## **DAY-TO-DAY EXPECTATIONS**

#### **Expectations - Rewards and Restorative Practices**

- St Leo's expects students to treat all members of our community and the public with respect and kindness. Students are expected to follow the directions of staff to ensure their own safety, wellbeing and learning as well as the safety, wellbeing and learning of others.
- When students meet College expectations, they are making a positive contribution to the St Leo's community and therefore contributing to their own wellbeing, investing in their own learning and enabling the learning of others. When students consistently meet high expectations, this will be recognised and rewarded through the College Merit system.
- When students fail to meet College expectations, this has a negative impact upon the St Leo's community. To support students with making good choices and positive contributions, a range of strategies are in place including restorative conversations, demerits, parent contact and community service. These consequences are applied to support students with meeting expectations and allowing them to improve their own wellbeing so that they can learn and grow.

### General Expectations - College Identity & Media

 You should not use the College name, crest, logo, images or other branding (including uniform) in any social media, publications or communications without express permission from the Principal or Marketing Officer. You should also not take or use images of others without their permission.

#### Expectations in Mentor Class

'A Mentor is an important and significant teacher for students in their Mentor Class. Students see their Mentor on a daily basis, which allows a positive and nurturing relationship to be developed. This provides crucial support for students as it assists in their growth and development into confident, competent Catholic-valued young women and men of conscience'.

- You should bring your College Planner with you every day and treat it with respect. It is a vital tool for developing organisational skills.
- You should engage in Mentor Class activities including prayer and reflection, as directed by your teacher.
- Your must wear your College uniform in accordance with the rules outlined in this Planner and on the College website (including hair and personal grooming requirements).
   If you have an appropriate reason for not being in correct uniform, you must obtain a Uniform Pass from your Year Leader.
- Your mobile phone must be turned off and out of sight during regular College hours (8.30am to 3pm), including during Mentor Class and assemblies.
   You are not permitted to access social media platforms at any time whilst on the College premises or at a school event.
   Video and/or audio recording capabilities of mobile phones and/or devices are not permitted to be used at school or at a school event without the permission of a teacher.
- Your College backpack should be left in your locker during the day. You may access your locker at
  recess/lunch and choose to carry your books/learning device/pens etc. in the College satchel or
  carry bag between classes.

# **DAY-TO-DAY EXPECTATIONS**

#### **Expectations in the Playground**

'Playground activities are an opportunity for students to develop their social skills and establish friendships and connections with peers of all ages.'

- You should model respectful, responsible and safe behaviour and observe the College 'hands off' policy at all times.
- You should care for our environment, look after College amenities and equipment, and place rubbish in the bins provided.
- Your College uniform should be worn appropriately at all times, including during recess and lunch.
- Ball games are not to be played on Loyola Green or around the Chapel. Major ball games (soccer/ football) are to be played on the oval. Handball is allowed on Muru Mittigar and Chanel Way.
- You are not allowed in areas deemed 'out-of-bounds' at any time. These include, but are not limited to: classrooms outside of class time, balconies, gardens or construction areas.
- Your mobile phone and learning device must be turned off and out of sight during recess and lunch.

#### **Expectations in Class**

'A Classroom Teacher is primarily there to educate and assist in the overall wellbeing and development of students. Classrooms are learning environments that should be respected at all times so that all students can learn to the best of their ability.'

- You should act in a respectful, responsible and safe way at all times and follow teacher directions.
- You are expected to be self-disciplined, take a positive approach to your learning and participate actively in all learning experiences. It is a requirement that you come fully prepared for class with the right equipment and right attitude.
- You should arrive to each period in a timely manner.
- You should not take food or drink other than bottled water into the classroom.
- Your mobile phone must be turned off and out of sight during regular College hours (8.30am to 3pm), including during classes or in the library. Mobile phones or devices may only be used in the classroom for learning purposes at the discretion of the teacher.
- Your must wear your College uniform in accordance with the rules outlined in this Planner and on the College website (this includes hair and personal grooming requirements). If you have an appropriate reason for not being in correct uniform, you must obtain a Uniform Pass from your Year Leader.
- Your College backpack should be left in your locker during the day. You may access your locker at recess/lunch and choose to carry your books/learning device/pens etc. in the College satchel or carry bag between classes.
- You must not deface or damage College property or resources or the property of others at any time.
