Each Wednesday of Week A within the fortnightly cycle, all students are permitted to arrive at 9:30am. This is due to teaching staff holding Professional Development from 8.30 - 9.30am. Supervision is provided for any students who arrive on campus between 8.30 - 9.30am.

## Important Reminders

### Textbooks and Stationery

A reminder that online textbooks are provided to students in Years 7-10. They will be advised of any English texts they need to purchase during class as needed. Booklists/online text lists for Year 11 and 12 students have been made available for parents/carers.

Regarding stationery, Year 7 students will be provided with starter packs, which will be distributed on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> February. Note these packs are quite heavy, so Year 7 parents may wish to pick students up on their first day if possible.

Other Year Groups simply need to top up stationery supplies for each subject as necessary. Students in all year groups will receive a College Personal Planner (diary) to assist with their planning and organisation.

### Lost Property

**Please ensure every student item is clearly labelled!** We endeavour to contact students whenever lost items are handed in but are unable to do so if they are unlabelled. All unlabelled items will be placed in the lost property box in Theresa House

### Grooming and Appearance - *This will be a major focus area in 2025*

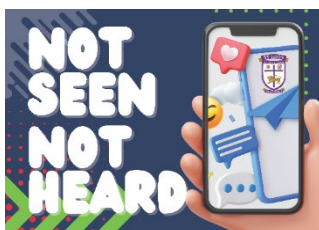
Attending St Leo's, students should be aware they are ambassadors for the College. The College uniform enhances a sense of belonging to the College community. It also means they are switched on and ready for your day. Wearing the uniform correctly shows pride in your appearance and enhances the reputation of the College in the wider community.

Please ensure your child has the appropriate haircut and facial hair has been removed prior to returning to the College on the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> of February.

A reminder that the College backpack is compulsory for all students 7-12. This is the only permissible bag for all year groups, including Year 12.

If students are not in correct uniform, they must report to the Student Administration Officer before 8.30am with a parent/carer note, to be issued with a **Uniform Pass**. This will be in the form of a visible wrist band which indicates that a uniform pass has been issued. Ongoing cases of incorrect uniform will see the student referred to their Year Leader.

### Mobile Phone and Personal Device Policy



The College will continue to adopt the following guidelines in relation to mobile phones and devices as well headphones this year:

**Students' mobile phones must be turned off and out of sight during regular College hours (8.30am to 3pm), including recess and lunch**

Towards the end of last year, many students were taking liberties with carrying their mobile phones in their hand. This year phones are not to be seen or heard. If



they are seen, students will be asked to give their phone to the teacher where it will be stored in the front office until the end of the day.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to use the normal channel of communicating with their son/daughter by phoning the College if they need to contact their young person during College hours.

**Students are not permitted to access social media platforms from a mobile phone and/or device at any time whilst on the College premises or at a school event.**

**The camera, video and/or audio recording capabilities of a mobile phone and/or device are not permitted to be used at school or at a school event without the permission of a teacher.**

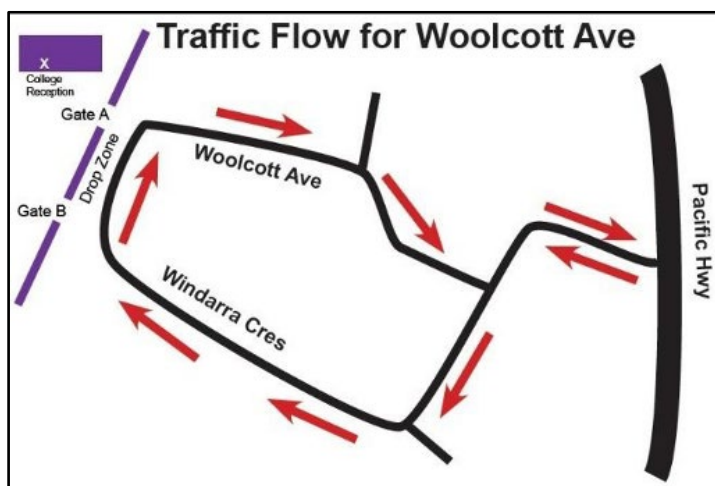

### College Access and Parking

#### Woolcott Avenue Drop Off/Pick Up

During morning and afternoon school zone times, to help ease congestion around local streets, the following **one way traffic flow** has been agreed upon by the College and our neighbours.

