I will be on campus Mondays (8am-4pm), and at various school events, so do say hello!



## System-wide Staff Development Day – HSC Marking

Next Monday, 19 August, every secondary teacher across the seven high schools in our CSBB diocese will be meeting at St Peter's at Tuggerah for a Trial HSC Marking Day. This day is for all teachers from each subject to come together to mark a section of the Trial Paper.

This is an amazing opportunity for all our staff to experience a marking centre and to be led by experienced HSC Markers to engage in rigorous professional development and to ensure consistency across the diocese. We





are so fortunate at St Leo's that several of the facilitators for the marking centre, are teachers from St Leo's. We are blessed to have many staff who have HSC Marking experience. This is the first time our diocese has held a day such as this and it is set to be excellent professional development for all our teachers.

NOTE: As well as a Student Free Day on Monday 19 August, the <u>College Office will be closed</u> as our administration staff will also be attending training offsite.

## **Uniform and Grooming**

A reminder to parents and students that as a College, we want to ensure that the high standards in our uniform and appearance is maintained so we are focussed on correcting:

- Incorrect jumpers If students are unable to find their sports jacket or pants, then they are expected to wear their full school uniform and change for sport.
- Inappropriate haircuts Students are fully aware that mullet haircuts are not part of our grooming expectations at the College. If they arrive at school, they may be asked to be collected and have the haircut rectified prior to returning to the College.



- Facial Hair It is an expectation that students are clean shaven. Students will be given the opportunity to shave at school or may be asked to be collected and the facial hair removed prior to returning to the College.
- Nose Piercings These are not permitted at the College. Students will be asked to remove them. Please discourage your young person from getting a nose piercing as they are not part of the uniform.

For most of the students who take pride and care in their appearance, (and parents who ensure they do) it does not go unnoticed and the College says **thank you**!

## Year 12 Society and Culture



A big congratulations to the **Year 12 2024 Society and Culture** cohort who have just submitted their HSC Major Works - their *Personal Interest Projects* or 'PIPs'.

These PIPs take an enormous amount of academic dedication and diligence to complete. As part of the HSC course and 40% of their NESA grade, students are required to complete a research task on a social or cultural issue of their choice, plan and conduct primary research of their own and conduct an investigation that presents 5,000 words on their findings in the style of an academic journal.

These students completed research on a multitude of issues from the sociology of crime to the experience of Muslim women in the West and many more topics in between.

Notably this year, students were fortunate to have the opportunity to interview experts in their fields from the University of Sydney, and even the opportunity to interview a NSW Senior Chief Magistrate. The students and I were incredibly grateful for these professionals who donated their valuable time to assist our students with their thorough research.

We would also like to thank Leo's own **Mrs Asher Doyle**, an experienced HSC Society and Culture marker, who dedicated her time to providing feedback to students, further guiding them on the path to success.


