

#### White Card Qualification Course

Last week, a number of Year 9 and 10 students undertook *White Card Training* - a safety induction course for people who are working or planning to work on a construction site.

Those who need White Cards include:

- site managers, supervisors, surveyors, labourers and tradespeople
- people who access operational construction zones (unaccompanied or not directly supervised by an inducted person)
- workers whose employment causes them to routinely enter operational construction zones.





The students were motivated and involved themselves fully in the safety scenarios given to identify hazards and learn how to safeguard themselves and others in a construction zone.

#### Year 12 2024 Retreat

During Week 3, our Year 12 2024 students attended a three-day retreat at the historic Winbourne Retreat Centre at Mulgoa. The retreat's aims were to provide students with an opportunity to disconnect from the pressures of everyday life, connect with their peers and teachers, grow deeper in their faith, and reflect on their high school experience as they transition into their HSC year of study.

The retreat was packed with engaging, reflective and fun sessions that fostered a sense of camaraderie among the students as well as giving them an opportunity for prayer and reflection, culminating in the celebration of Mass on the final morning.

Following a captivating presentation by guest speaker **Tony Huang**, the second evening saw students engage in a number of activities including, mandala decorating, Jesus-bead making, affirmations, journal writing, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, music by PJ and labyrinth walking. popular session.







The final day of the retreat was spent reflecting on their commencement of their final year at St Leo's and celebrating Mass together. # Year 7 Taronga Zoo Excursion

After a number of Covid years where students didn't attend many excursions, our Year 7 students were able to experience the wonder and awe of the Taronga Park Zoo recently.

















The visit linked closely with the Stage 4 Science Syllabus. Students explored animals through a scientific process, and learnt about the behaviours and characteristics that help them survive in the wild. Students attended a workshop on classification and adaptations and had a guided tour through large parts of the zoo.

**Jiya D** wrote the following reflection on her experience:

'On Friday the 20th of October Year 7 went to Taronga Zoo. Firstly, we got to school and lined up in our Science class groups to get ready and board the bus. Once we were all on, we left for Taronga Zoo.

We arrived at the zoo and the first thing we saw were the elephants. While we were watching the elephants we were given a worksheet to complete over the course of the day. We had to pick out three animals and classify whether it was a mammal, bird, reptile, fish or amphibian. Then we had to name three types of adaptations for each animal, a physiological, behavioural, and structural adaptation. Then we visited the camels which had a massive bump on their back. As we were on our way to see the gorillas we saw a peacock and it even opened



its feathers for us to show how beautiful they were. Then we eventually got to the gorillas and we watched them being fed. The capybaras were next on our journey, who were so lazy and sleepy.

After all of that walking everyone was starting to feel like the capybaras so we took a break and had a snack. Once we were finally energised we went underground to see the adorable little penguins and large sea lions. Finally, we visited the science interactive nature classroom to learn about the different classification of animals and we were able to interact with some of the animals. We got to either touch or look at a blue tongue lizard, green tree frog, yellow bellied glider, ring tailed possum, colourful parrots, and lastly a python. Next, we walked outside and we saw some chimpanzees. Then again we started to get hungry so we

sat down in a grassed area with another class, 7SCID, and ate some lunch.

After least we would

After lunch we went into the reptile exhibit and we saw some amazing reptiles. The ones that were memorable for me were the shingle back lizard, star tortoise, green python, and rhinoceros iguana. Finally, we saw an alligator and then sadly we had to leave and get on our bus. Overall, it was a wonderful experience and I hope to do something like it again.'



The Taronga Zoo excursion is just one of the Science excursions the students will participate in while at St Leo's. We strongly believe that hands on experiences of excursions are an important teaching technique in the repertoire of learning methods offered at St Leos. The visit to the Zoo is also an important reminder of the beauty of God's creation and how we must care for the environment and all who are part of this closely interconnected world.

# **Japanese Student Visitors**

This past fortnight, St Leo's received a visit from 36 students who usually attend Hyogo Kokusai High School, which is located near Kobe on the Japanese main island of Honshu.

St Leo's students from across Years 8 to 10 guided our guests through a typical day here at the College and also experienced Japanese cultural activities that will be remembered for a long time to come.

These activities included a formal Japanese-style gift-giving ceremony, yukata demonstration, dance performance and onawatobi (group jump rope game). All students (and teachers!) had a wonderful time learning about each other and we look forward to building upon these experiences in the future.

# A Message from CSBB re. School Fee Accounts

As advised via email this week, the transition to our new student billing and finance systems is currently in progress, and your school fee balance will now be available on your Compass app.

#### **School Fee Balances**

Your school fee balance showing on Compass is a <u>combined balance for all students in your family that attend a Catholic Schools Broken Bay (CSBB) Diocese school, for which you are the nominated fee payer. For a list of schools within CSBB please refer to the CSBB website.</u>

Compass <u>does not show your instalment schedule</u>, which can be viewed on your September statement. Any alert you see on your Compass app relating to fees will be regarding the total balance, not the next instalment due.

#### **School Fee Payments**

*BPay* remains our preferred payment method. You should continue to use your existing BPay reference details for all school fee payments. Fees paid by BPay will take approx. 5 days to be reflected on your Compass app.

#### **Statements**

October statements will be issued shortly. In the interim, please refer to your September statement for your instalment due in October. You can continue to use your existing BPay reference for any payments.

#### **Assistance**





# Year 7 Vaccinations - Monday, 6 November

NSW Health will offer the following vaccinations at our school clinic;

- Year 7 dTpa (Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis) & HPV (Human Papillomavirus) if not already given in Term 1-2
- Year 8 dTpa (Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis) & HPV (Human Papillomavirus) catch up
- Also, Year 10 & Year 11 Meningococcal ACWY (catch up)





This is the last vaccination clinic at St Leo's this year. If your child is absent, they can be vaccinated at school in 2024 or at your GP. The vaccine is supplied without cost to you but GPs may charge a consultation fee.