If you intend picking up or dropping off your son/daughter at the main **College Gates A/B** (Woolcott Avenue/Windarra Crescent), we ask that you please be patient and assist with traffic flow by adhering to a **one-way direction**. Once you have turned off the Pacific Highway along Windarra Crescent to the College gates/drop off zone, and then back along Woolcott Avenue between 8- 8.45am and 2.45-3.30pm (see diagram).



#### Visiting Outside of Regular Start and Finish Times

If arriving to visit the College or to collect your young person due to illness or an appointment (see *process on next page*), please come to College Gate A (Woolcott Avenue) move to Reception where staff will be happy to assist you. Note that all campus visitors must sign in and out at Reception during school hours.

#### Parking at the College

As you would be aware, there is limited parking around the College. When parking in surrounding streets for College events, please ensure you are considerate of our neighbours and leave plenty of room for residents to enter and exit their driveways. A reminder that it is illegal to double park.

We will advise of onsite parking arrangements for individual College events depending upon availability.



## College Communication

At St Leo's, we believe good communication is key to an effective ongoing partnership between the College and home in order to create the best possible learning environment for our students. Note that it is an expectation of the College that families do their best to stay up to date with relevant events and activities by reading College notifications and newsletters.

We have a range of tools in place to communicate important information between the College, students and families, including:

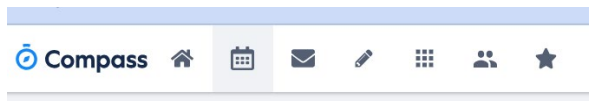
### 1. Compass Portal

The College Student Management Portal, *Compass* is designed to provide active links so you can easily access important information relating to your son/daughter's wellbeing and progress at any time including attendance and academic results. Parents should **advise the College of absences, view student timetables and progress** through the portal.

Reminders and messages from various staff are also distributed through Compass and will arrive to parents as an email or SMS depending on your setup preferences.

### 2. College Calendar

A reminder that the College Calendar is available to parents and students via Compass. To access the calendar, simply click on the Calendar icon in Compass in the toolbar at the top of the screen (next to the House icon) and view activities by day, week or month.



### 3. The Lion Roars Bulletin

*The Lion Roars* is our fortnightly news publication emailed to all parents/carers. It contains important reminders and updates on the learning journey of our students and upcoming events. *It is an expectation by the College that parents/carers stay up to date by checking this publication regularly.* Bulletins are also catalogued on the Newsletter page of the College Website.

### 4. Student Planners

All Year 7-12 students will be given a 2025 Student Planner (diary) at the start of the year for their use. The Planner is a valuable source for information on College policies and procedures and is also an important organisation and communication tool for students. As such, the College expects them to be kept in a neat and tidy condition. Your support of the planner system is essential for sound communication and monitoring of your child's progress.

### 5. Social Media Channels & Groups

Follow us on **Facebook** for regular updates on day-to-day activities at the College. Parent Facebook Groups have been set up for interested parents of each year group to share information (please email the College with your *Facebook name and email*, and student details to be invited to join relevant year parent group).



### Key Policies, Procedures and Guidelines

The following areas should be of particular note. They are specifically outlined in the College Planner and on the [website](#) for your reference:

#### Attendance (Early Leave, Late Arrival and Leave)

Please use the Compass Portal

If a student is late to the College for whatever reason, they should go directly to **Student Services** (near Reception) as soon as they arrive to have their attendance recorded. Parents should **enter a note into the Compass Portal** or write a signed explanation note in the student's College Planner (diary) beforehand.

#### Student Illness/Injury

If a student needs to go home while at the College due to illness or injury, **the College will contact parents/carers** to notify them of the situation and make arrangements as required and agreed. **Students must NOT contact their parents directly to arrange pickup.** If a student is unwell during the day, they should first speak to their classroom teacher or Year Leader, who will direct them to Student Services and/or the Sick Bay, and the College will contact parents once we have assessed the situation.

#### Student Appointments

Wherever possible, medical and other appointments should be made outside of school time.

Where this is not possible, parents should **enter a note in our Compass Portal**, or write a signed note in the student's College Planner (diary) beforehand - or ideally both.
