine school vaccinations. Please complete this consent <u>at least 2 days prior</u> to the school clinic. Vaccination will only be provided at school if consent has been received.

#### How to provide consent:

- If you or your child's other parent have already provided consent, please do not submit consent again. (You can check if you gave online consent by <u>logging in again</u>)
- 2. To complete online consent for your child's school vaccinations, visit NSW Health.
- 3. Follow the steps to log in to your existing ServiceNSW account (the same account you may already use to renew your driver's licence). If you don't have an account, refer to ServiceNSW to create one.
- 4. Confirm or update your personal details in ServiceNSW as required.
- 5. Complete the School Vaccination Consent Form for your child/ren. You will need to:
  - a) Enter your child's details including Medicare card number
  - b) Read the linked Parent Information Sheet and Privacy Statement
  - c) Provide consent.

If you or your child do not have a Medicare card, consent can still be provided by requesting a paper-based consent form directly from the College. If you wish to withdraw consent (e.g. vaccine has been given by a GP instead), you can also do this via the above link.

As part of their


