I wish you all a safe, happy and holy Christmas. Stay safe and see you back in 2024.



# **Reminders: Student Requirements for 2024**

# **Textbooks and Stationery**

Booklists/online text lists for Year 11 and 12 students have been made available to parents through Box of Books.

For Years 7-10 students, the majority of learning resources are made available online as needed, so generally no textbooks are required. Families will be advised throughout the year as additional learning



Regarding stationery, we suggest you simply top up stationery supplies for each subject as required. Students in Years 7-10 will receive a College Personal Planner (diary), while they will be optional for Years 11-12.

Please ensure all stationery, uniform and other items are labelled.

# **IT Requirement Changes from 2024**

As outlined in last term in The Lion Roars, from the start of 2024, Year 7 students and anyone upgrading their devices will <u>have the option of using either a PC/Windows-based or Apple OS device</u> for all classes.

This is a change from previous years where Apple devices were required, and has been implemented to allow students and parents/carers to choose the device they feel best suits their individual situation.



The College, through CSBB's Digital Enablement team, will <u>support all student devices</u> and have developed the following specifications and recommendations for purchasing your device to ensure it can be used for three years of class work, as per industry standards:

Note also that all required software will also be made available by the College at the start of the year.

There is **no expectation for parents of Year 7-9 students to buy new devices** at this point. This is to let you know the direction we are heading in, so, that **if you have a need to replace a student device**, you are aware of the additional devices now available for families to choose from.

For students in **Years 10-11**, we do suggest moving from an iPad **to laptop for senior studies as in previous years**, so this decision now gives you more options.

# **New Uniform Items for 2024**

Our new summer uniform option of shorts for girls is now available from our uniform suppliers, Cowan and Lewis.

Following student and parent requests, our summer uniform now includes girls' shorts which can be worn with the current senior girls' blouse or a new short-sleeved blouse option for junior girls.

We hope many of our girls take advantage of this smart and versatile new option.

From next year, you will also see our new House Ambassadors and Year 7s modelling our new coloured House polos on selected sports days.

Students in other Year Groups who wish to purchase House polos for designated sports days are also welcome to do so.

A reminder that a College bucket hat is also available as an alternative to the College cap.

amounts of litter present - mostly soft plastics and polystyrene pieces. The mangroves on the Eastern side of Bar Point have a derelict 16 foot fibreglass vessel, first sited close to Kangaroo Point, now abandoned at Bar Point."

"These mangroves also had four full bags of glass, polystyrene and plastics removed. A large piece of artificial grass was cut from the muddy mangroves and loaded on board by the students."

# **Year 10 Car Maintenance Course**

Last week, Year 10 students undertook a car maintenance course as part of our Stage 6 transition program. They were taught how to change a tyre, the most efficient way to check tyre pressure, how to best monitor oil and coolant levels and what to do in the event of a car accident.

The initiative stems from research indicating that young people are over-represented in motor vehicle accidents in Australia. The Galmatic car maintenance course complements road safety content in the PDHPE Syllabus as well as other initiatives in our Wellbeing Framework such as the RYDA excursion.

Students were split into small groups for the incursion to ensure small group sizes and maximum hands-on experience. The feedback from the students and presenter was positive and we are already looking forward to running the incursion again in 2024.
