

Year 12 2024 Book Orders



What's been Happening?

Coaches Program – Year 10

On five Thursdays this term, St Leo's, in partnership with Catholic Schools Broken Bay and 'Creating Chances', ran the 'Coaches Program' for 20 students enjoying engagement with physical movement. This course, run for the first time at St Leo's, was aimed at equipping participants with valuable employability and personal skills needed in any future workplace.



Participants identified their strengths and interests through a variety of practical activities with the objective to further develop a clear focus of what values and goals they have going forward into the senior school years. By actively coaching younger students during their sports lessons, they built transferable skills which will assist them to successfully access a variety of senior school and post school options such as university, TAFE or an apprenticeship/traineeship.

During the program it became clear what enormous leadership qualities participants possess, daring to be role models for younger peers by working in a team, communicating effectively and with empathy, giving and receiving feedback - and by taking responsibility for the safety of themselves



and others under the expertise guidance of 'Creating Chances' youth development facilitators.

The participating students can be congratulated on their achievements during this program – they have a bright future ahead as young leaders in their (sports) communities.

Second-hand Uniforms

A reminder that second-hand uniforms can be bought and sold through <u>The Uniform Exchange</u> at Pymble and online via <u>sustainableschoolshop.com.au</u> as on our website:

- The Uniform Exchange has a physical store in Pymble as well as an online store which buys and sells secondhand school
 uniforms. Buyers can search available items online by school. For sellers, there are no listing fees online, or they will sell
 items at their Pymble Exchange.
- 2. St Leo's is registered with sustainableschoolshop.com.au, an online trading platform for parents to buy and sell secondhand uniforms. The site also sells secondhand textbooks, musical instruments, calculators, etc.
 Buyers can search for items for free by school, set up a regular email alert for a 'stocktake report' of St Leo's uniform items currently listed, or place a 'wanted ad' after setting up a free account. Sellers can list items for \$1.50 (single items) up to \$21.95 for unlimited items (12 month subscription). Interested buyers than contact sellers directly (similar to Gumtree or Marketplace).
