Dear valued members of the St Leo's community,



Due to a recent review of Counselling across CSBB schools, we will also be joined by an extra counsellor here at the College who will be working with our present counsellor - **Ms Jaya Kudhail**. **Ms Dale Bowmer** will be joining us eight days per fortnight. I want to assure all parents/carers that all our teachers are qualified and experienced in teaching our young people to be the best that they can be. St Leo's has not been in this position and proudly continues to provide a professional delivery of the NESA curriculum, in light of the <a href="College's Strategic Plan">College's Strategic Plan</a>.

#### Year 7 2024 - First Steps towards High School





Last Wednesday evening we held the Year 7 2024 Information Evening for parents/carers and students. Over 300 people attended with the usual blend of nervousness and excitement to be expected.

We were joined by **Fr Brendan Lee** (Moderator of Hornsby Cathedral Parish) and **Deacon Rosen Mathews**. Presentations were given by our two Assistant Principals, **Ms Murdoch** and **Mr Brennan**, Director of Wellbeing for Learning, **Ms Tynan**, our Leader of Learner Diversity, **Ms Bowman** our Parent Education Coordinator, **Ms Saj Senn** and our





Leader of our unique and very successful Community Tutoring Program, Mrs Sarah Szacsvay. Also Ms Jo Gower and Ms Fiona Morsink-Ryan who not only supported, but are major players in the enrolment process. Ms Fiona Milkins and Mr Daniel Lane, two other members of the College Leadership team, were also present. I made the point at the evening that it takes a village to raise our young people. Having a wide variety of our team there that evening lent credibility to that statement. We also heard from two present Year 7 students - James and Lola, reflecting upon their own first few days of St Leo's almost a whole year ago!

#### **Ignite Catholic Conference**



#### **REMINDERS:**

### School Vaccination Program - Monday, 6 November 2023

NSW Health will offer the following vaccinations at our school clinic:

 Year 7 – dTpa (Diphtheria-tetanuspertussis) & HPV (Human Papillomavirus) if not already given in Term 1 or 2



- Year 8 dTpa (Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis) & HPV (Human Papillomavirus) catch up
- Also, Year 10 & Year 11 Meningococcal ACWY (catch up)

Students can only get vaccination at school if consent has been received.

If you or your child's other parent provided consent earlier this year, please <u>do not submit consent again</u>. Most Year 7 parents consented for both HPV and dTPa before the Term 1 HPV vaccine clinic. (You can check if you gave online consent by logging in again; <a href="https://nswhealth.service-now.com/school">https://nswhealth.service-now.com/school</a>)

This is the last vaccination clinic at your school this year. If your child is absent they can be vaccinated at school in 2024, or at your GP. The vaccine is supplied without cost to you but GPs may charge a consultation fee.




#### **Private Music Tuition: Studio Concerts**
