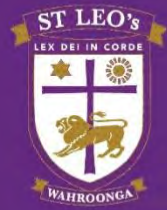

Dancing Success - CALLBACK Nominations!

Last week we received notification from NESA (NSW Education Standards Authority) that the College has achieved four nominations for CALLBACK, the NESA showcase for exemplary performances in HSC Dance.

Congratulations to **Romina Z** (Year 11 accelerated) nominated for her Core Performance, Core Composition and her Major Study and to **Emily R** (Year 12) nominated for her Core Composition. Well done also to their Dance teacher, **Mrs Ellie Field** who has taught these students over the past two years. The quality and frequency of Ellie's feedback to her students is one of the key factors for this success.

This is the first time since Dance was introduced at St Leo's in 2020 that we have received four CALLBACK nominations. The showcase itself will be held at the Seymour Centre next February.

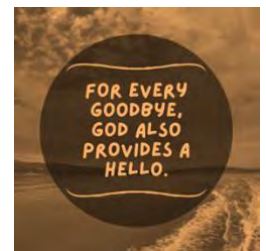
wide range of people viewing/listening to their works gives a greater range of feedback to our students.

Farewell (Year 12) and Welcome (Year 7 2025)!

Next week we will formally say farewell to our Year 12 students. On Wednesday, the whole College will pray for them (and their families) at the Graduation Mass from 11.30am. Following a lunch break, students and their families will then celebrate the Graduation Ceremony and prize-giving later that afternoon. Many family and friends will be in attendance to mark this important and significant occasion signifying the end of not only their secondary education, but 13 years of formal schooling.



While Year 12 are preparing to leave the St Leo's 'prielands', our next cohort of Year 7s for 2025 and their families are preparing to join us. Last Tuesday the graduating Class of 2030 were welcomed to an Information Session at the College, giving them an overview of St Leo's and what to expect starting high school. They rejoin us for a full Orientation Day on 15 November before officially starting Year 7 on 3 February 2025.

At this session, we had the pleasure of hearing from six enthusiastic students from our current Year 7 group – **Keiran, Annaliese, Katya, William, Abigail** and **Napier** – who spoke confidently and eloquently in front of the 500-strong crowd about their experiences of starting high school. Well done to each of you!

College Musical for 2025

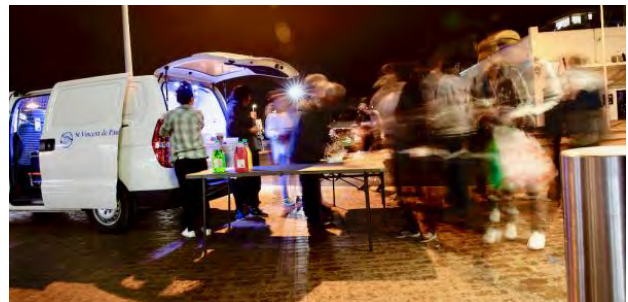

Last Friday the CSBB System Leadership team met at our Pennant Hills head office. The morning session was led by two presenters from Broken Bay Catholic Care who guided us in discussions about domestic and family violence, particularly in context with our schools.

Plenty of New Titles



This month has seen an influx of new titles in the library. In the Fiction section, our new books encompass genres such of Fantasy Fiction, Adventure, Mystery and Suspense and of course our largest collection, Realistic Fiction.

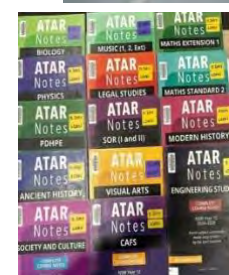
Libraries often use genre names that are not consistent, and in the case of our realistic fiction, the PRC refer to this genre as Family/Relationships. If students are looking for a particular genre or are unsure what they may like, I encourage them to ask for assistance. It is about finding something they enjoy.

Interestingly, our cache of titles this month could be seen as genre bending - potentially able to be placed under a couple of genres. I am delighted that we also have six new Graphic Novels.



In the non-fiction section, for Year 12 we have added to the plethora of resources already available by purchasing ATAR Notes for all the subjects they are written for. They are an invaluable resource for our seniors and may be borrowed on short term loan (3 days).

Year 11 are not left out, we have an excellent selection of Preliminary course notes including past papers, Dot Point Workbooks, Excel notes and Macquarie revision notes. These may be found in the resource shelves near the library desk and are also available on 3-day loans. Again, if unable to locate the resource you are seeking, please see the Librarian.



It is a great time to consider your holiday reading material, but the flexibility of the ePlatform allows you to select your reading material at any time. As the name suggests these titles are available in audio book and eBook formats. It is a personal choice and I know it has taken me some time to move away from a hard copy book. Now I love it, if you have not tried one or more of these formats, consider challenging yourself these holidays.

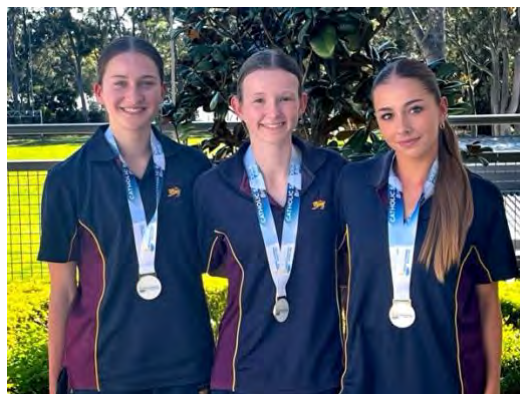

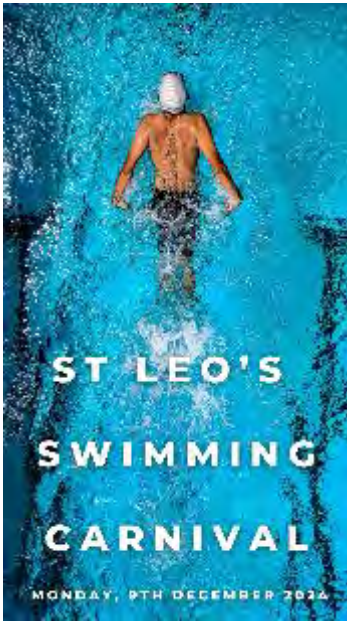
