Acknowledgement of Country


We walk together in footsteps millennia old.

BYOD device

- Option of either PC/Windows-based or Apple OS device
- See Handbook for full specifications

Stationery

- the College will provide a stationery pack to each student on Day 1
- We suggest picking up students on Day 1 if possible as they are heavy
- **Textbooks** made available online, so not needed initially. Additional resources will be advised throughout the year as required e.g. novels
- Padlocks students require a padlock for their lockers. This will be included in the stationery pack provided.



Student Requirements for start of Term 1:

 by 15 December for guaranteed delivery by start of school year.
- 2 sport polos required 1 x House + 1 x general sport. When ordering,
 Houses will not yet be allocated. We will send list to supplier to allocate.
- Please ensure <u>every item is labelled!</u>



What is the CAPA Cubs Program?

This is a **specially designed program for Year 7** focused around participation in the Creative and Performing Arts ensembles and programs at St Leo's which are **accessible** for all St Leo's students.

The *CAPA Cubs* program accommodates all skill levels and will be the first step for Year 7 as they progress further into our *Lions* and *Pride* CAPA programs here at the College.

Private Music Tuition is also offered on site during school hours.

The Cubs Concert Band

An introductory band open to all students which consists of beginner to intermediate repertoire.

The Cubs Singers

An introductory vocal group exclusively open to Year 7 students.

The Cubs Dancers

An exclusive Year 7 ensemble for all ability dancers, beginners to advanced.

The Cubs Drama

An introductory group to Drama through high energy, group interaction and production for Year 7. The Cubs Art Club

A Visual Arts Club that inspires students from Year 7 to further their artistic talents in Drawing.

Representative Sporting Program


- St Leo's is part of the Catholic Schools Broken Bay (CSBB) Sport

College Swimming Carnival


- College carnival is held in Term 4 –

pickup and drop off times.




Parking -
